

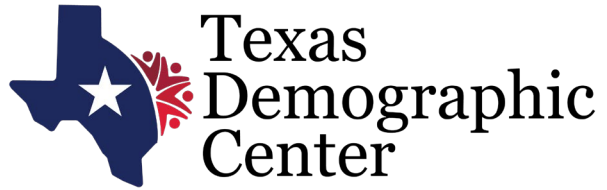

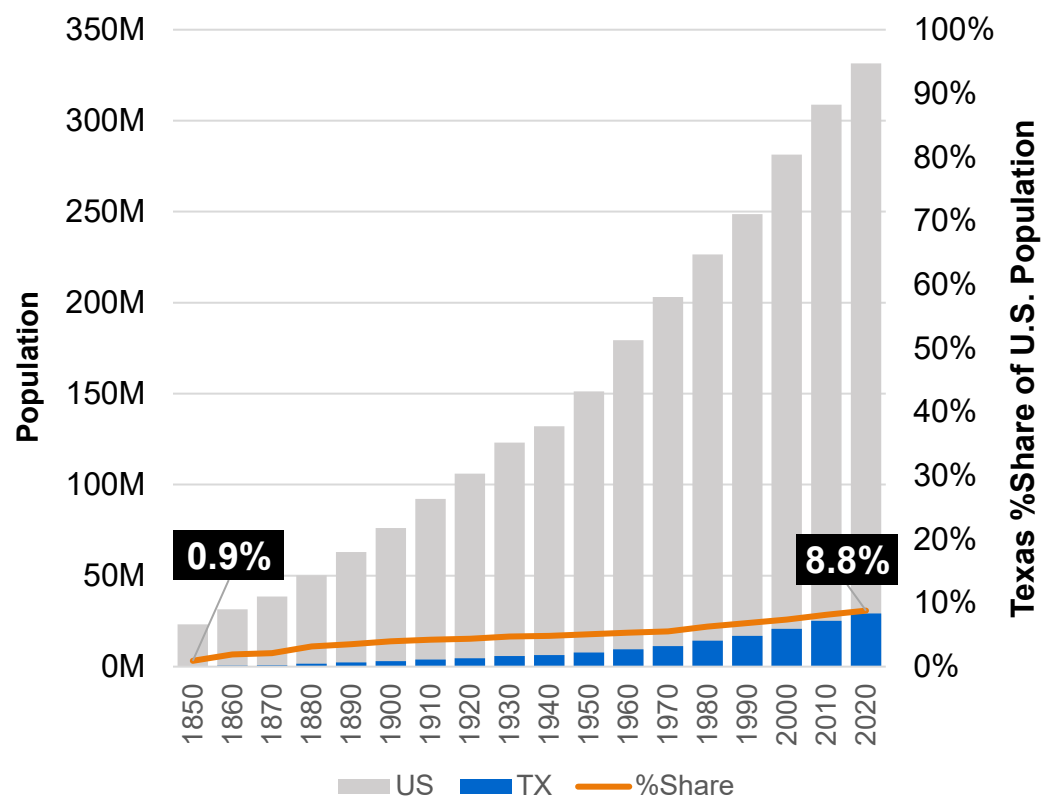

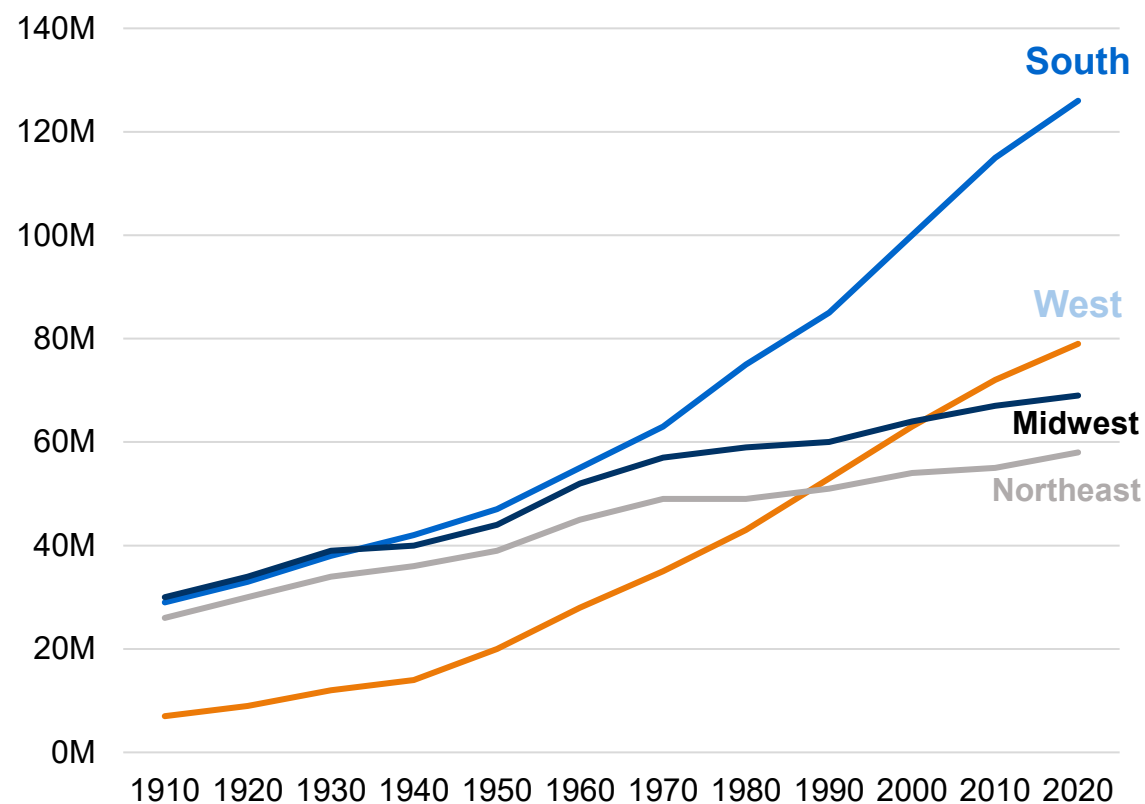

Texas' Share of the U.S. Population Continues to Rise



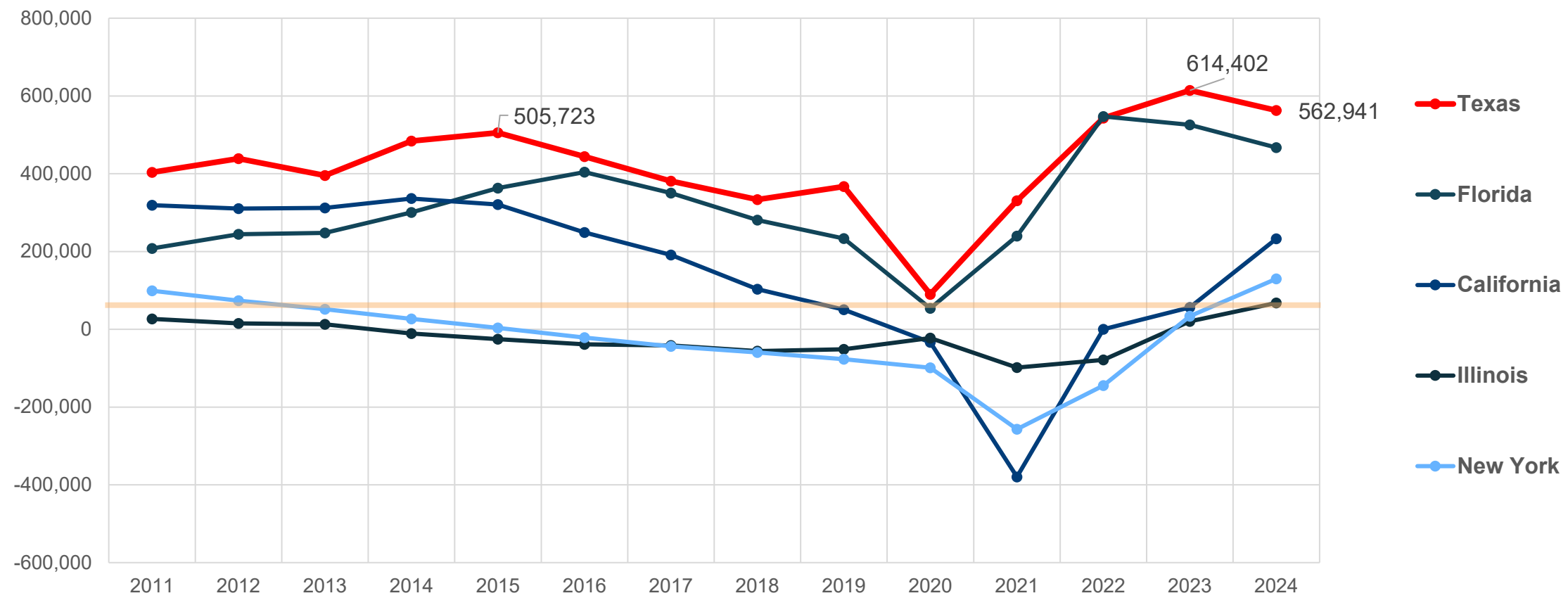

Estimated Annual Population Change for Large States, 2011-2024



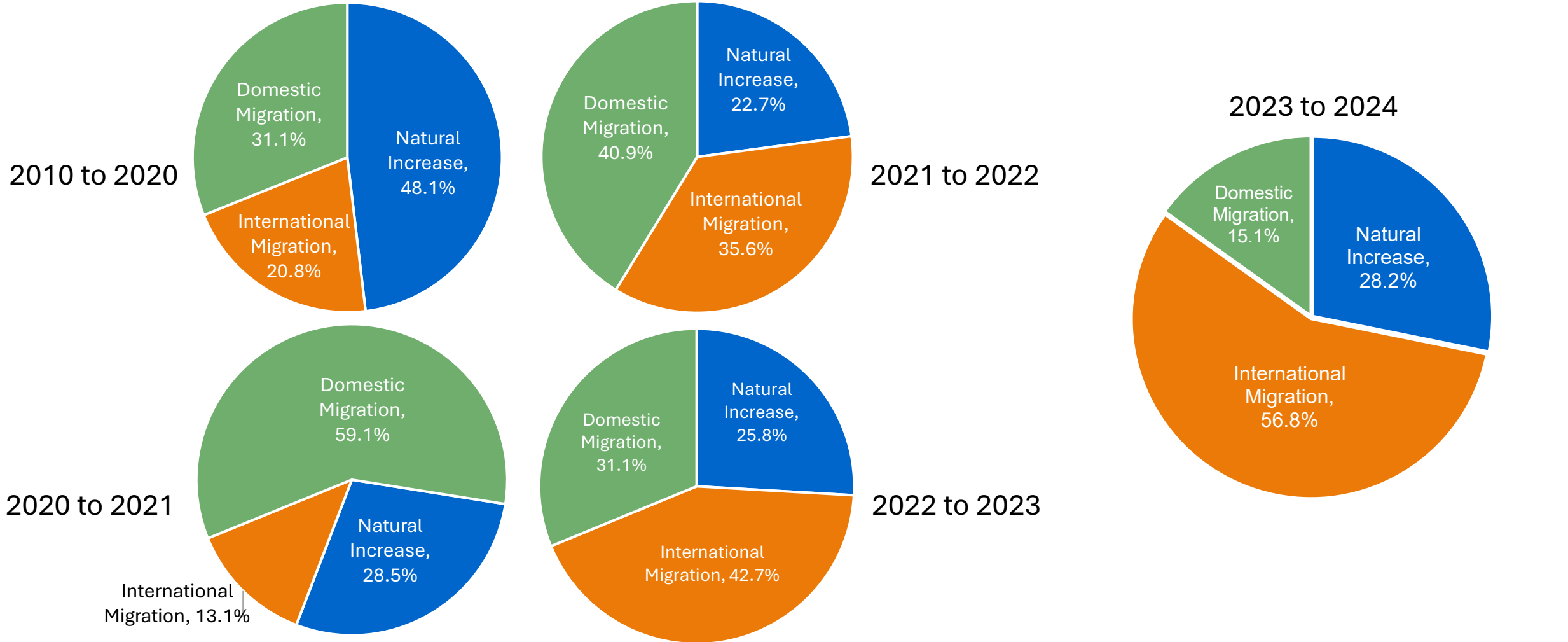

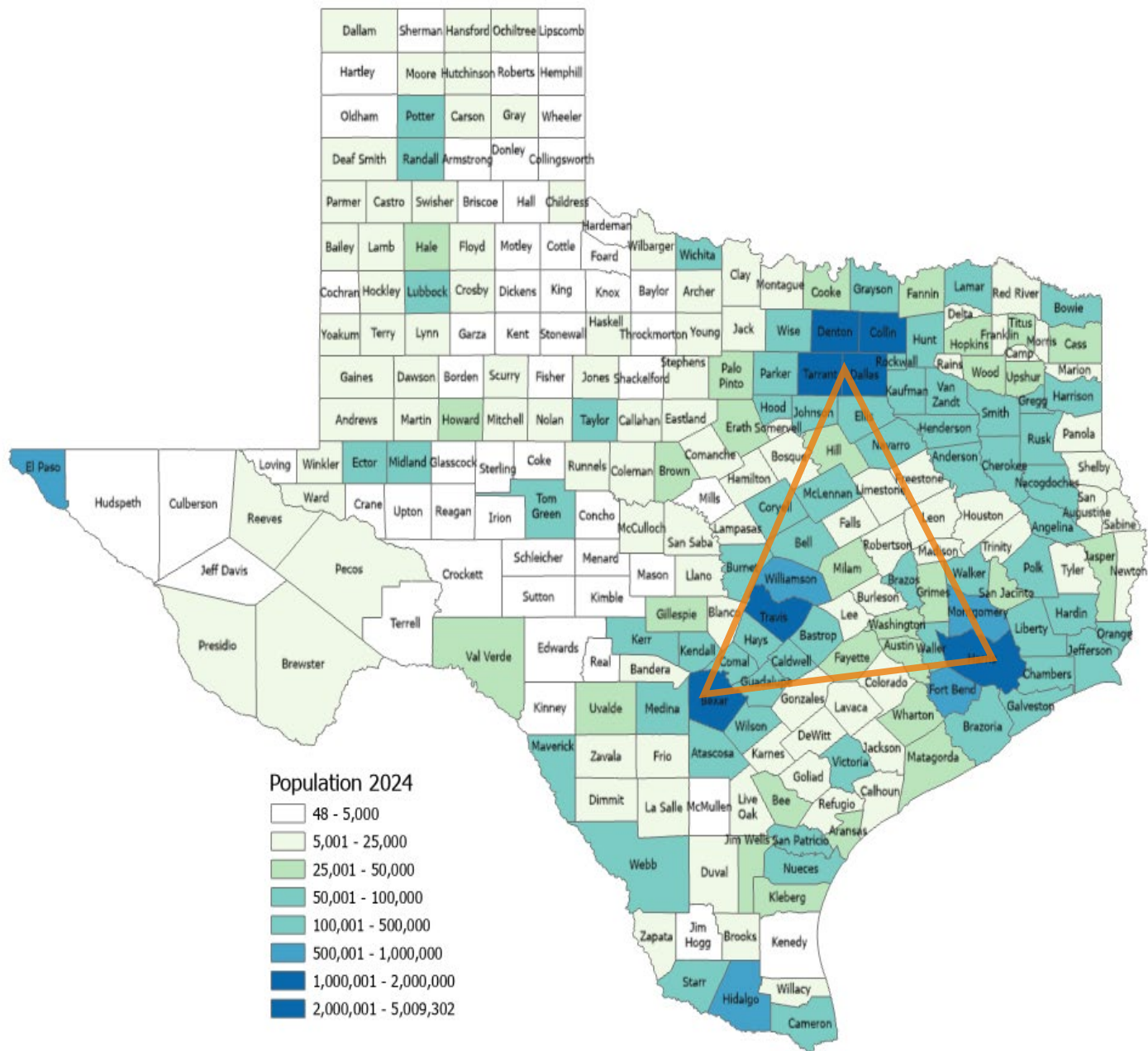

Estimated Components of Population Change for Texas, 2010-2020 and each year 2020 to 2024

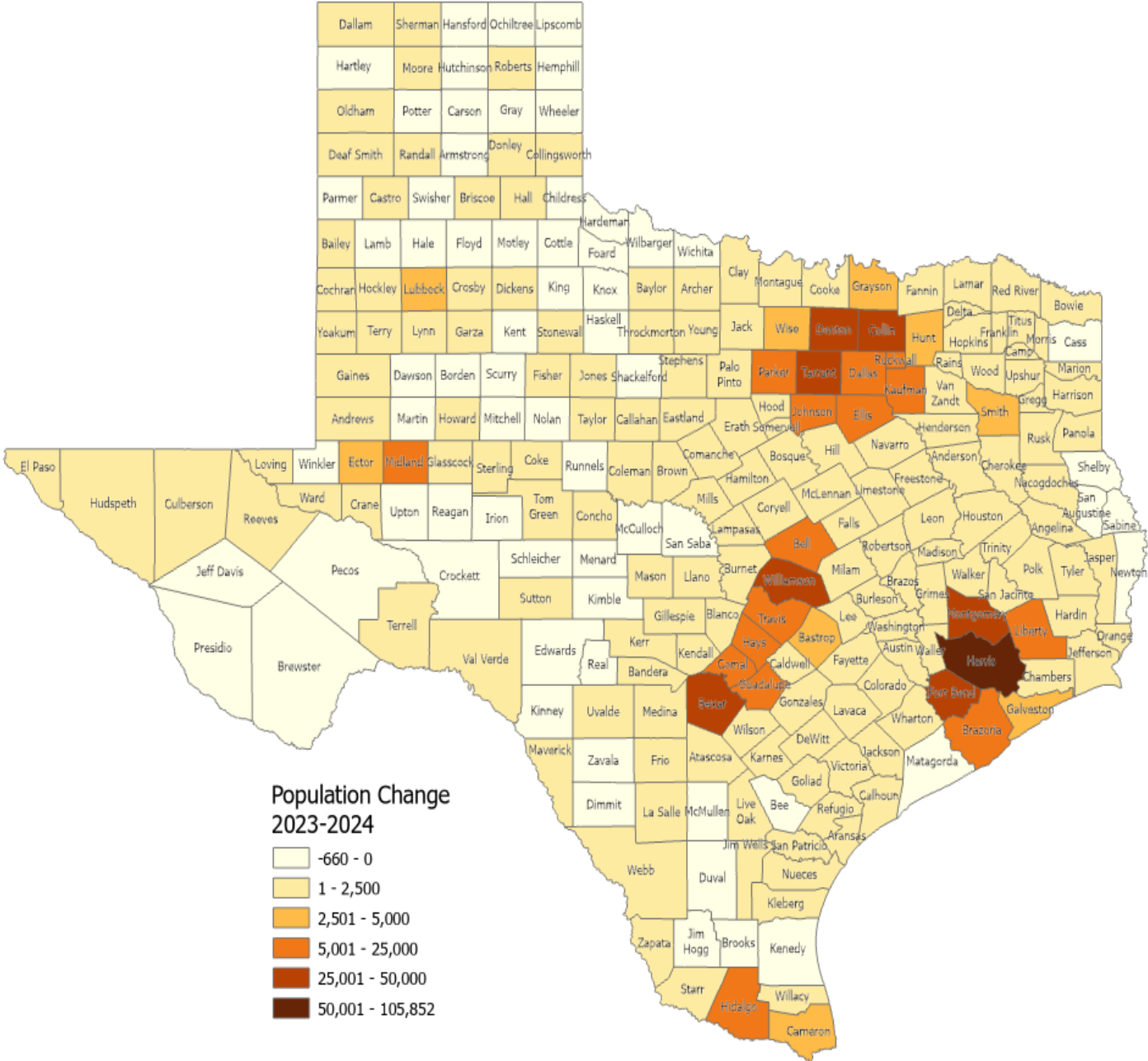


Estimated Population, Texas Counties, 2024

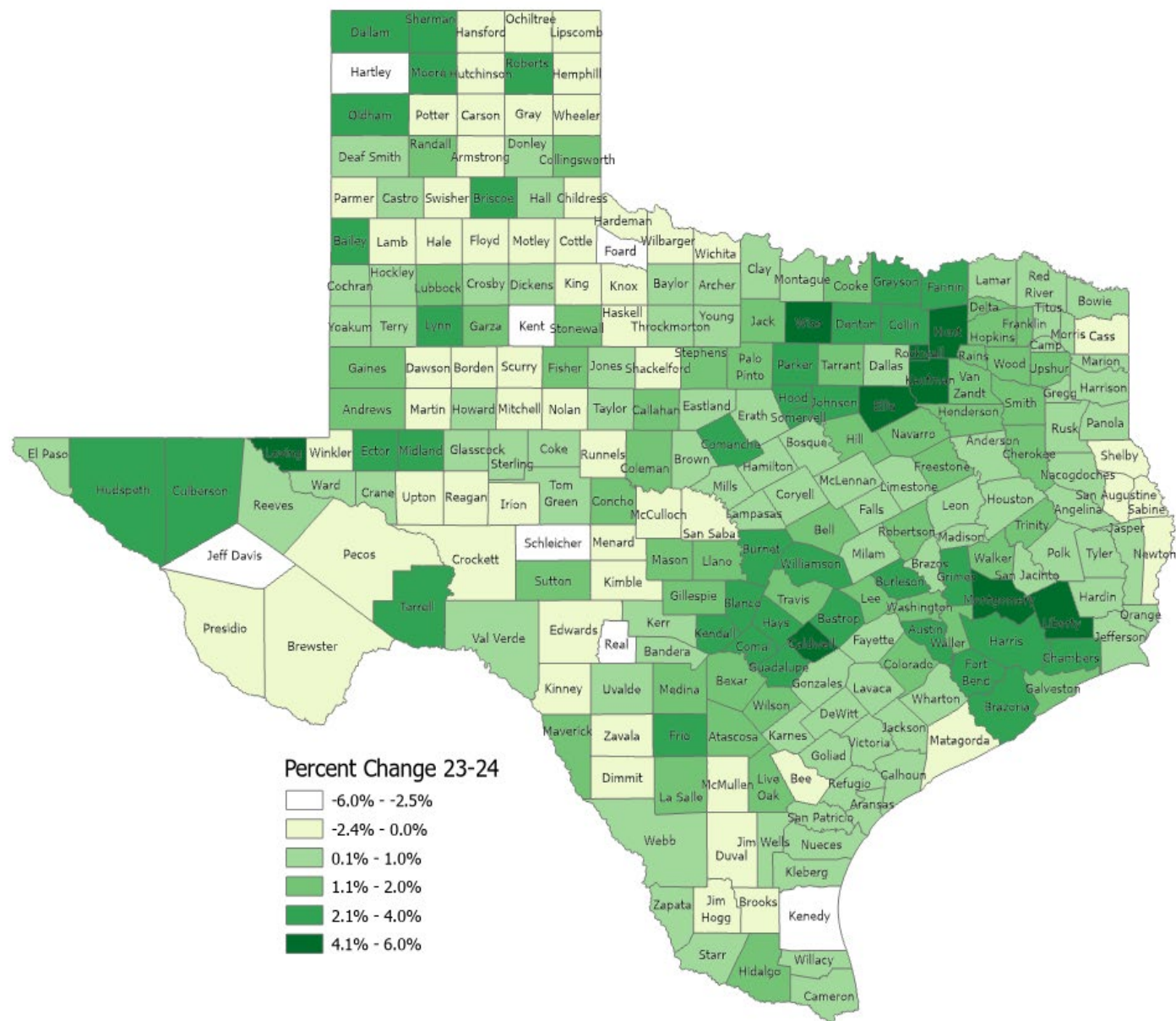

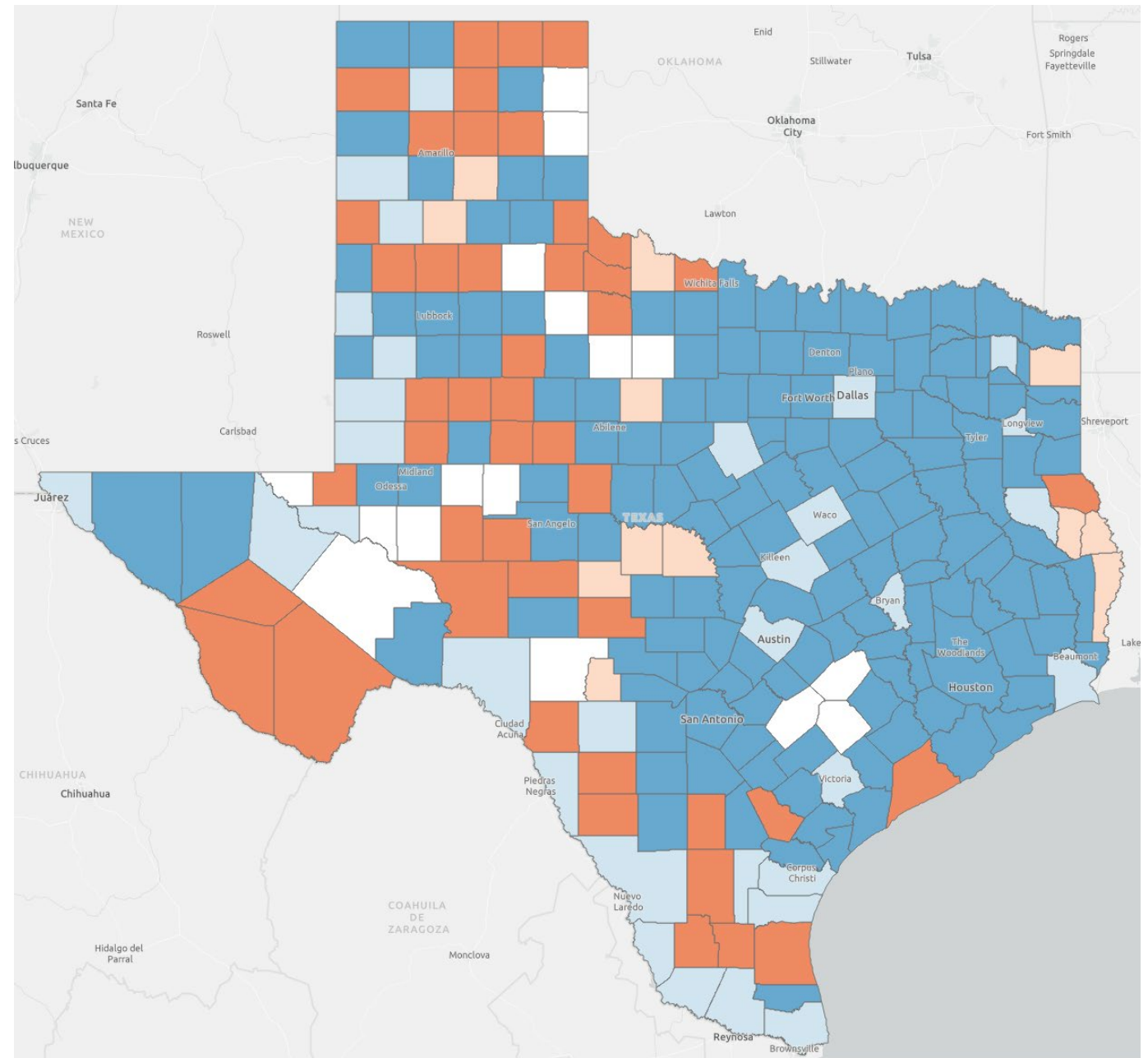

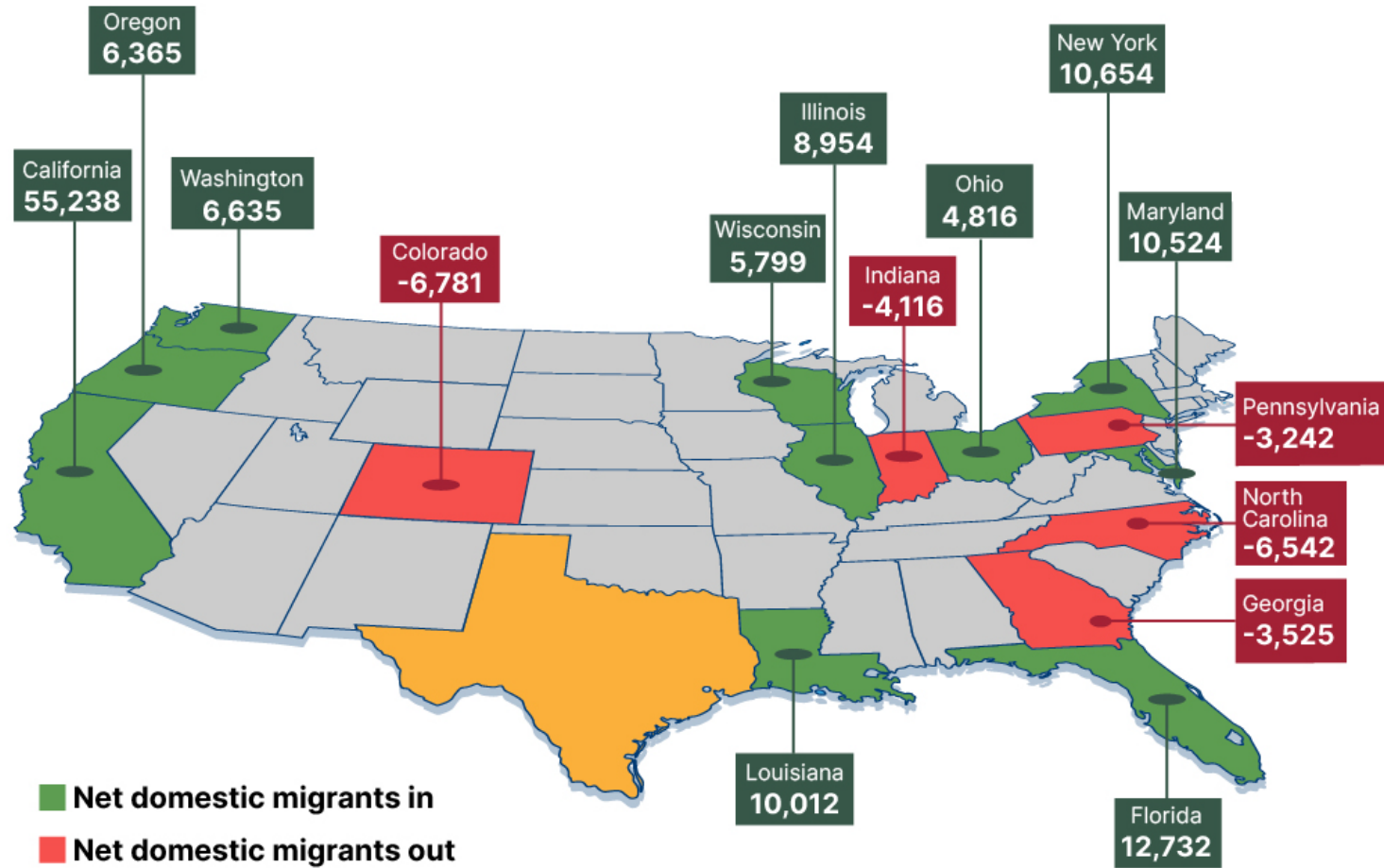

- Population increase driven by in-migration



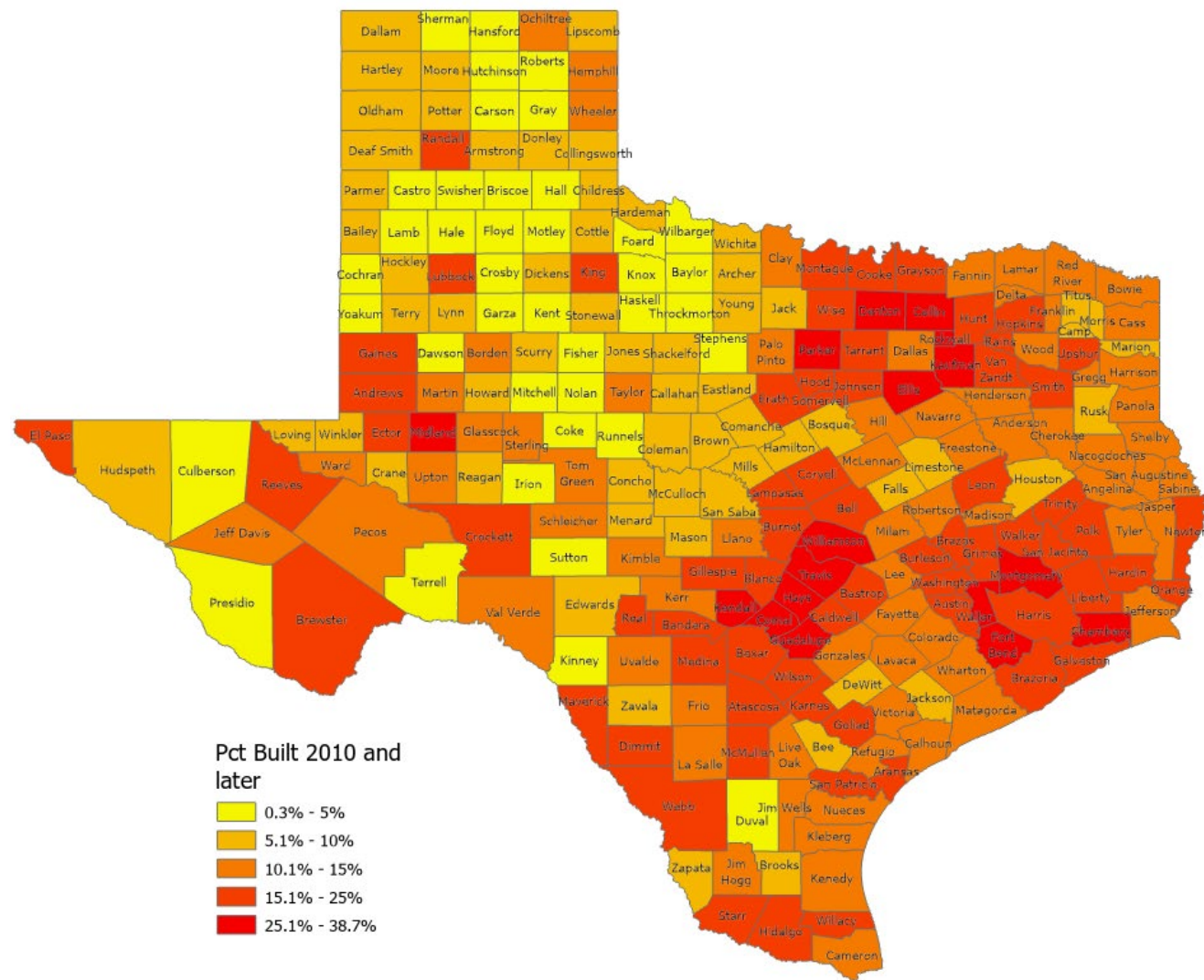
Texas State-to-State Net Domestic Migration, 2023



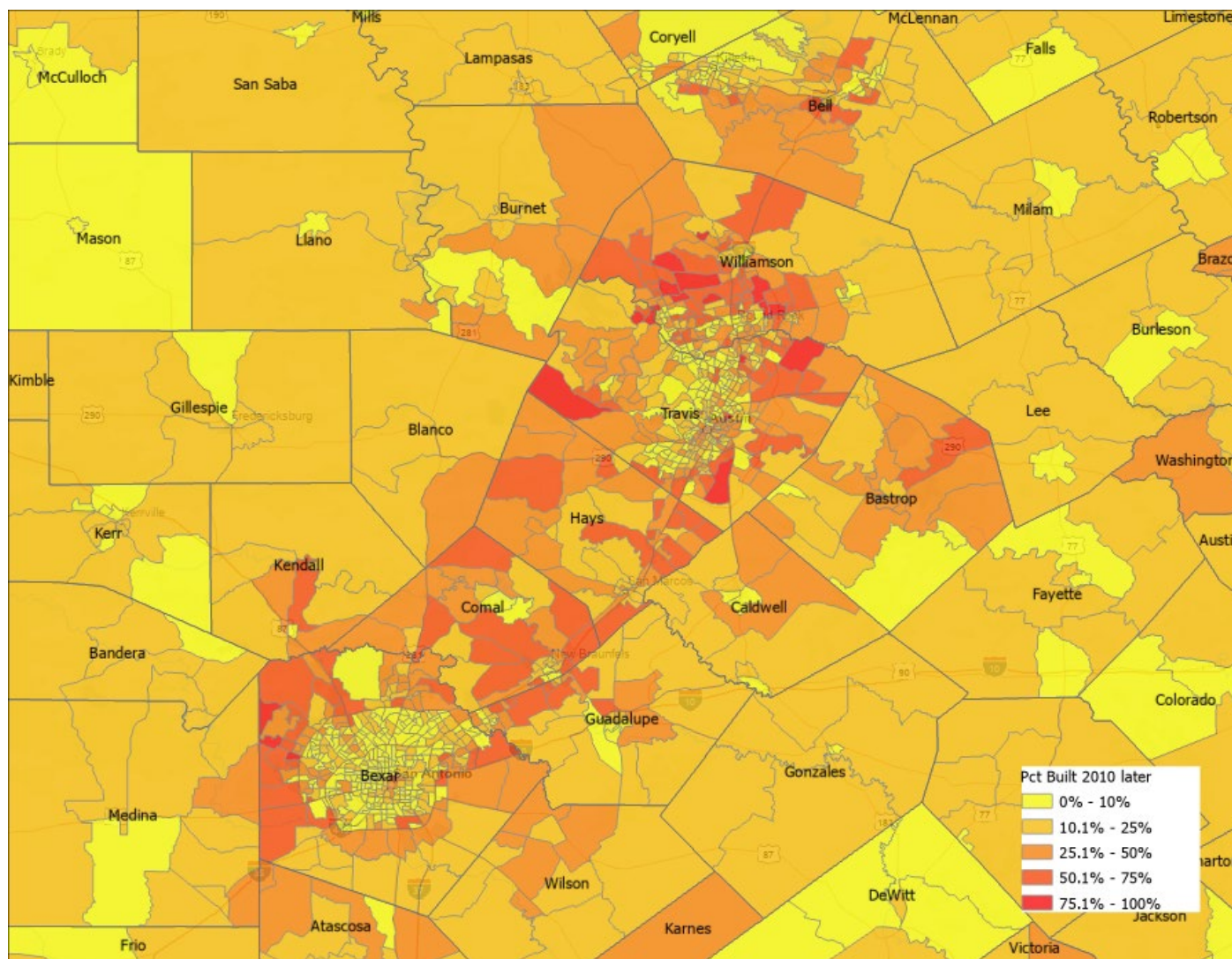

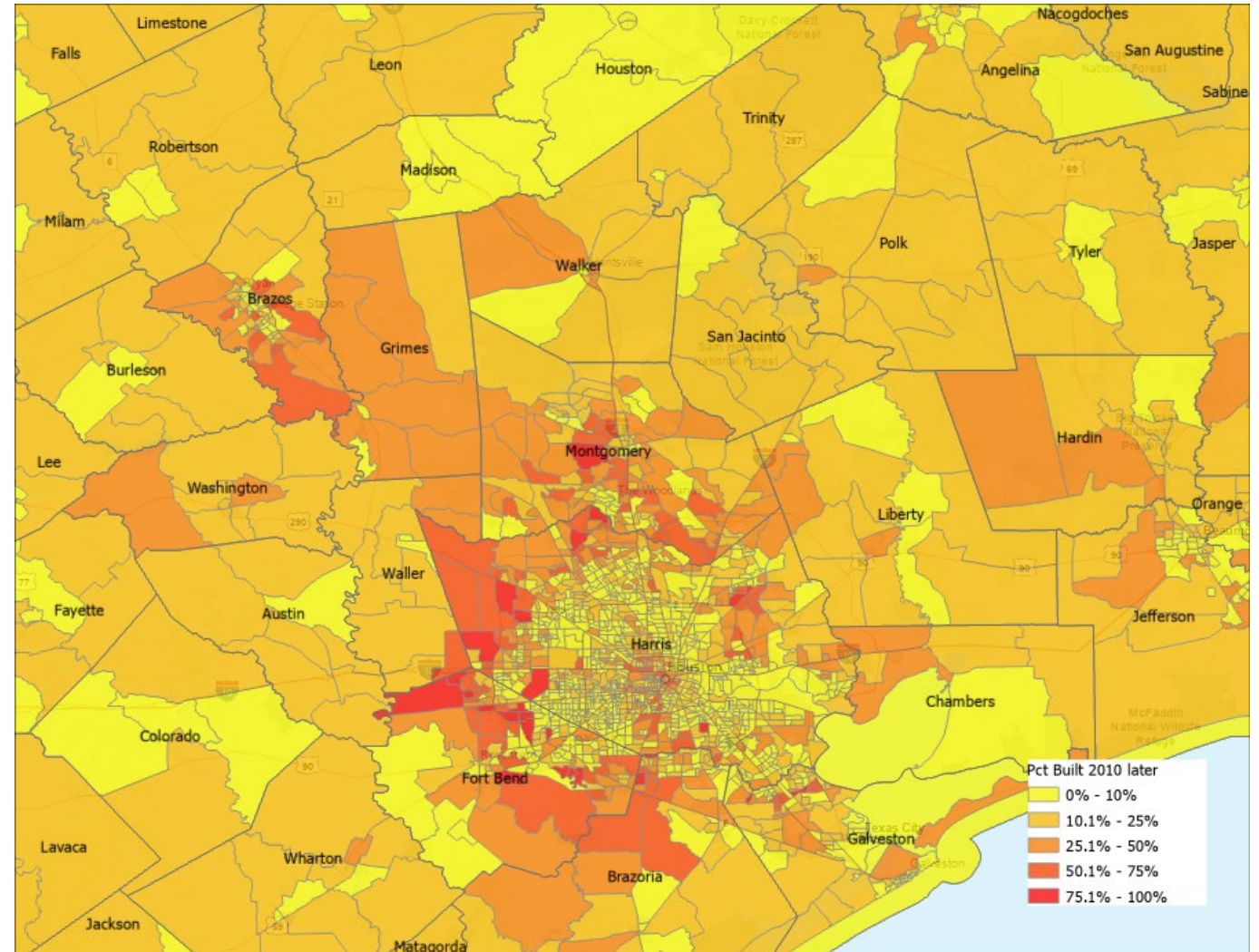
Percent of the housing units built after 2010, Texas Counties



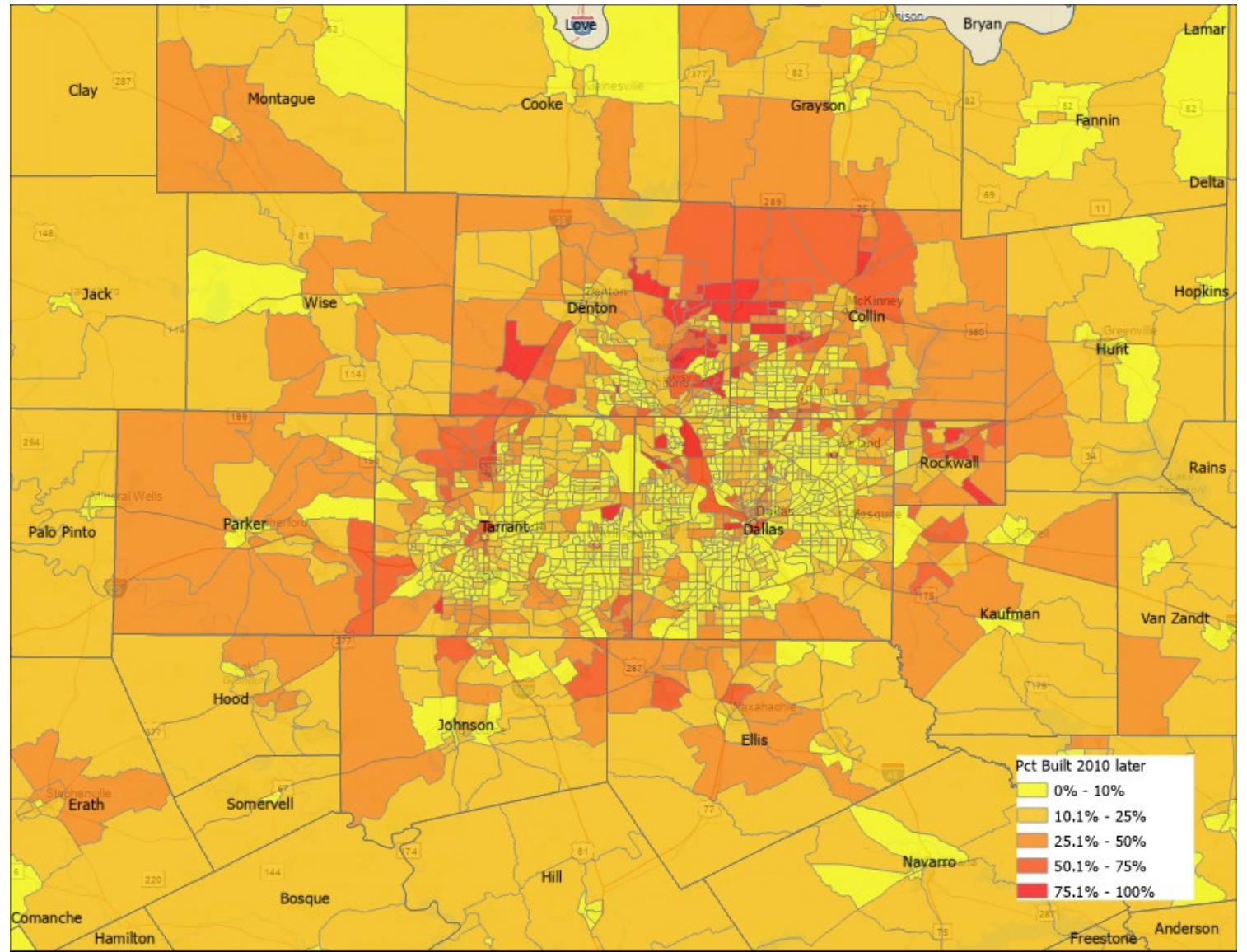
Percent of the housing units built after 2010, Texas Census Tracts, San Antonio and Austin Area



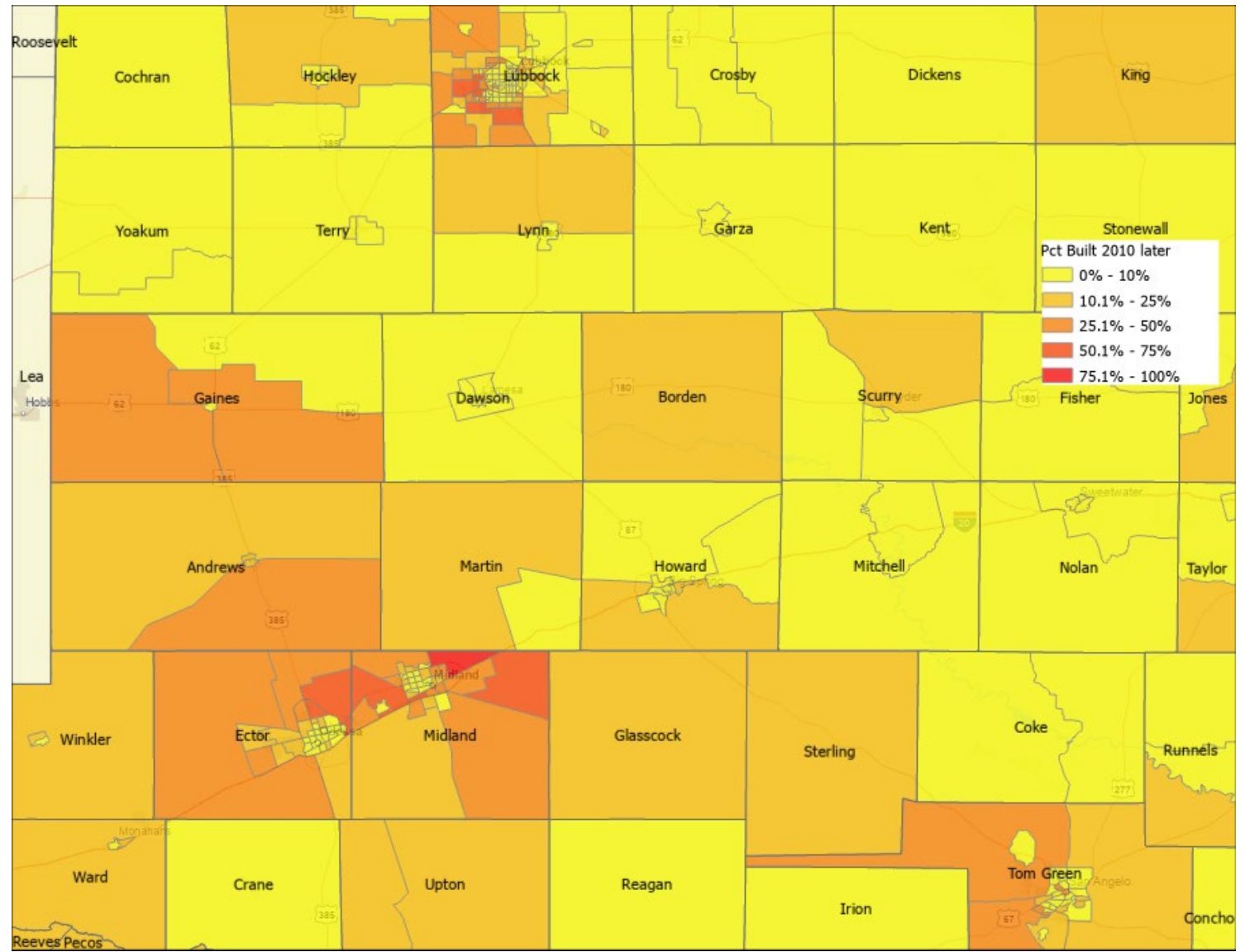
Percent of the housing units built after 2010, Texas Census Tracts, Houston Area



Percent of the housing units built after 2010, Texas Census Tracts, Dallas-Fort Worth Area

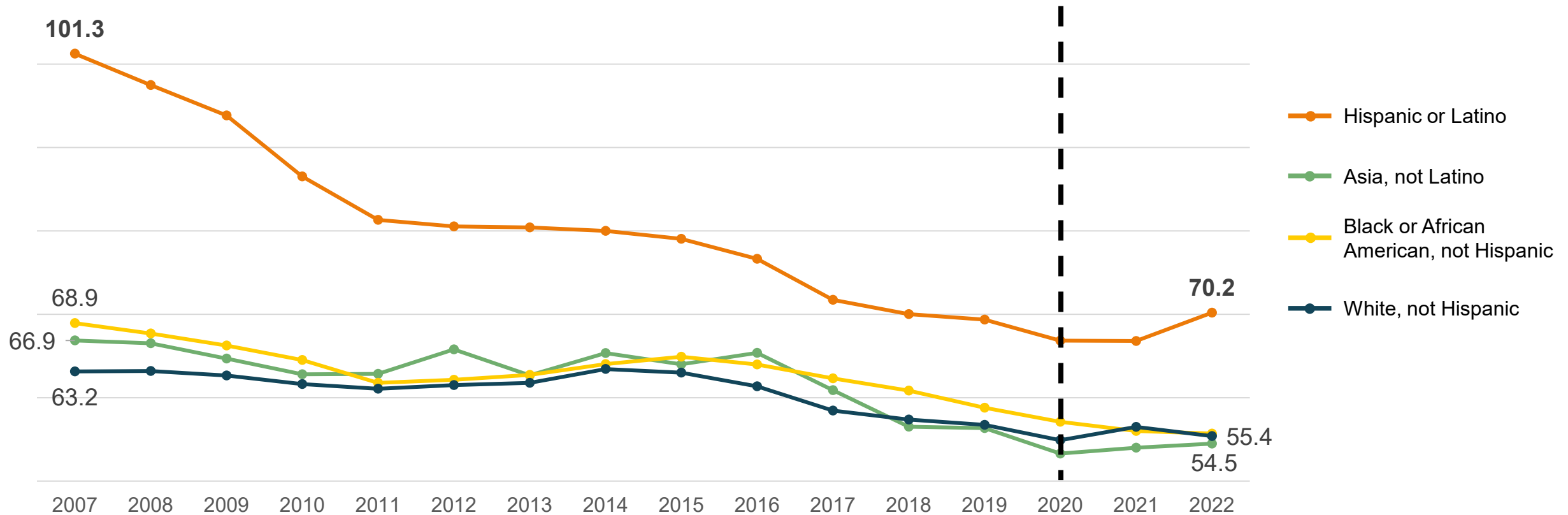


Percent of the housing units built after 2010, Texas Census Tracts, Lubbock and Permian Basin Area

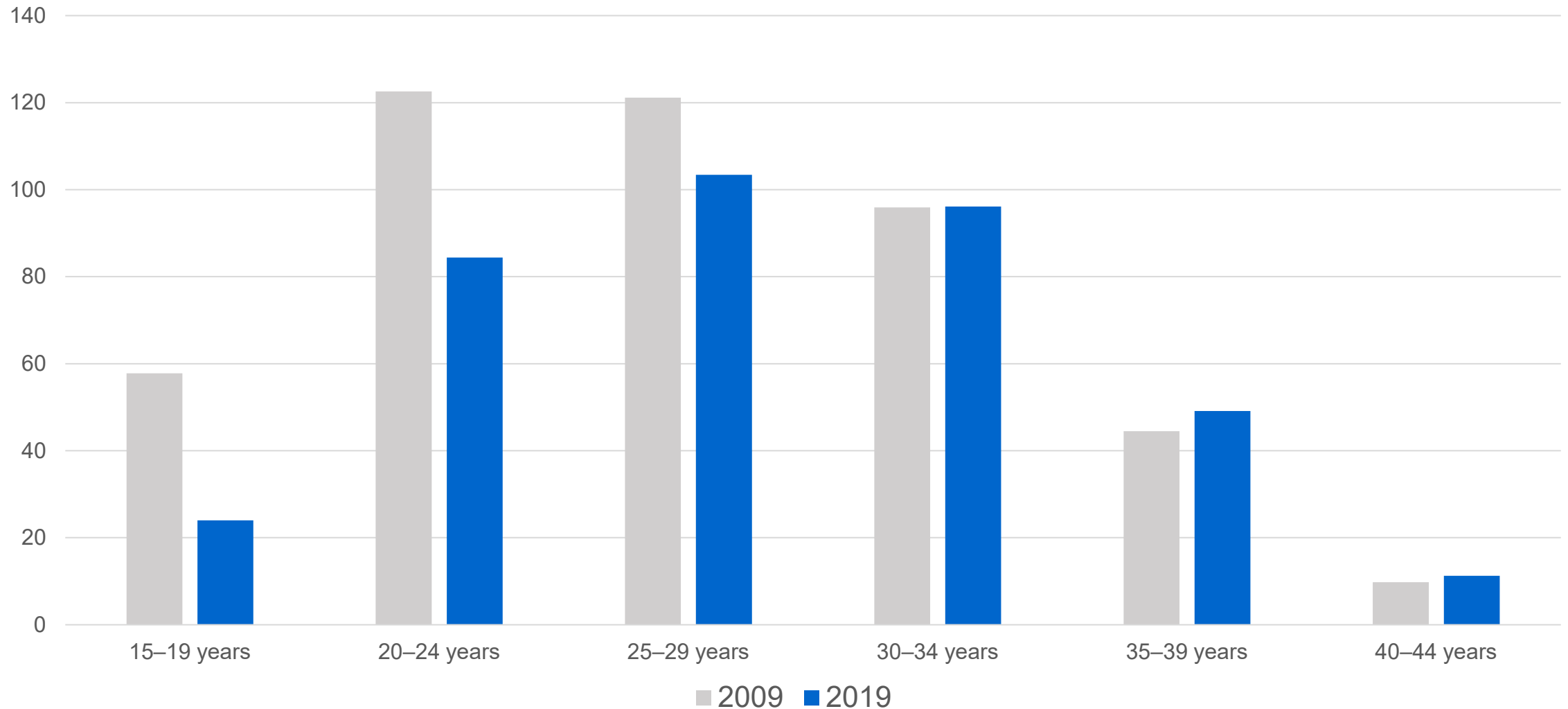


Texas Birth Rates, 2007-2022

Births per 1,000 women aged 15-44



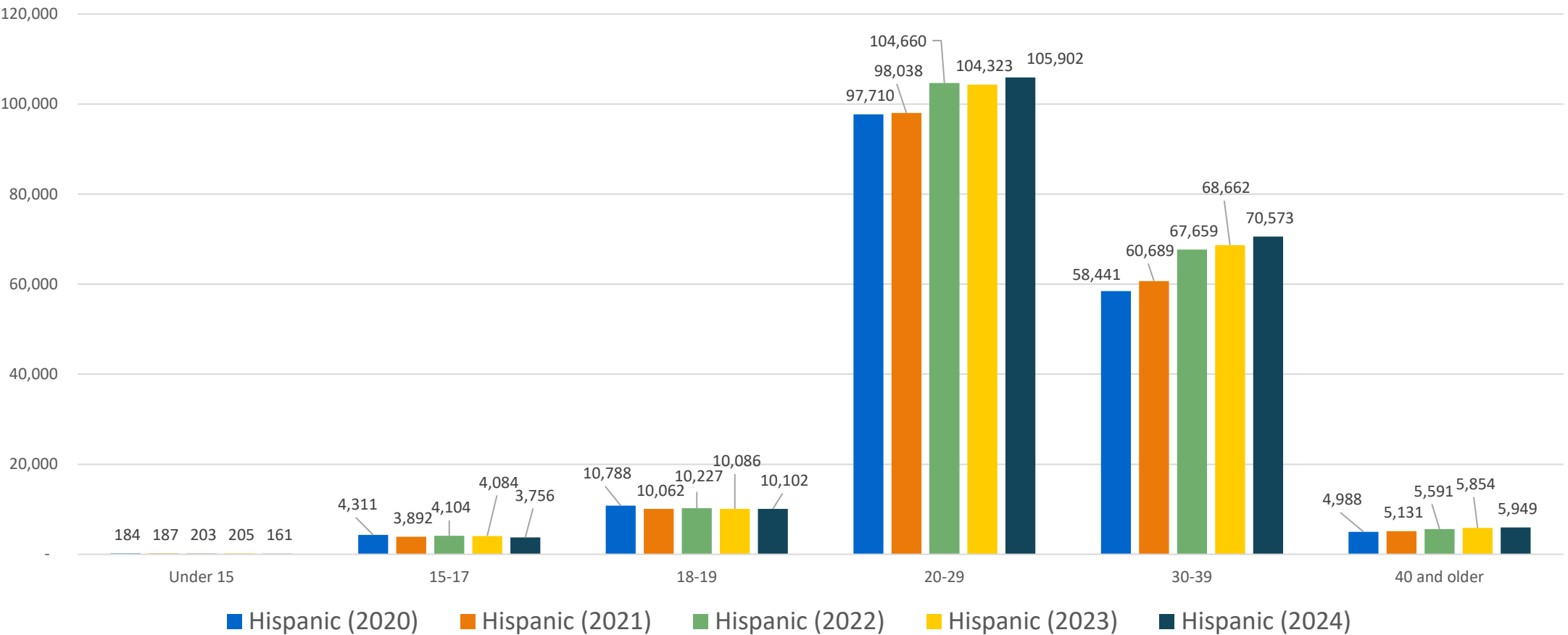
Texas Birth Rates by Age Group of Mothers, 2009, 2019

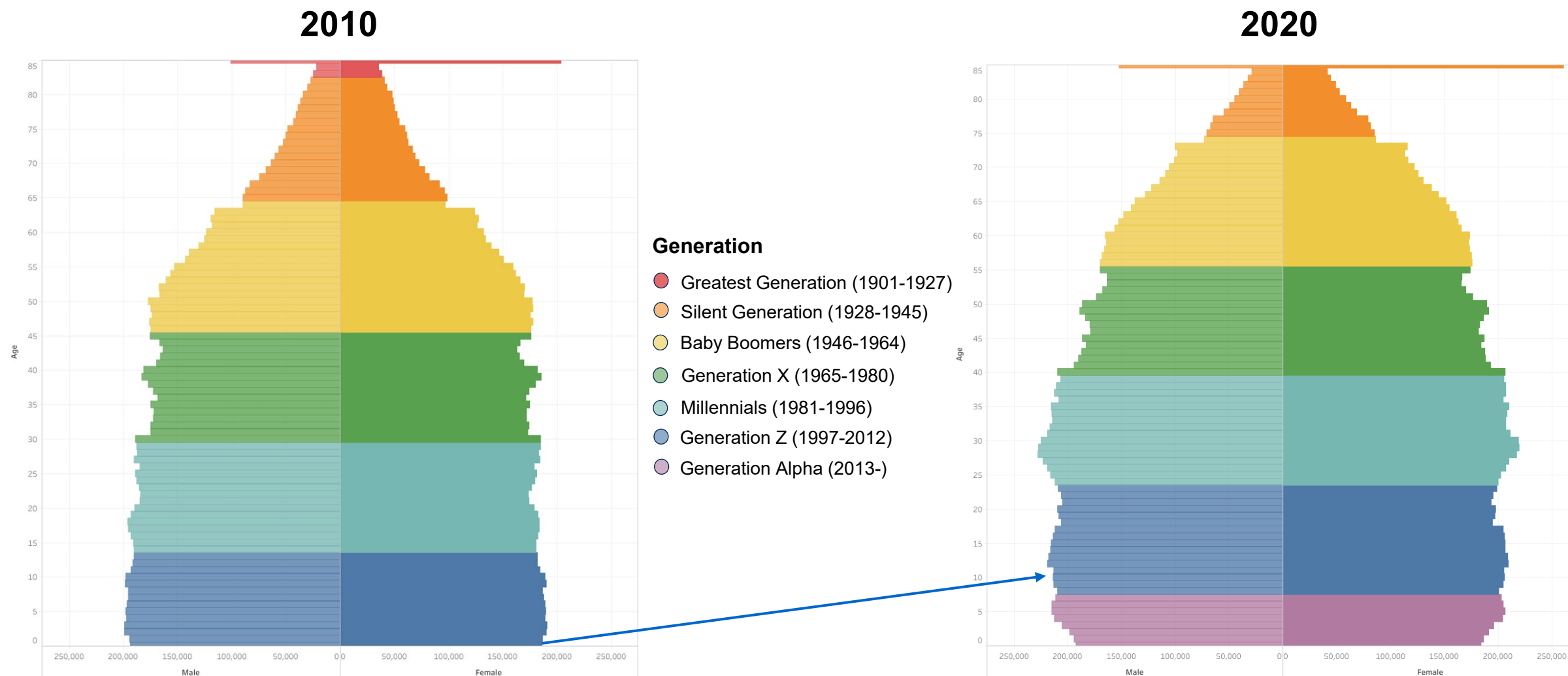
Births among Hispanic Women by Age Group, Texas, 2020-2024

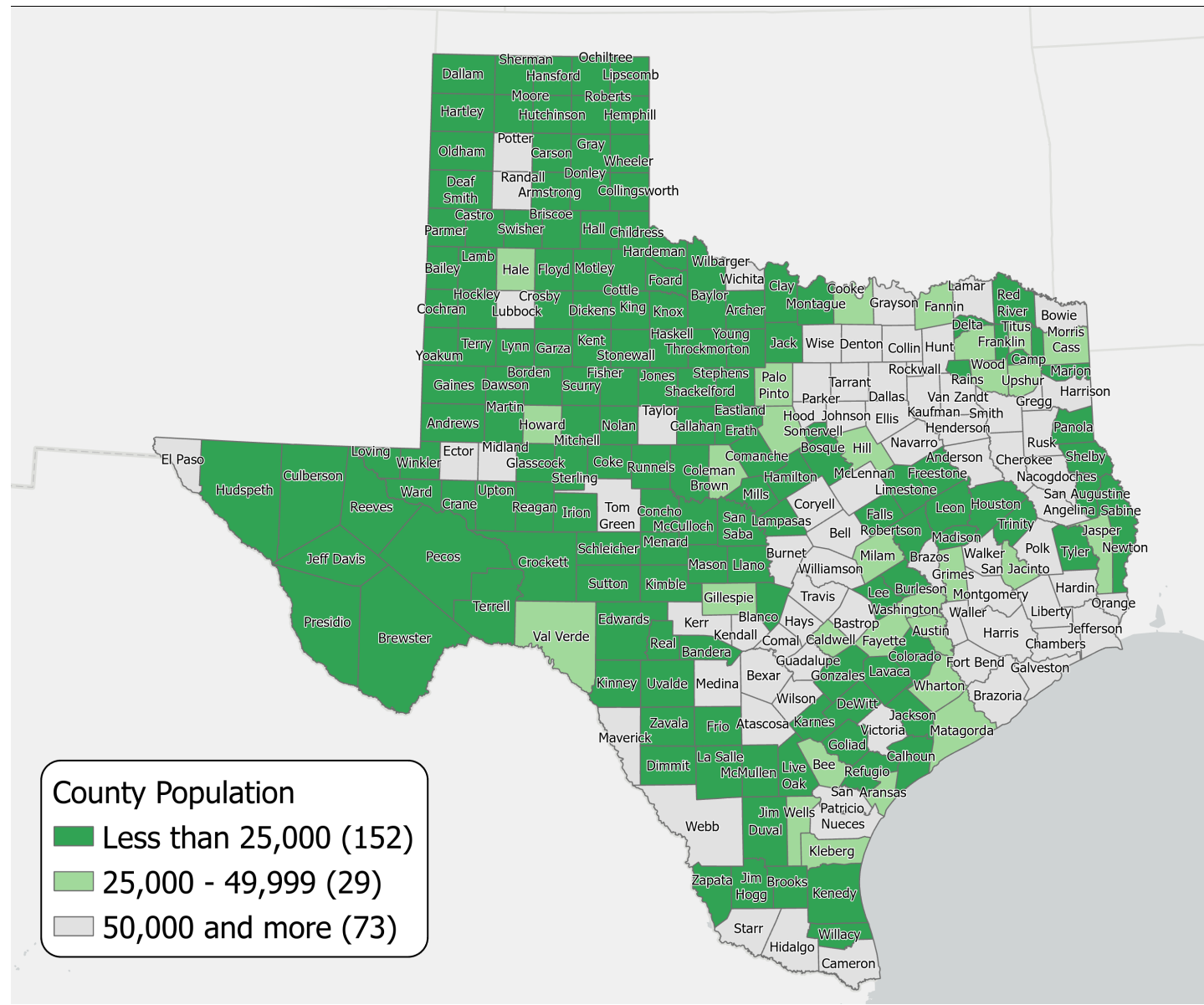
Generational Population Pyramids, Texas, 2010 and 2020

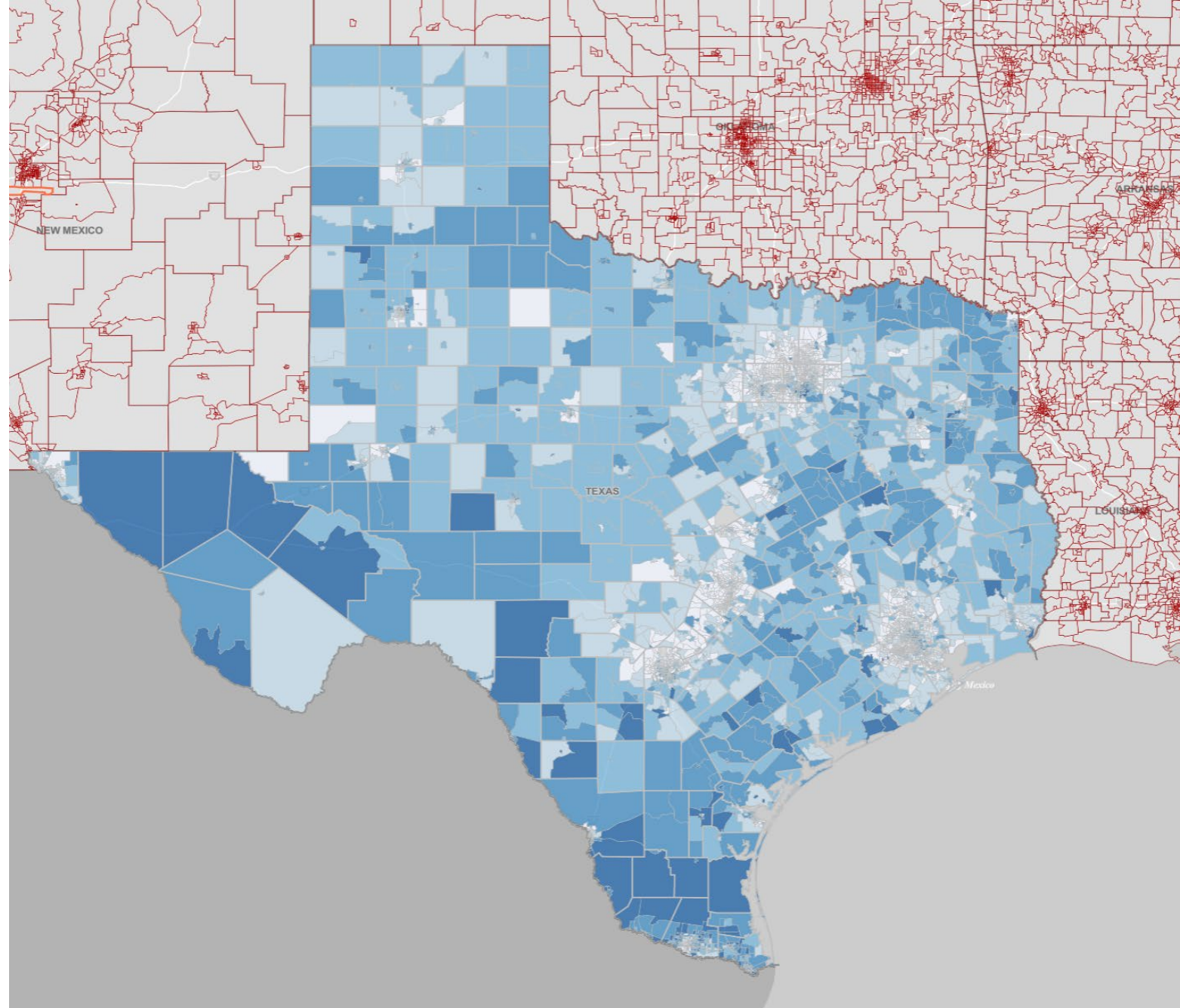

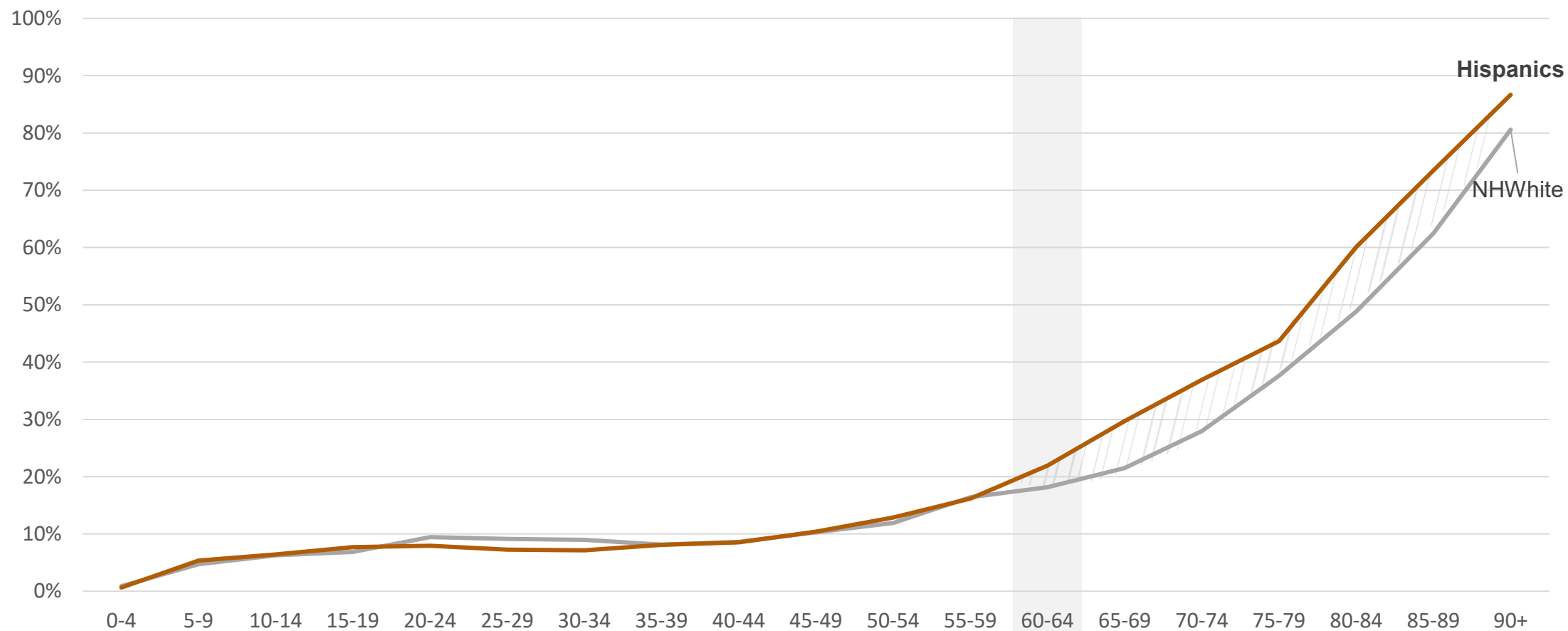

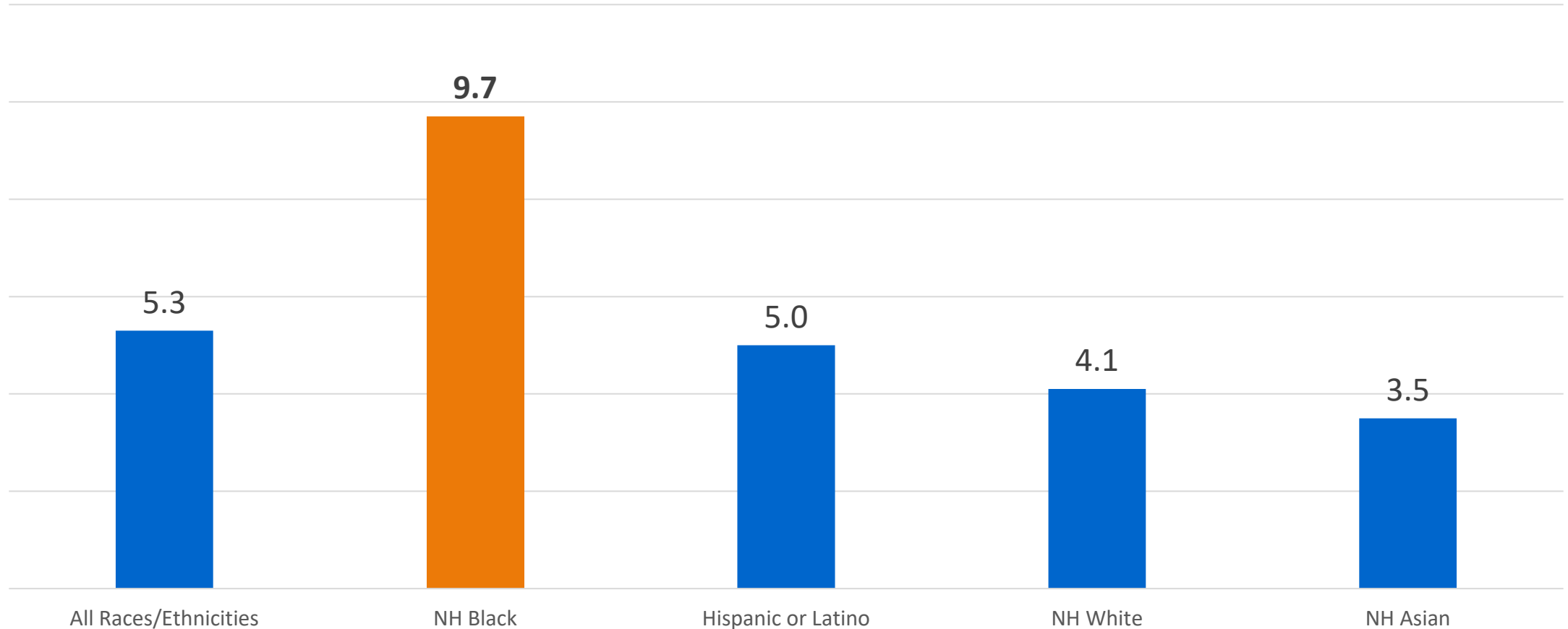


Disability Rate by Age in Texas, 2022

Hispanic disability rates increase faster in older age groups.

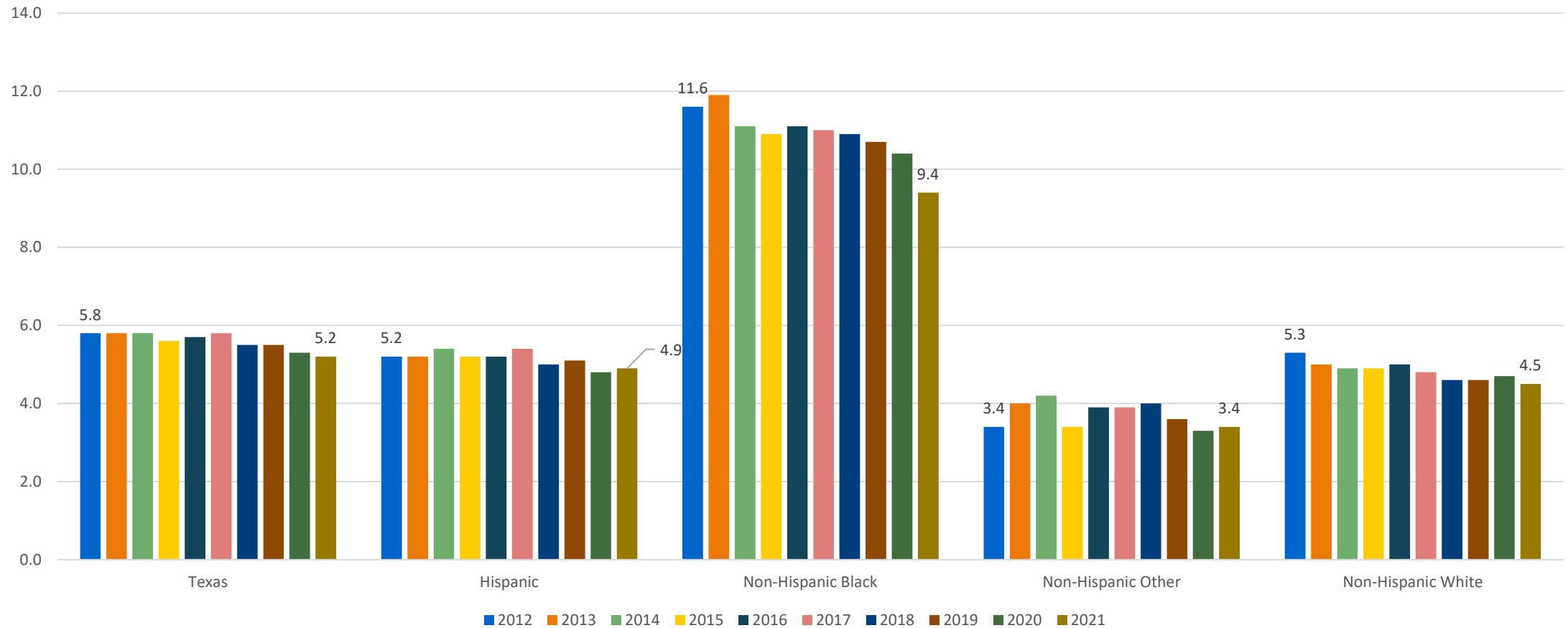


Infant Mortality Rate per 1,000 Live Births by Race and Ethnicity in Texas, 2017-2021

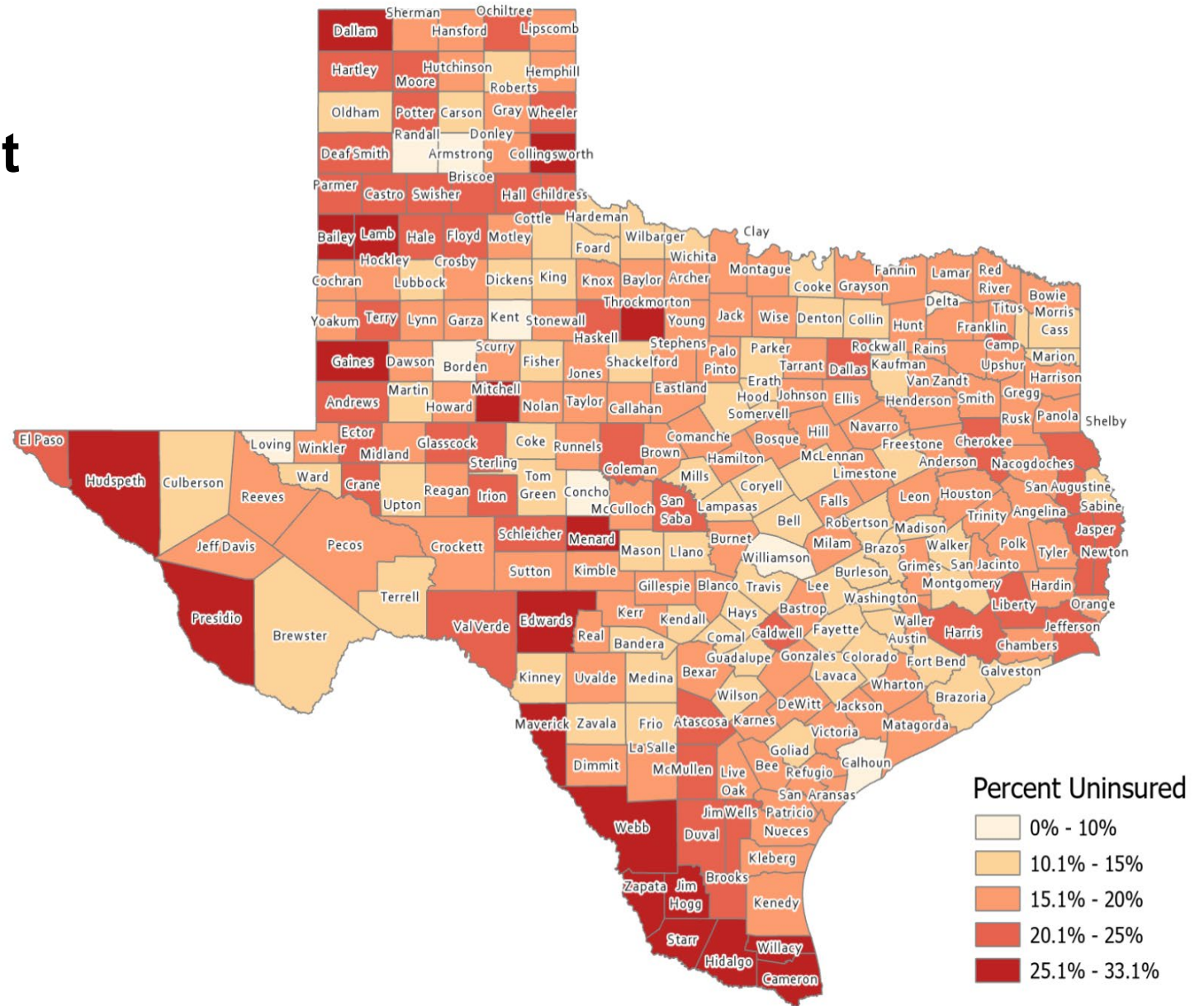

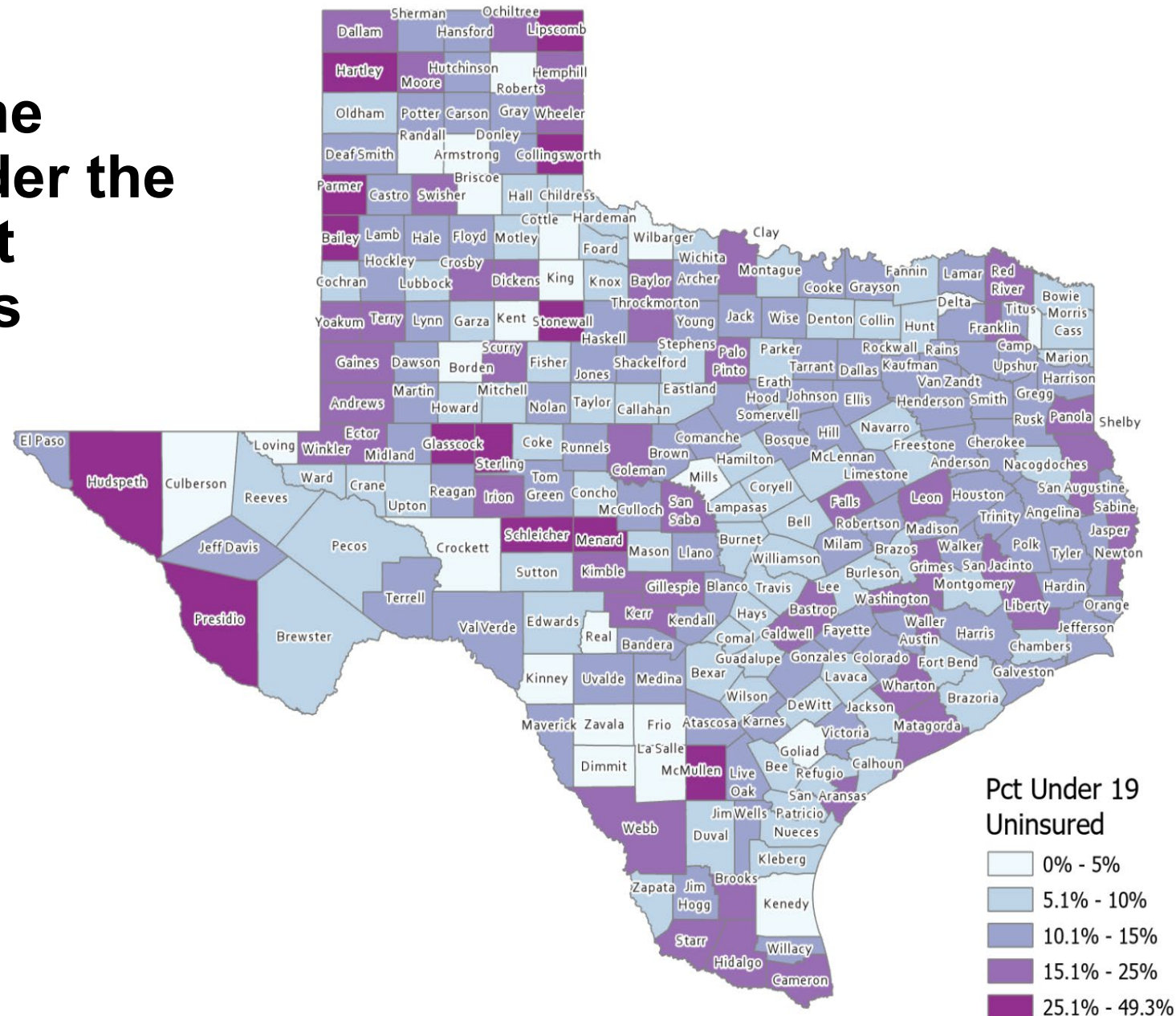
Infant Mortality Rate per 1,000 Live Births by Race and Ethnicity, Texas, 2012-2021



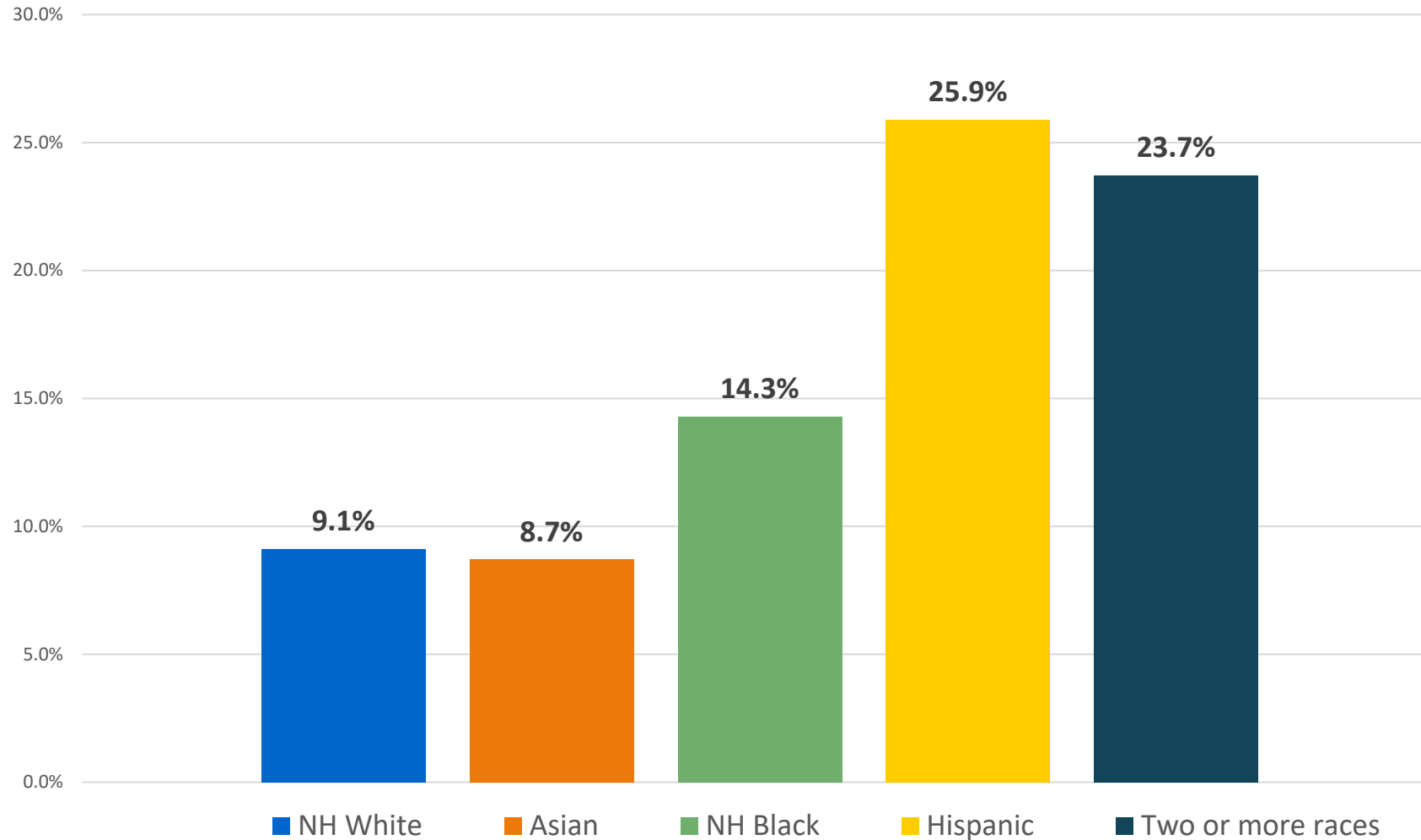
Estimated Percent of the Civilian Population without Health Insurance, Texas Counties, 2022



Estimated Percent of the Civilian Population Under the Age of 19 Years without Health Insurance, Texas Counties, 2022

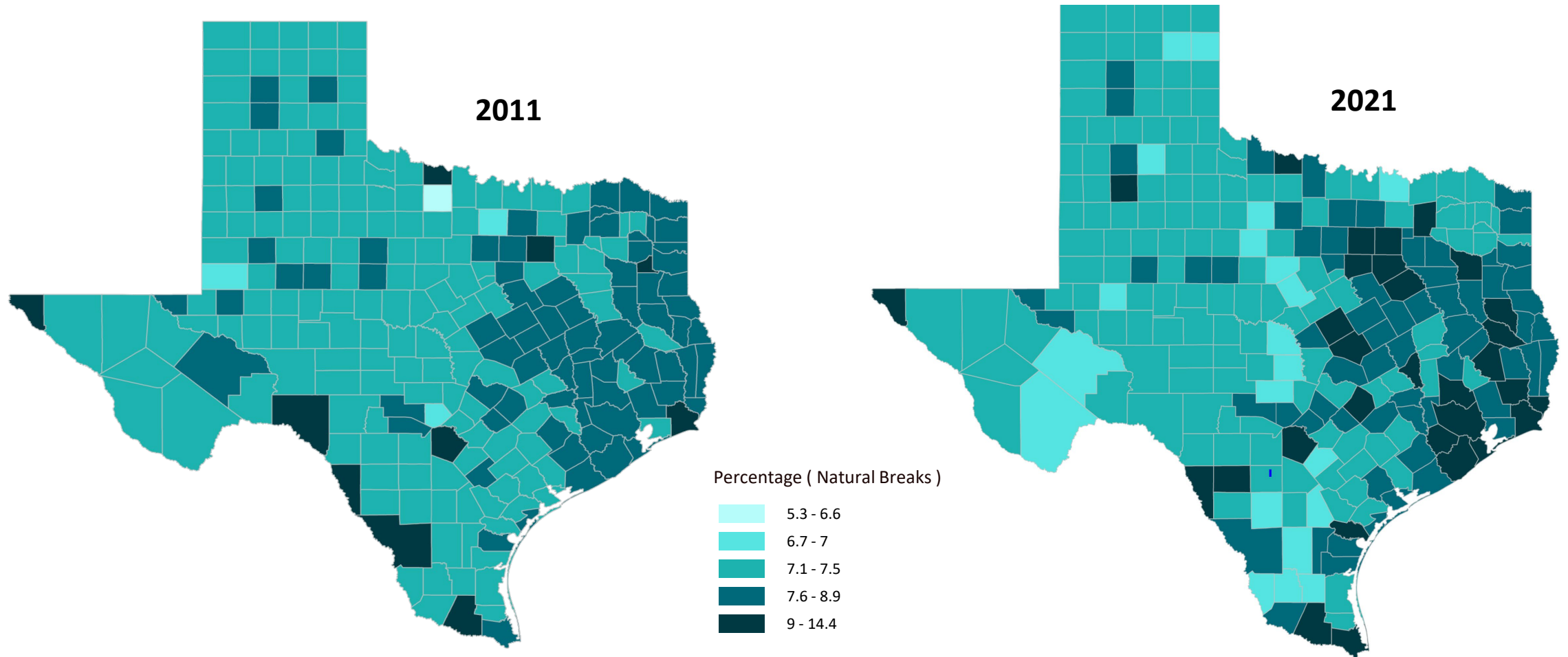


Percent Uninsured by Race/Ethnicity, Texas 2022

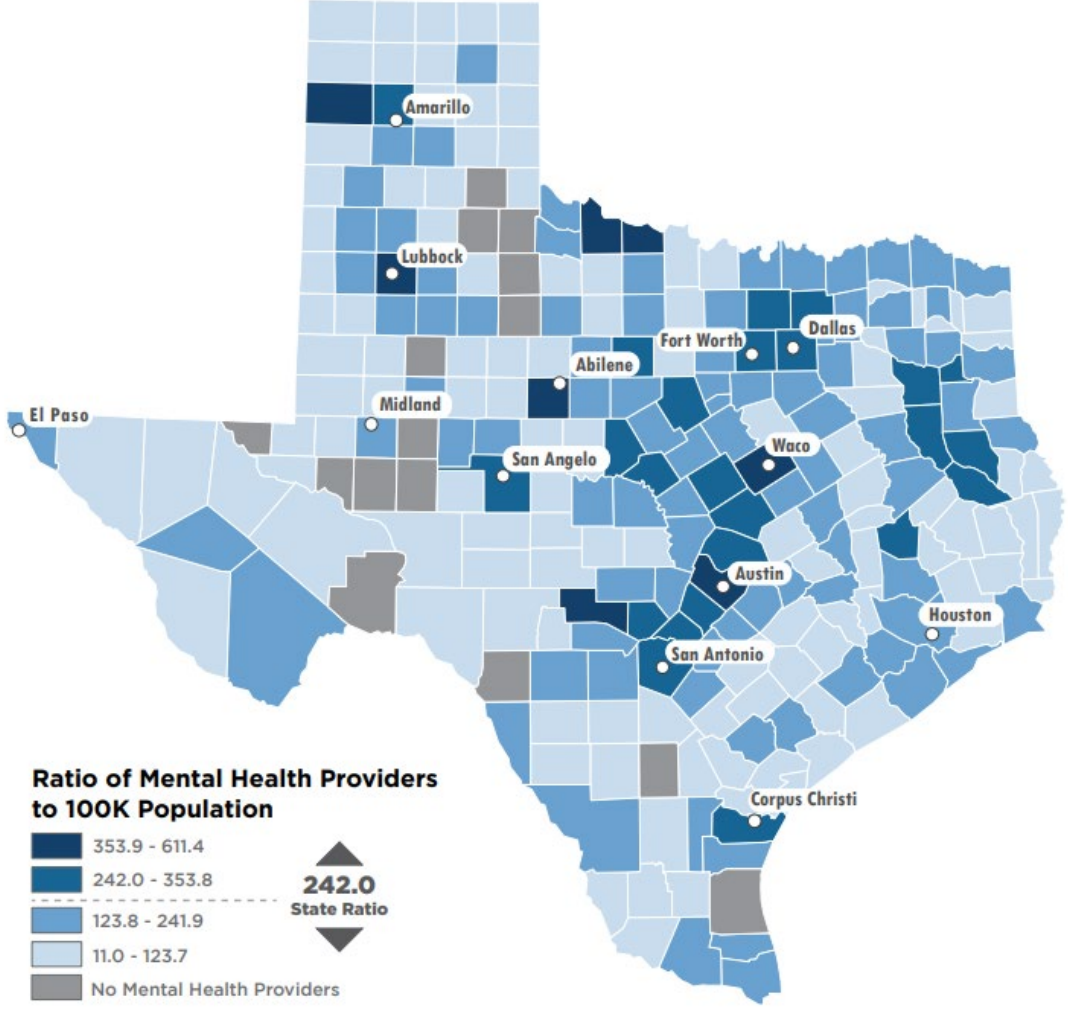
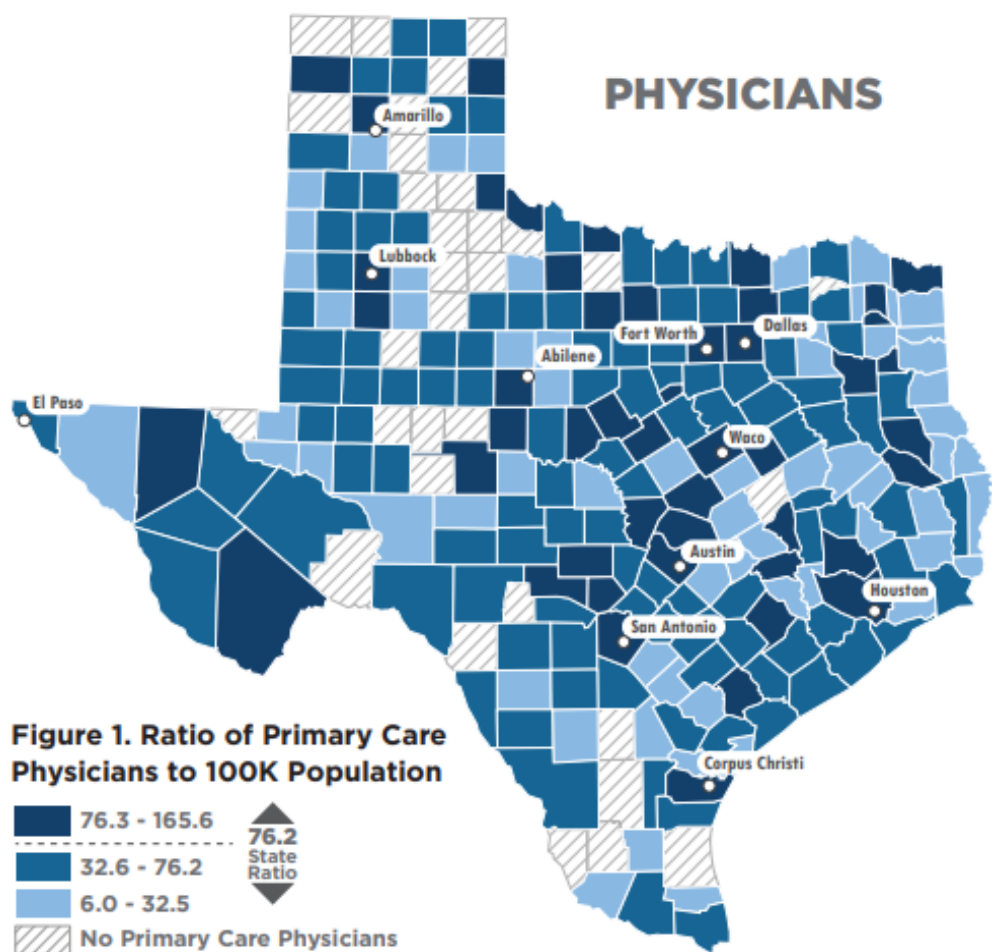

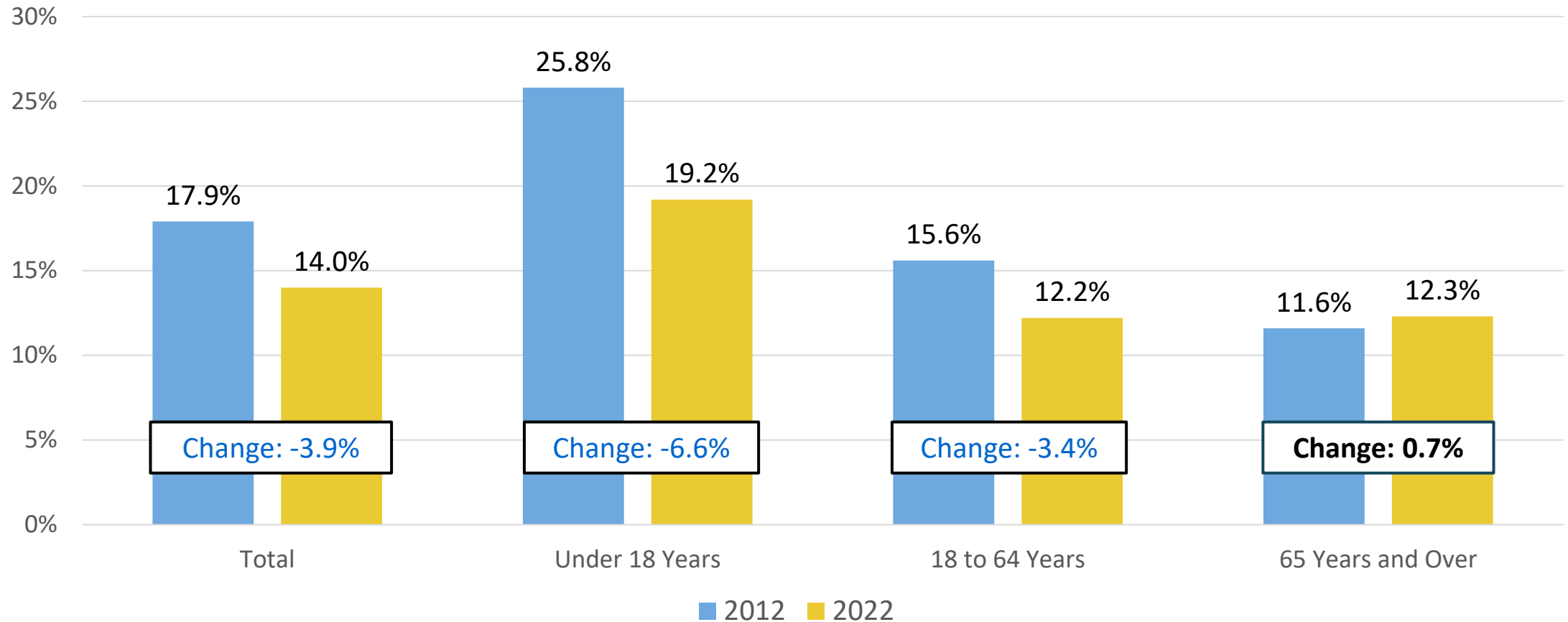
Diagnosed Diabetes - Total, Adults Aged 20+ Years, Age-Adjusted Percentage, Texas Counties, 2011 and 2021



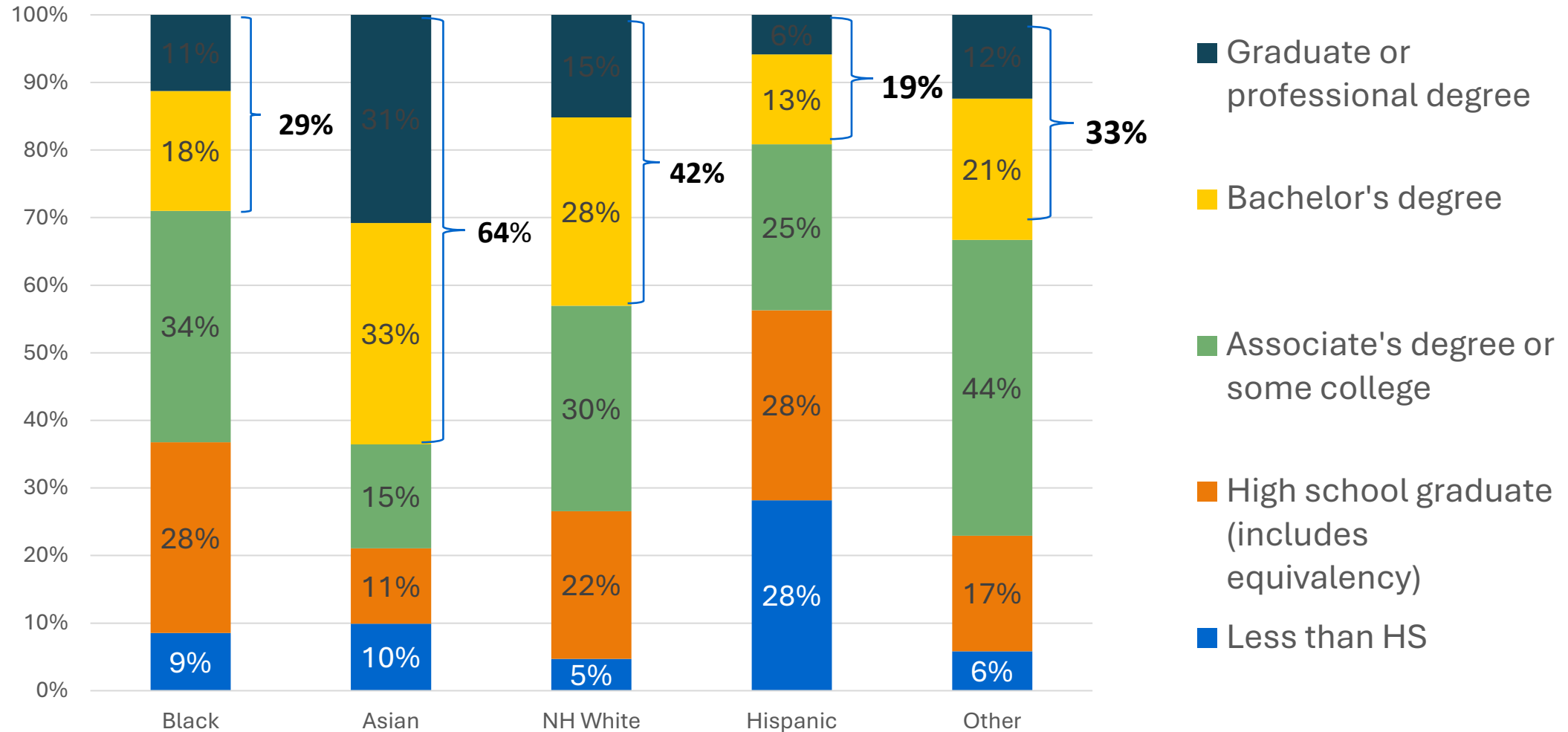

Poverty Rates by Age Groups in Texas

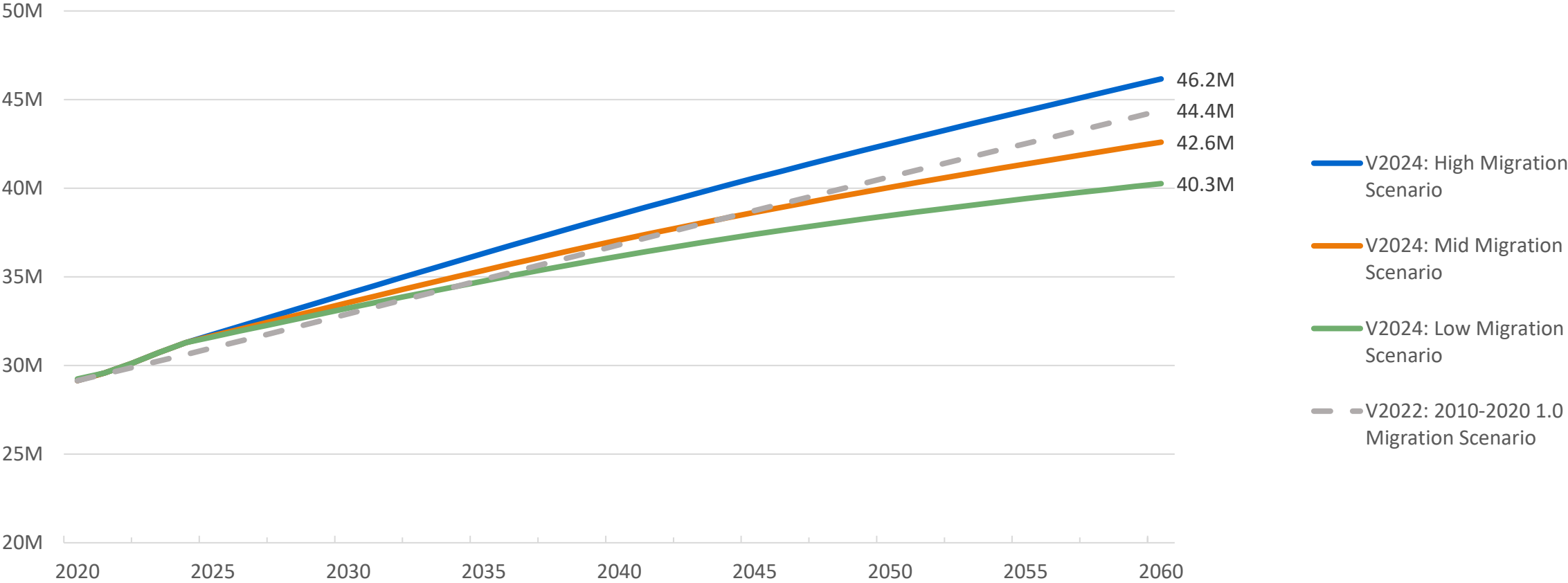


Percent Distribution of Levels of Educational Attainment Among Adults (aged 25+), Texas, 2022

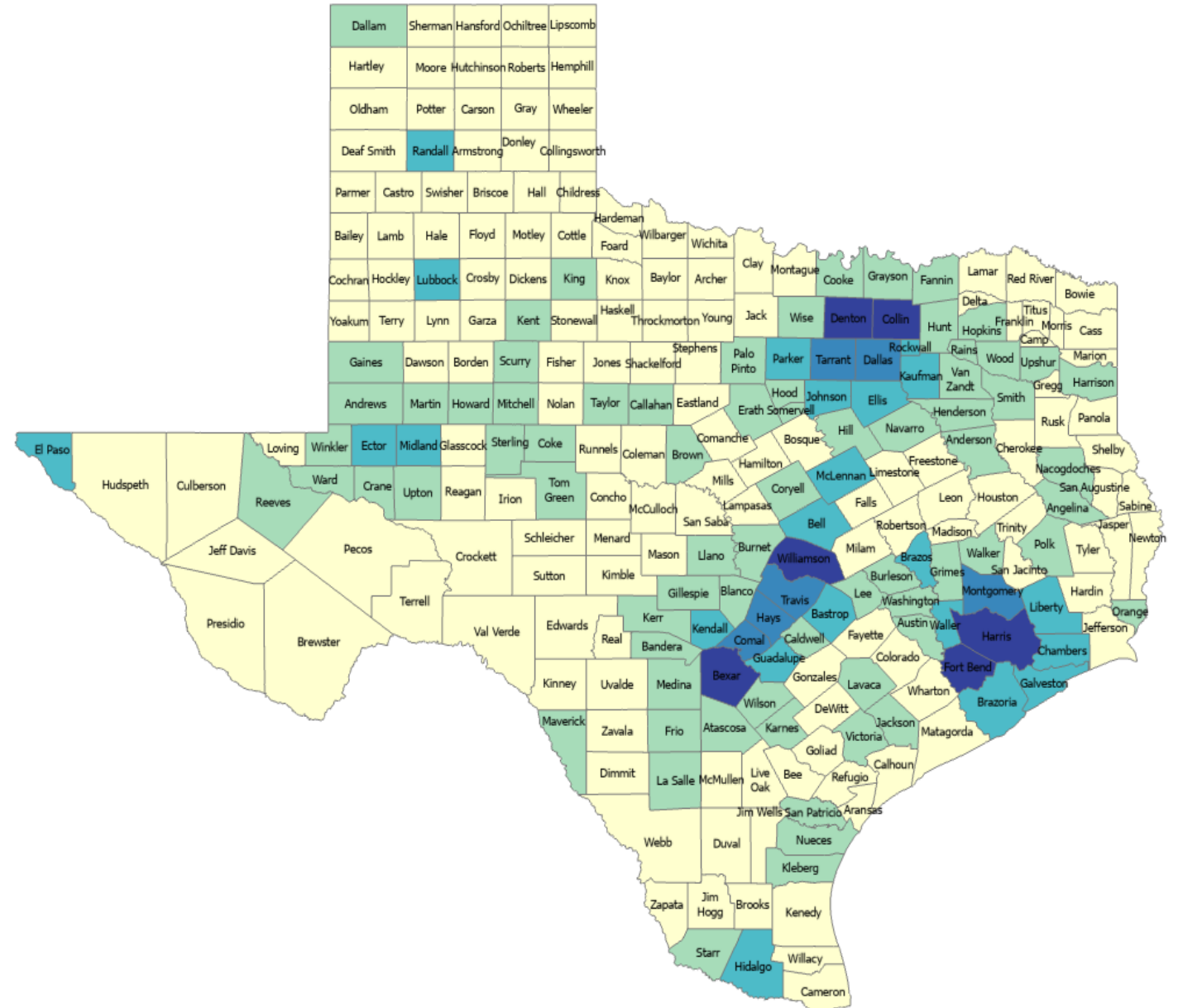
Projected Population Growth in Texas with Various Migration Scenarios

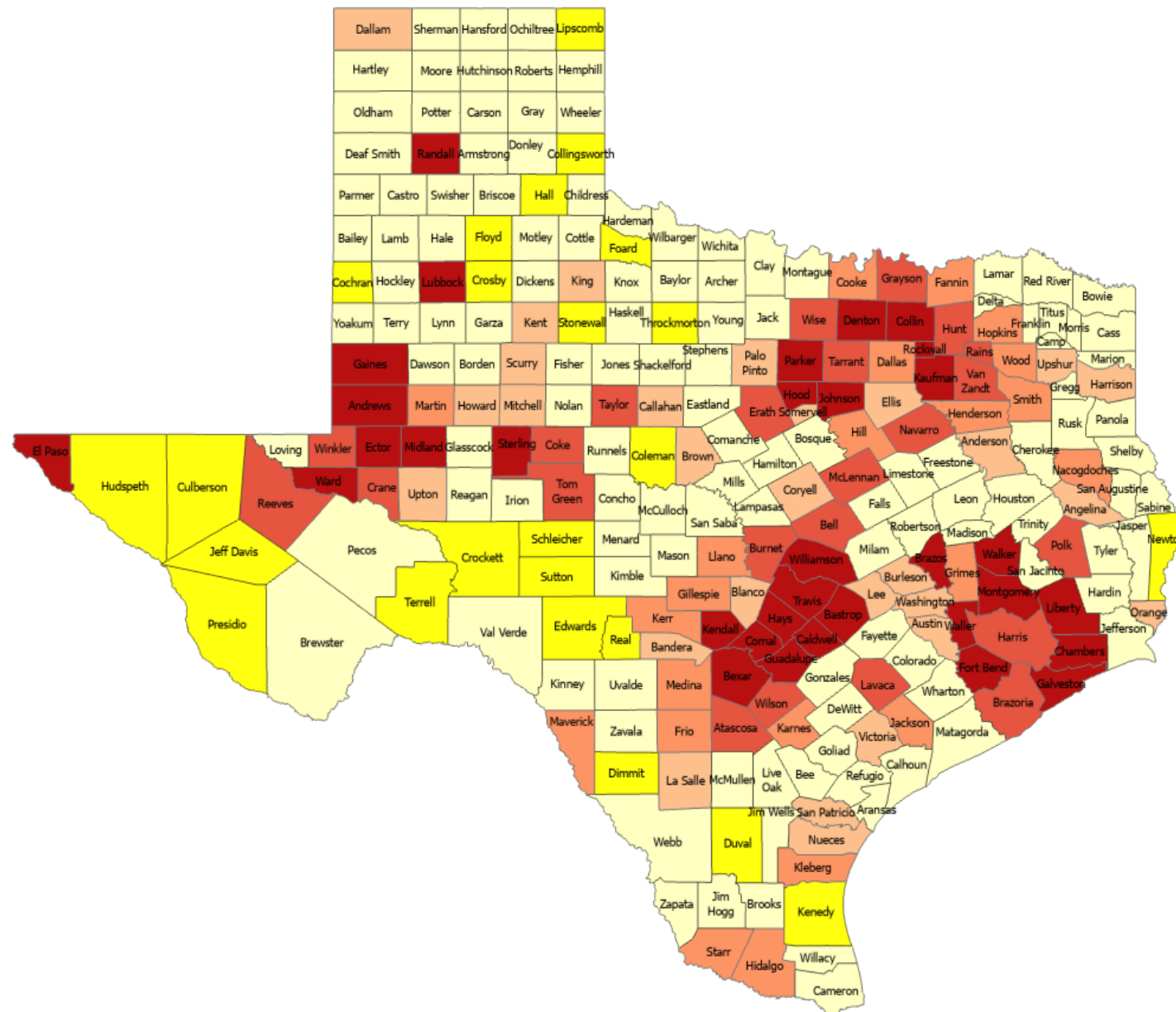
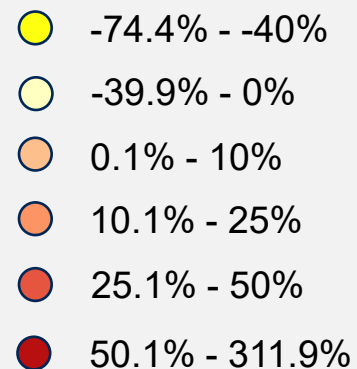
Projected Population Change, Texas Counties, 2020-2060

Projected Population Change 2020-2060

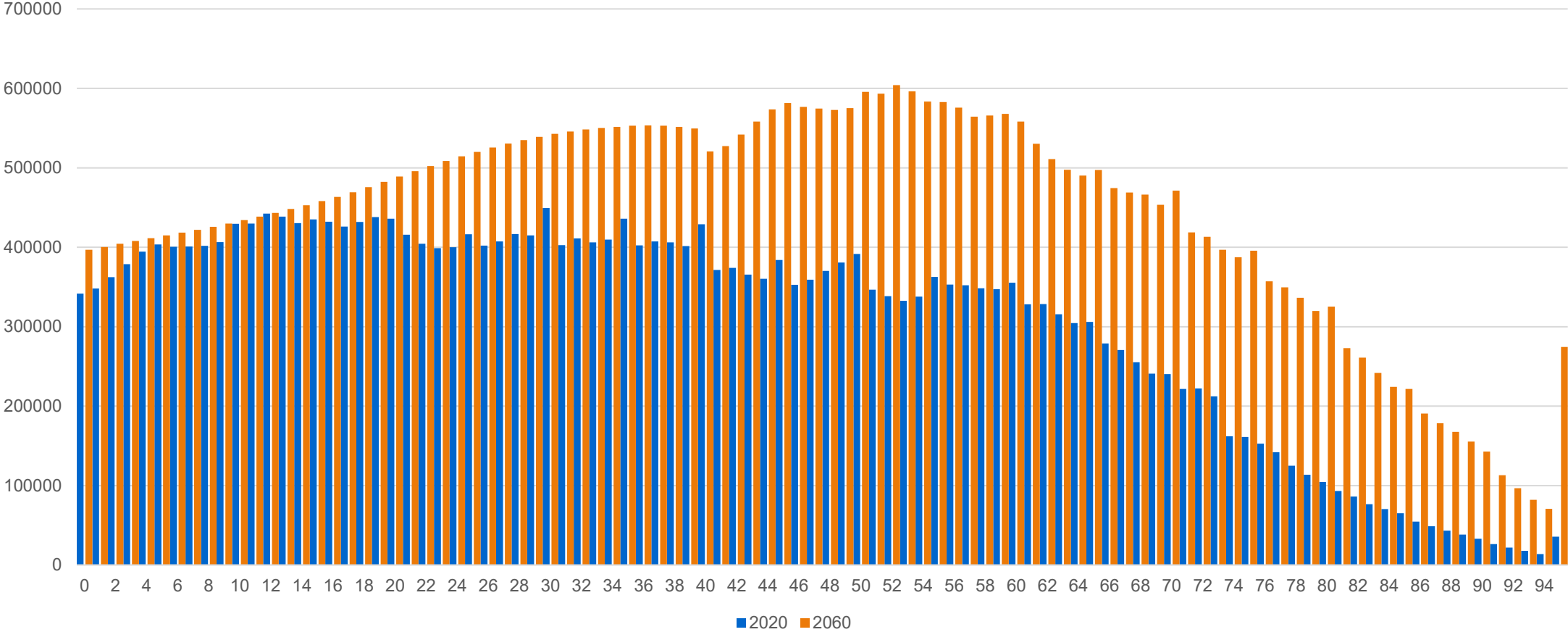


Projected Percent Population Change, Texas Counties, 2020-2060

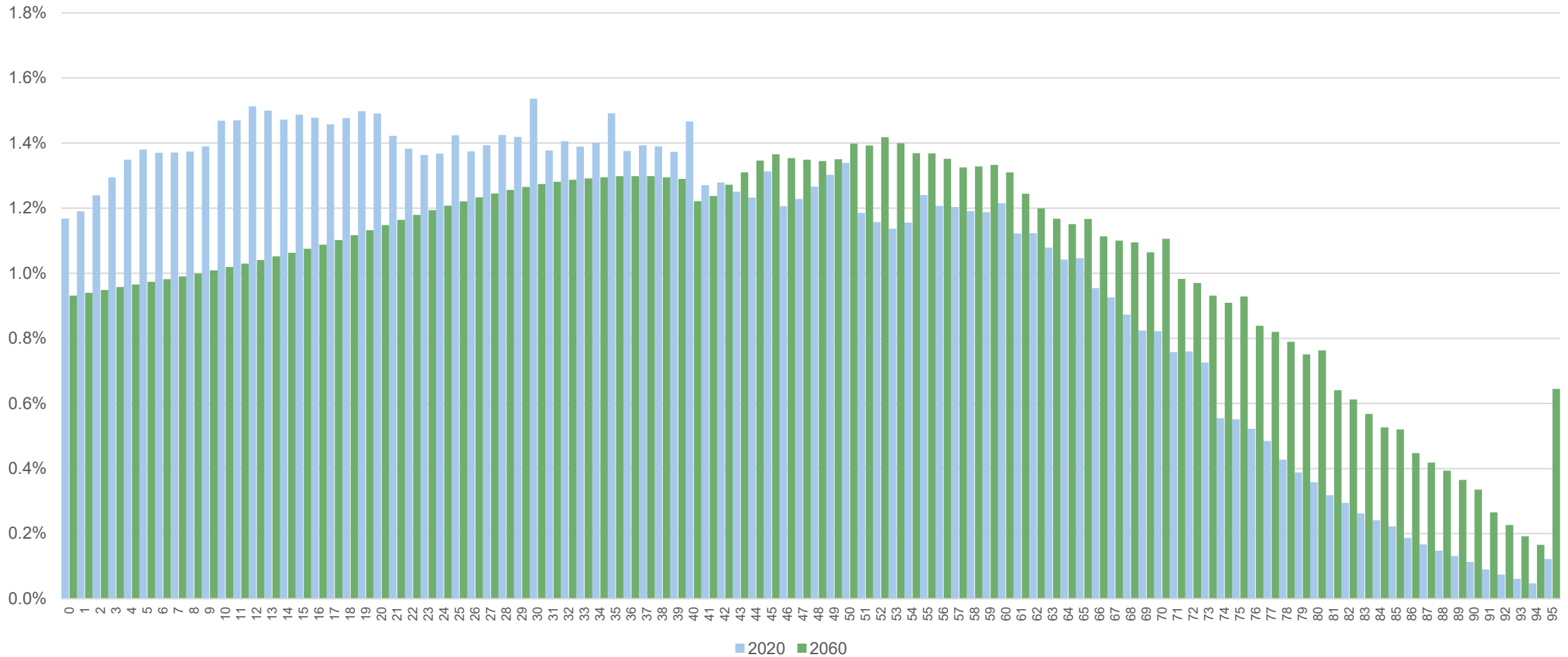
