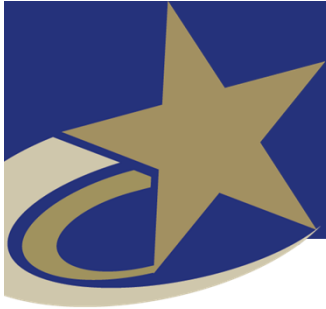

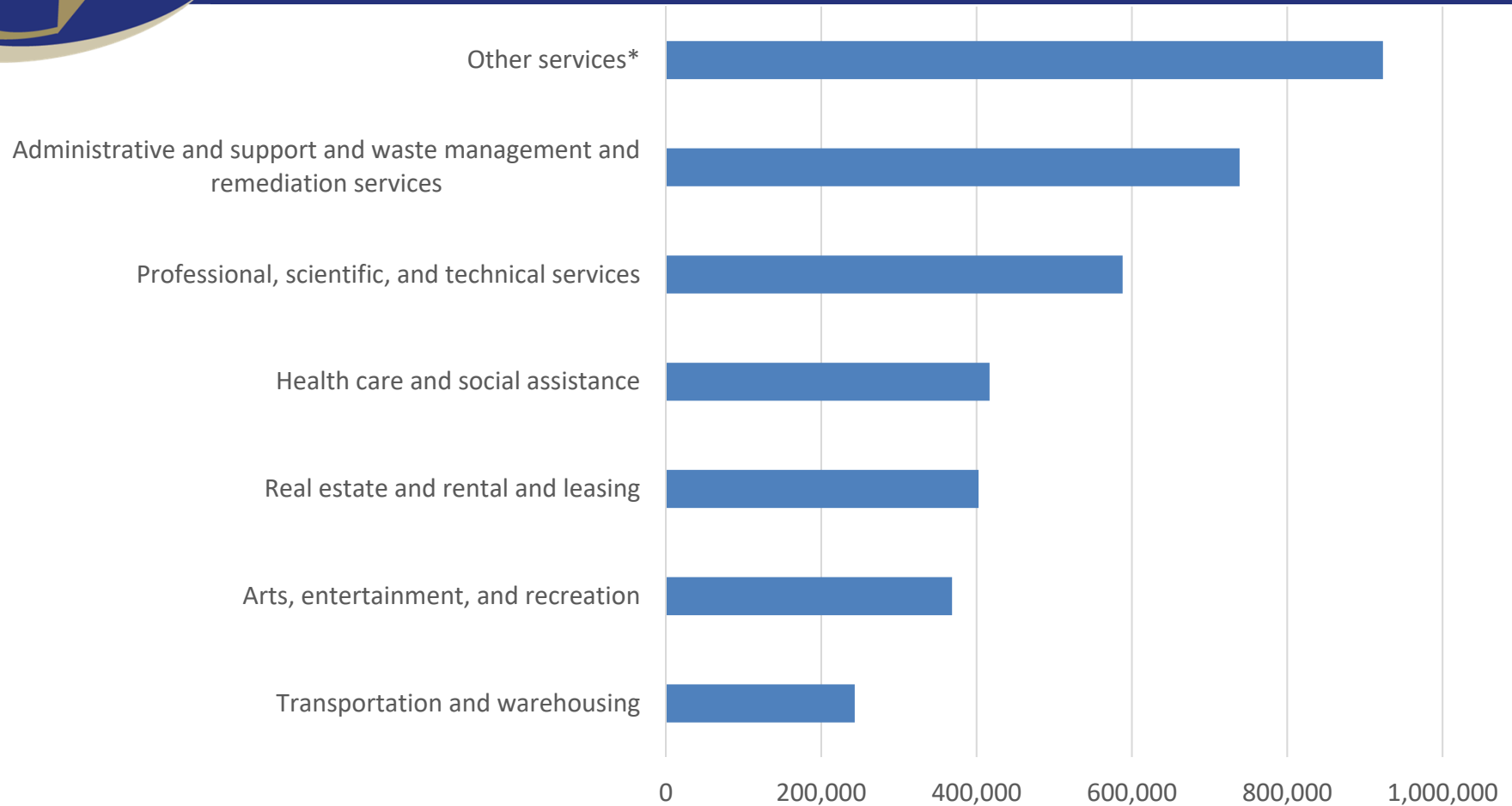

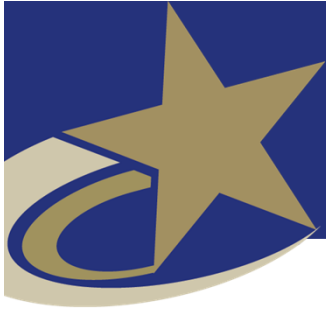
# Numeric change in nonemployers, U.S. 2003–13



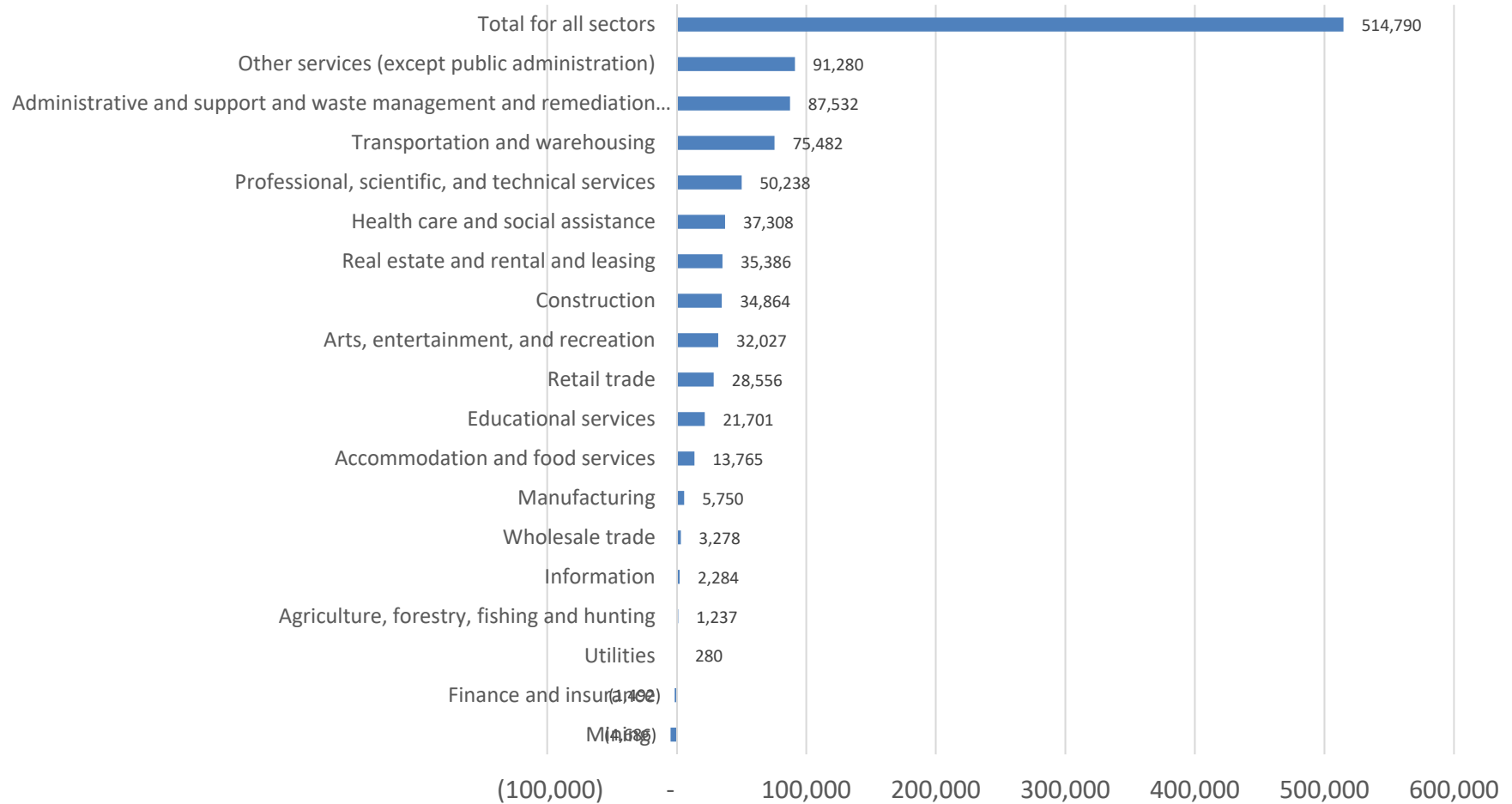
\* This industry sector includes repair and maintenance; personal and laundry services; and religious, grantmaking, civic, professional, and similar organizations.

Note: Most nonemployers are self-employed individuals operating unincorporated businesses (known as sole proprietorships), which may or may not be the owner's principal source of income. Data for 2003 use the 2002 [North American Industry Classification System \(NAICS\)](https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/naics), and data for 2013 use the 2012 NAICS; data are not strictly compatible but are comparable for purposes of showing general change. 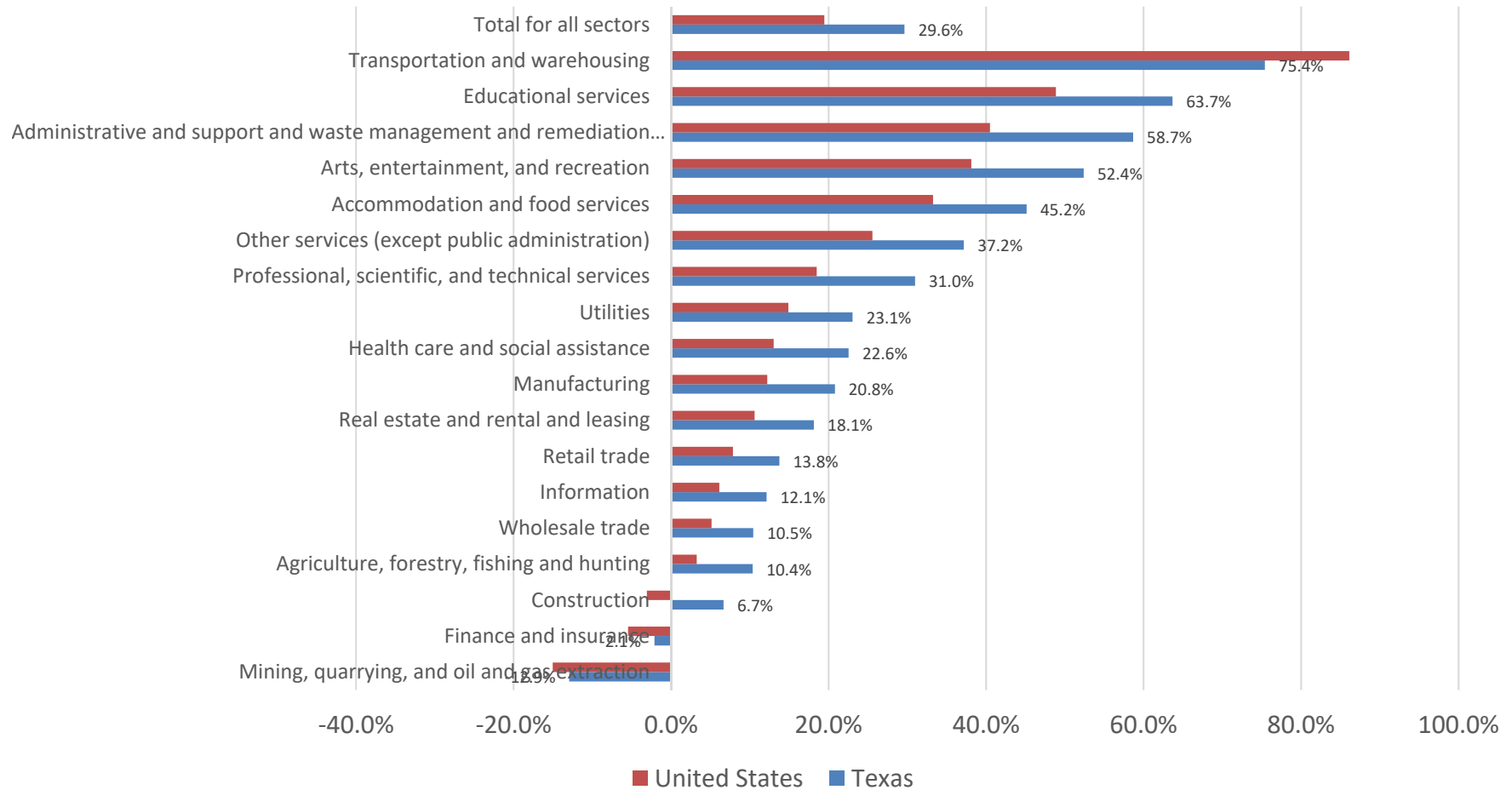
# Numeric change in nonemployers, Texas and the U.S. 2006 to 2016

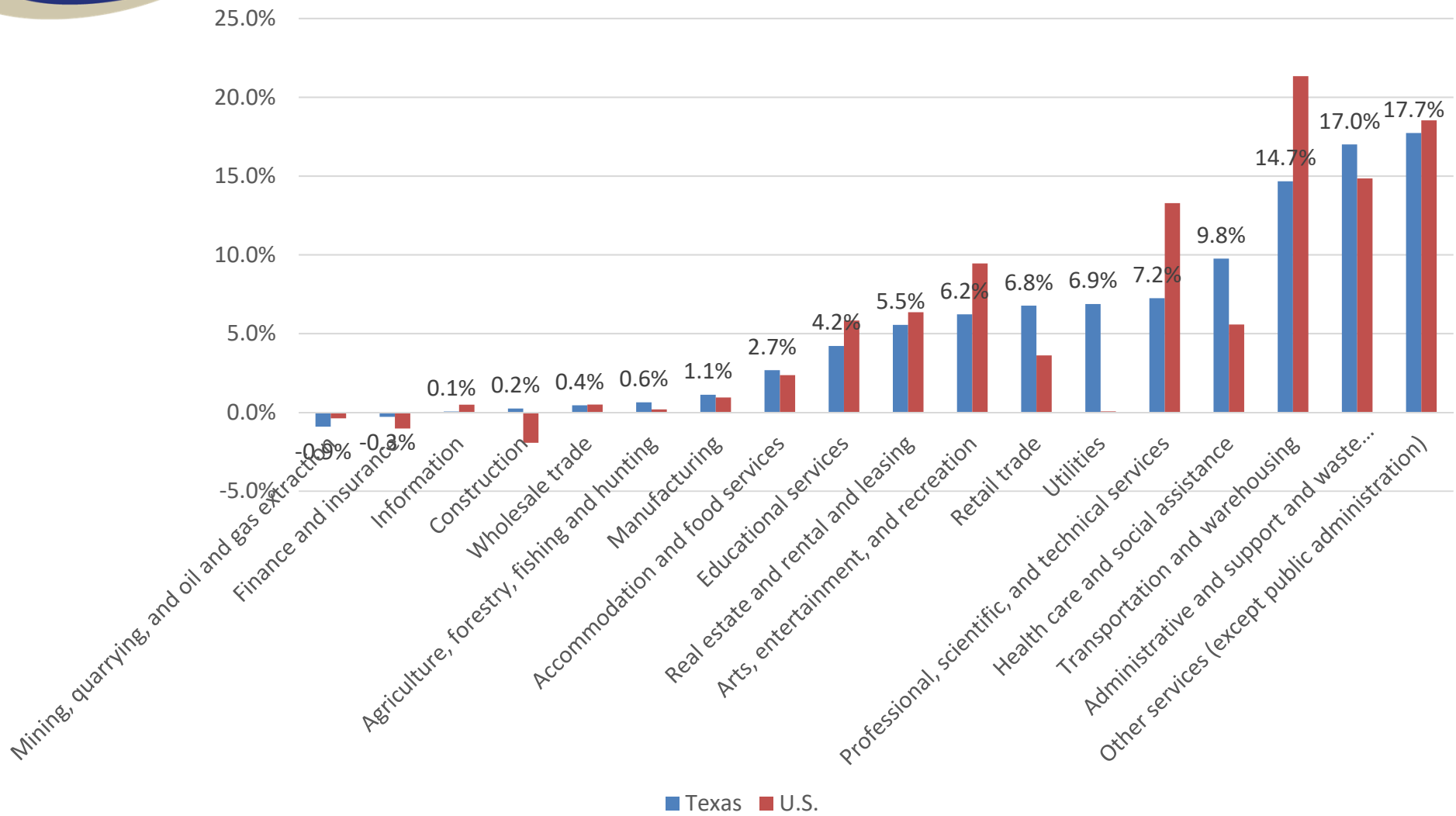
# Percent change in nonemployers, Texas and the U.S. 2006 to 2016
