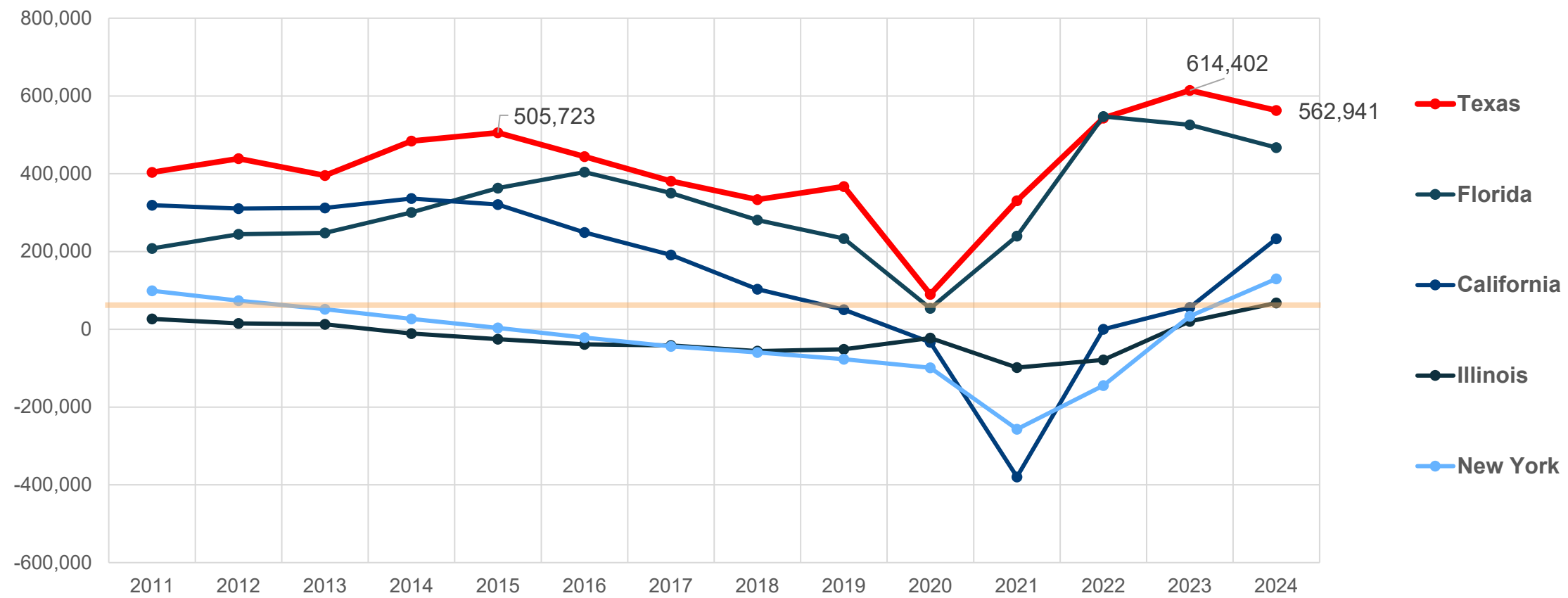

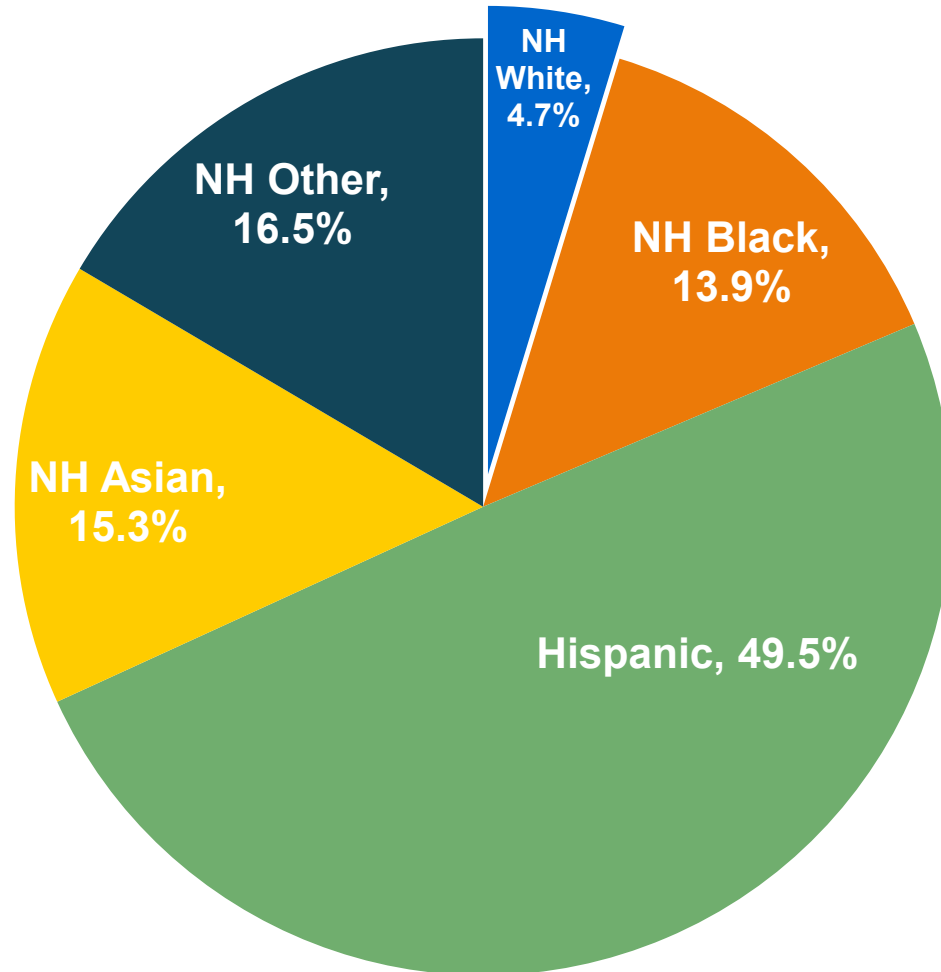


Estimated Annual Population Change for Large States, 2011-2024

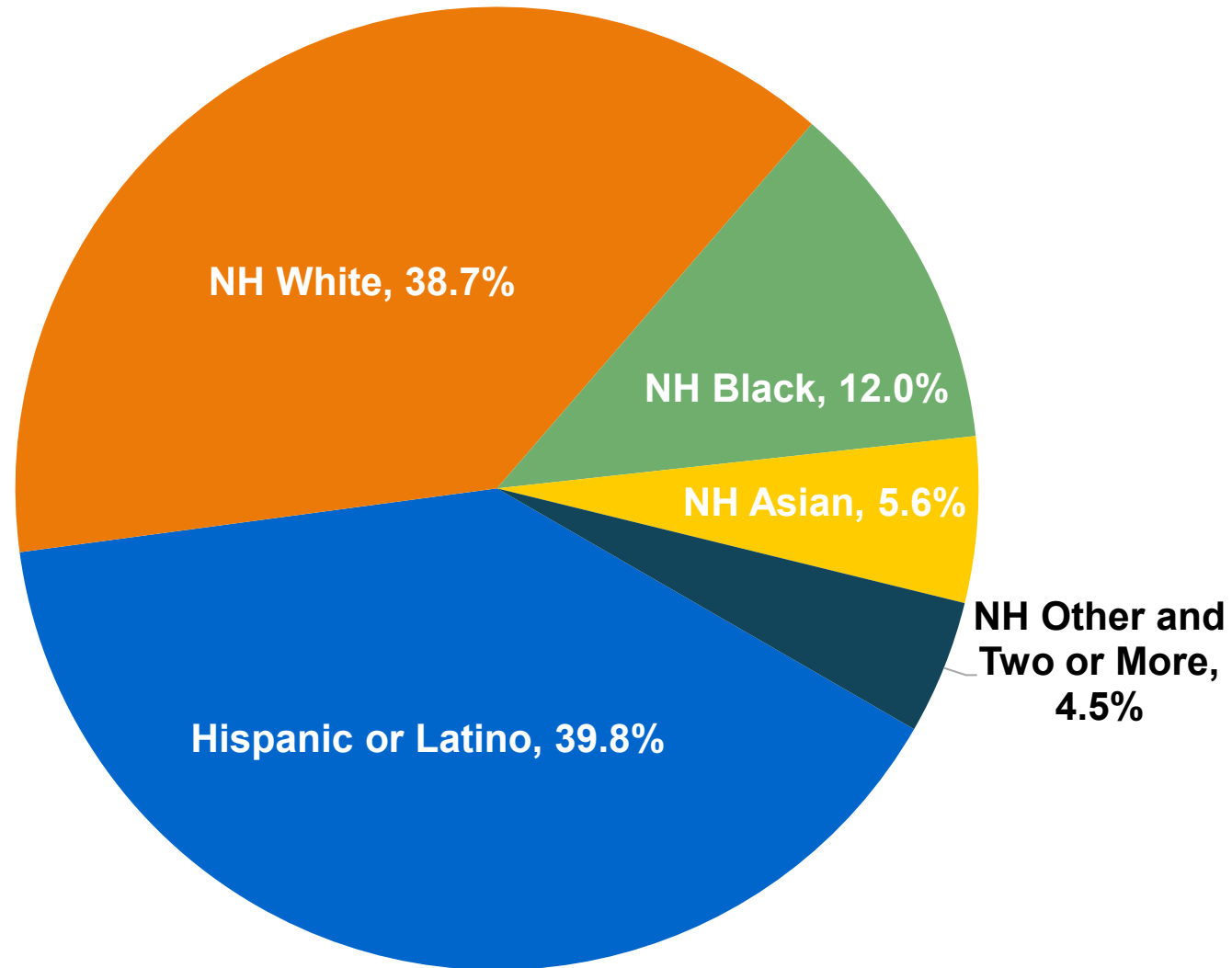

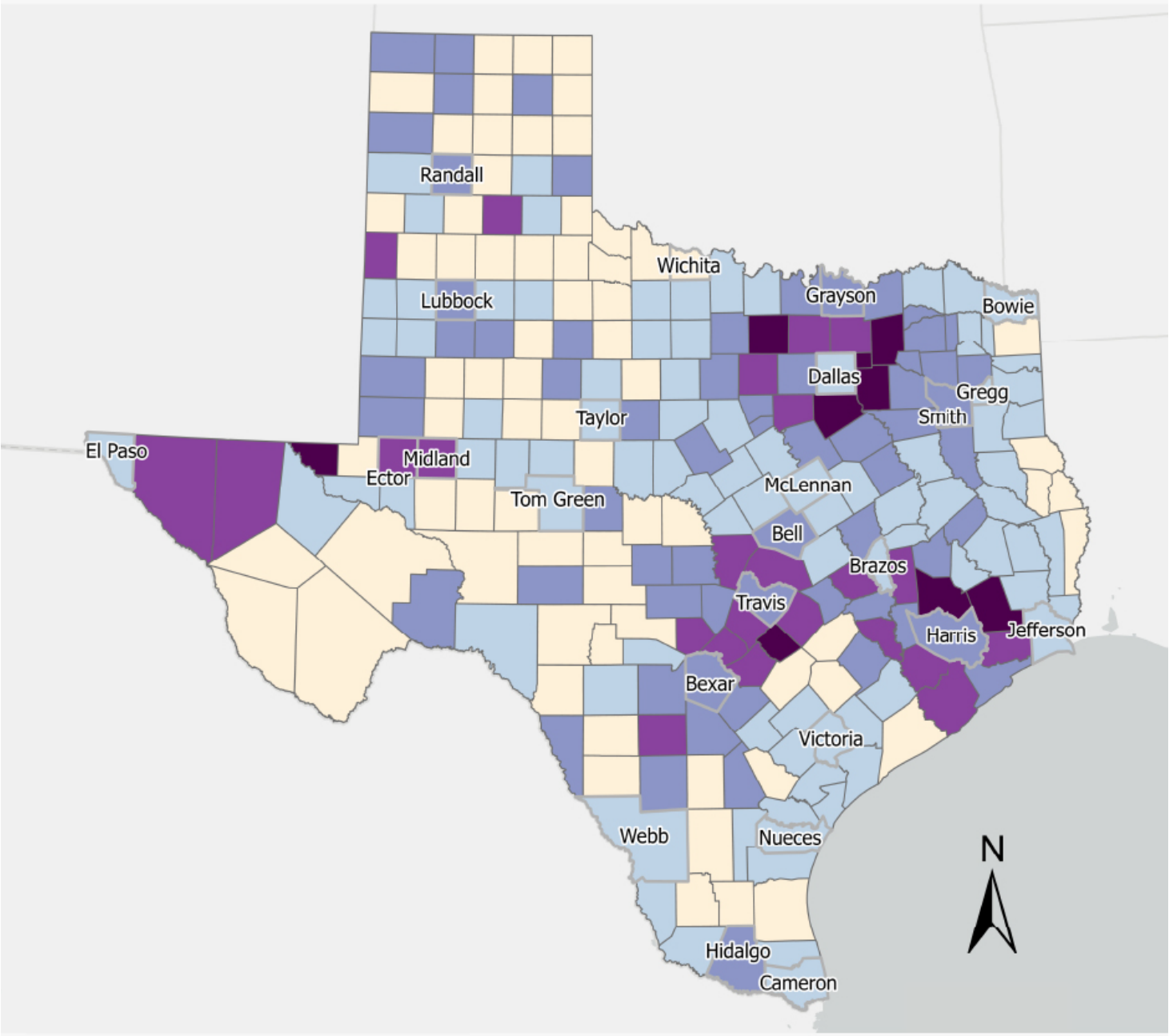

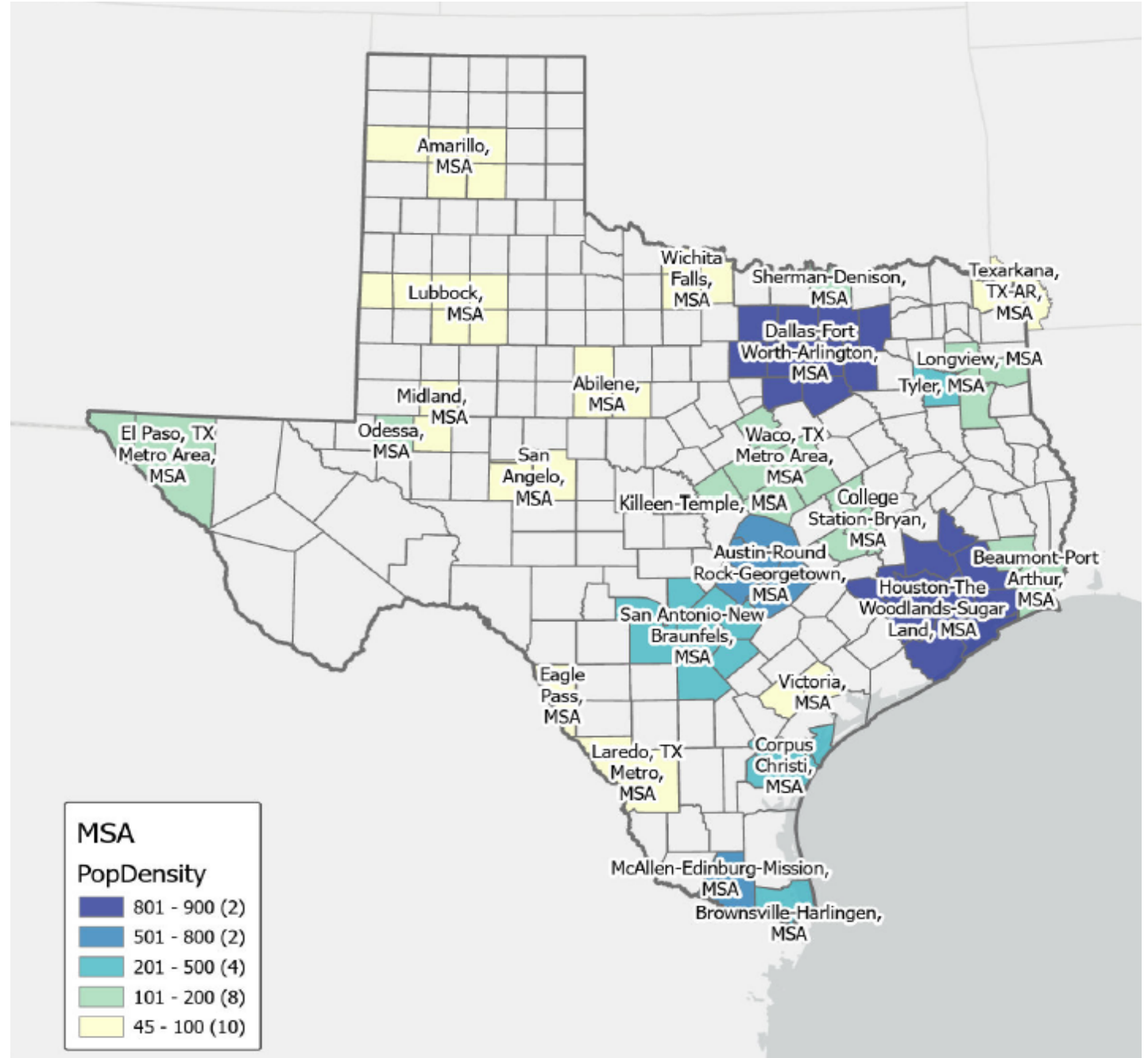

Estimated Percent Population Change, Texas Counties, 2023-2024

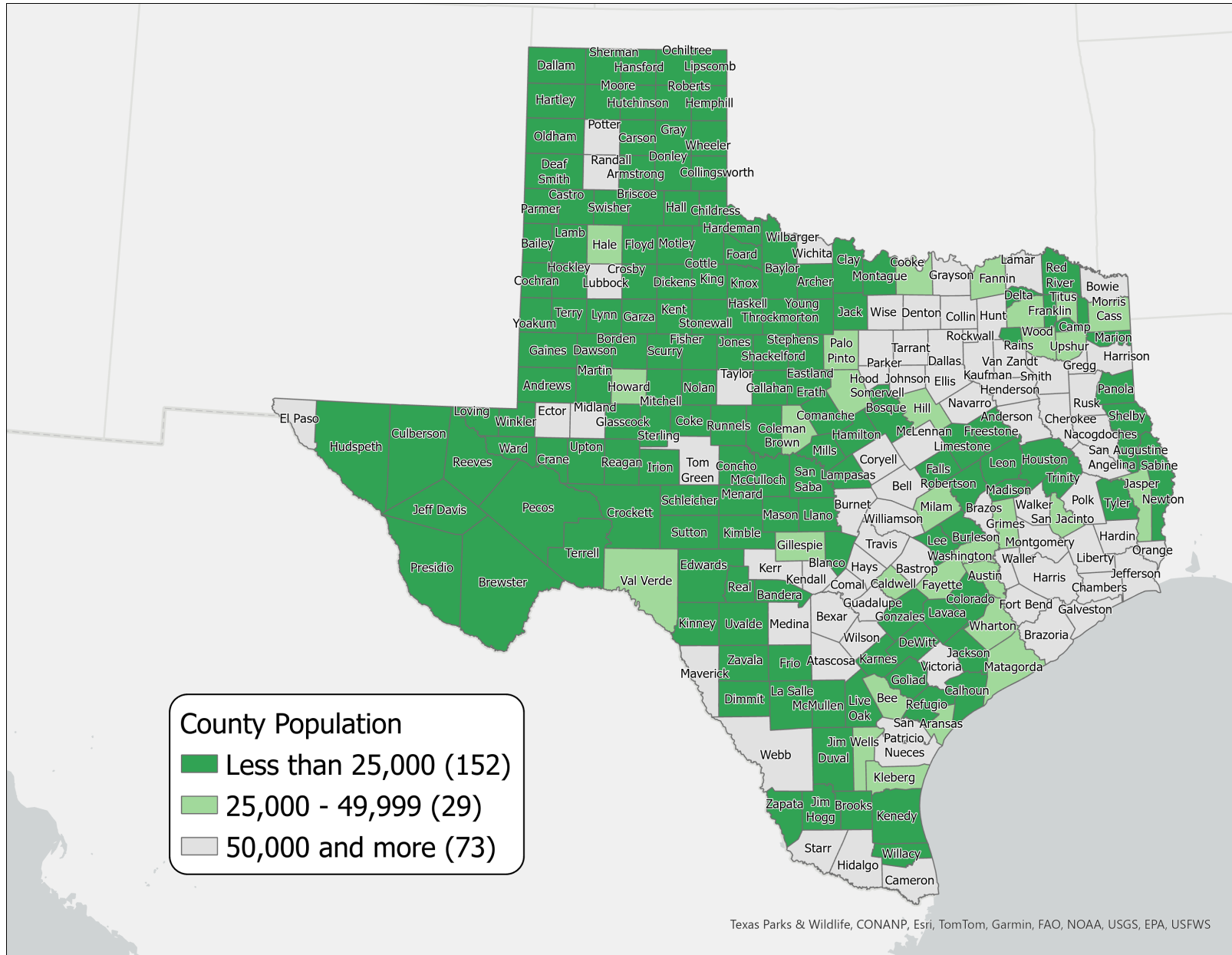


Population Density in Texas, Metropolitan Statistical Area 2023

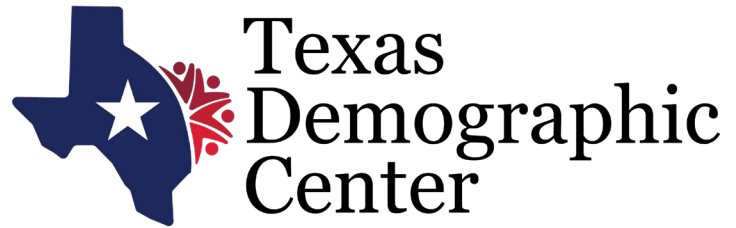

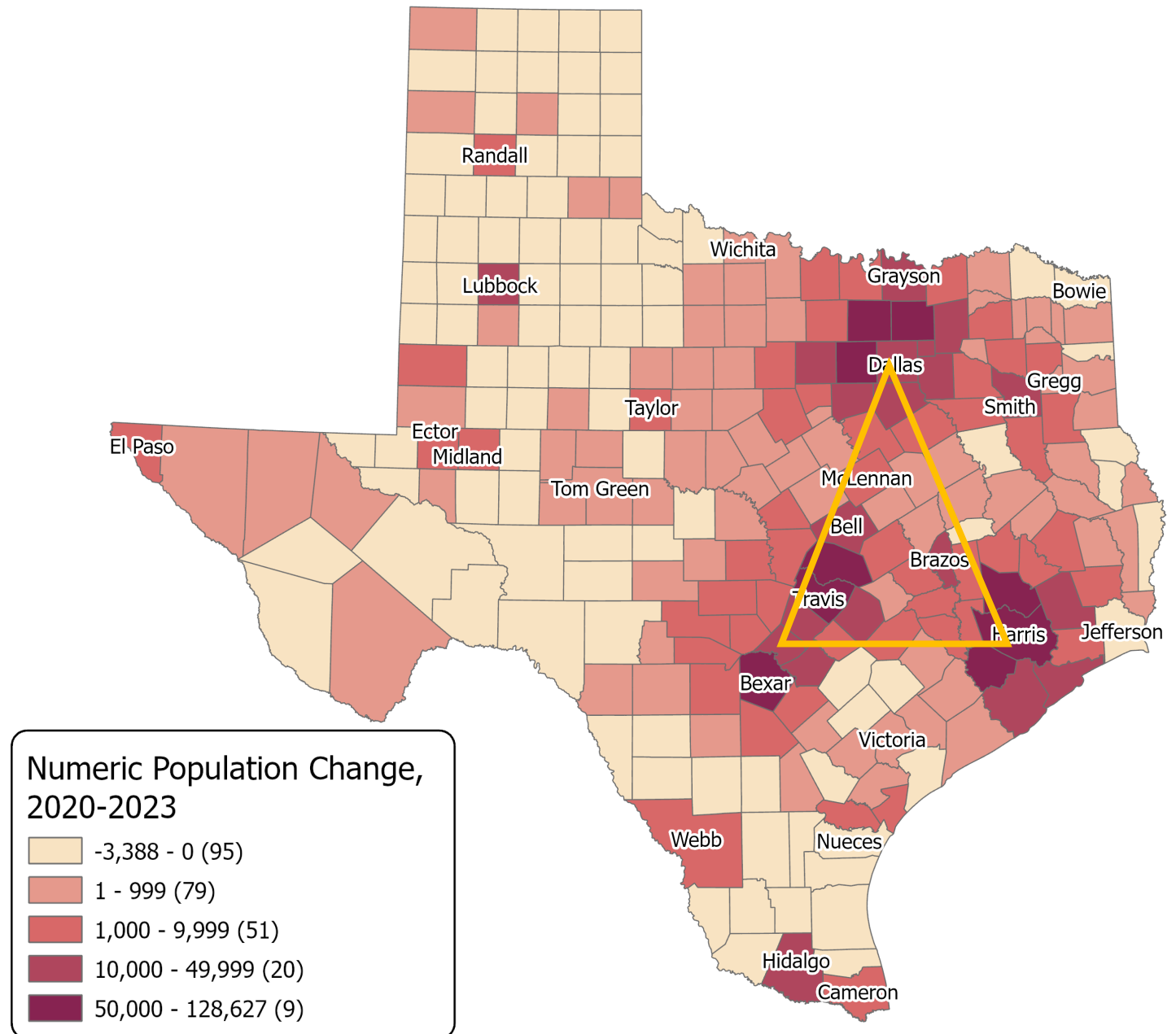

- Most population growth is observed in large metropolitan areas.

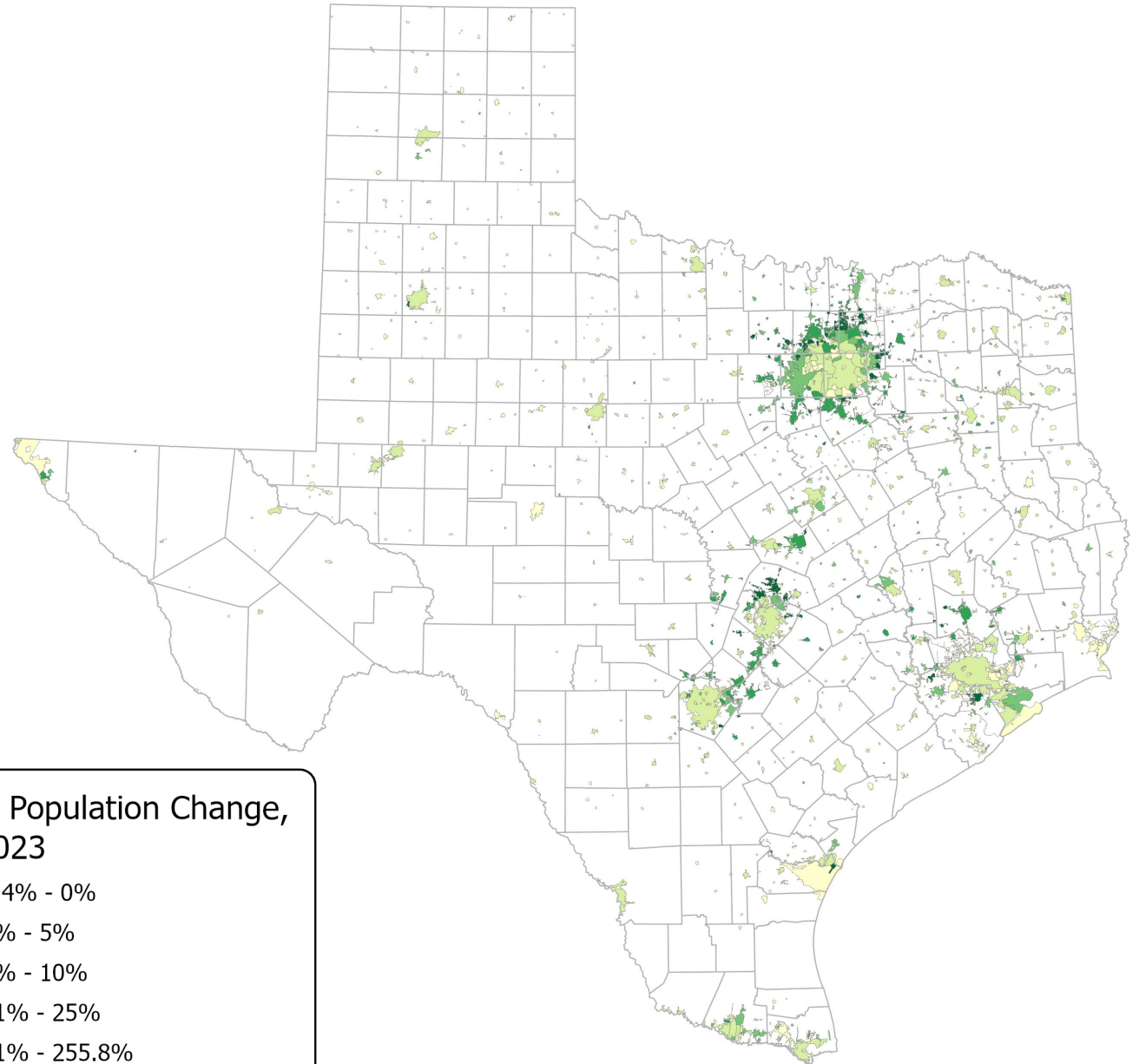
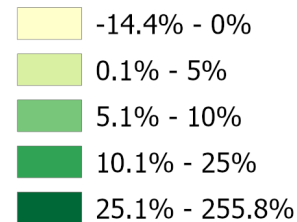


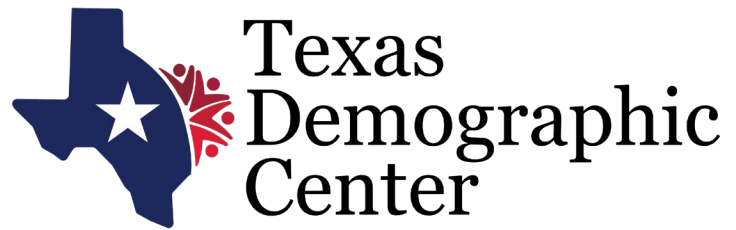

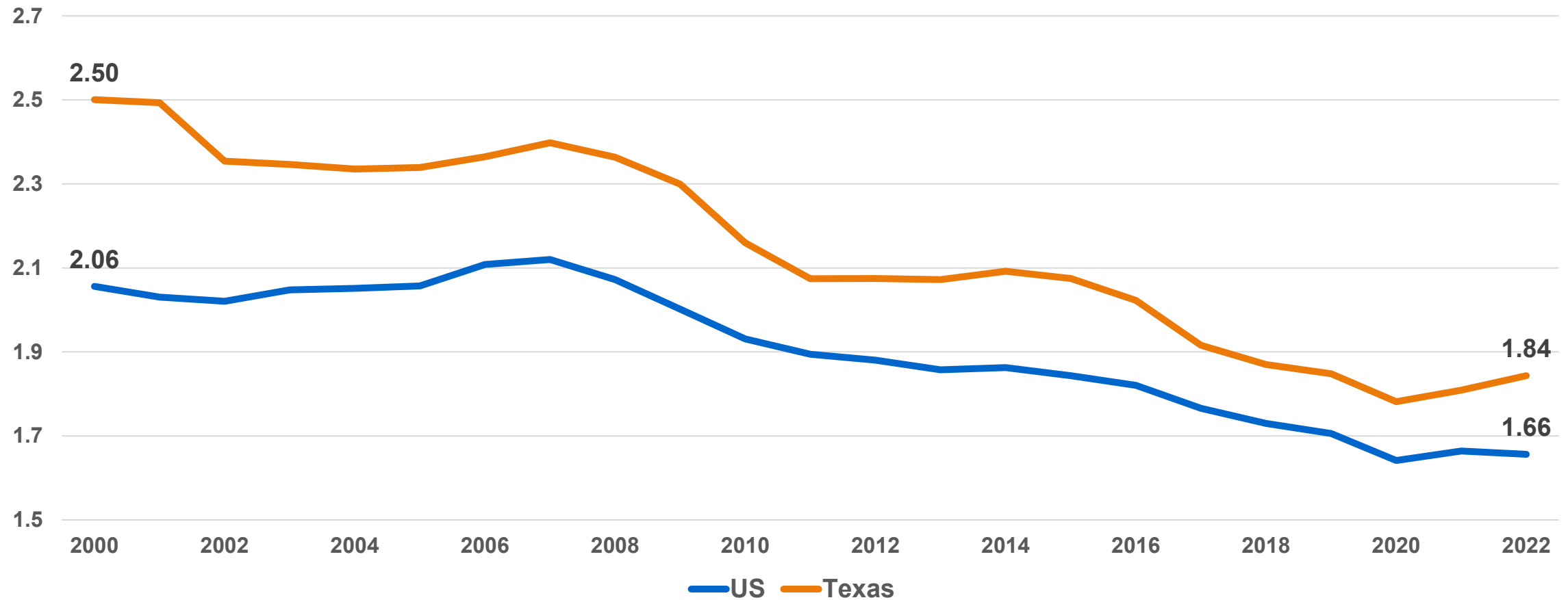

Total Fertility Rate Trends of the U.S. and Texas, 2000-2022

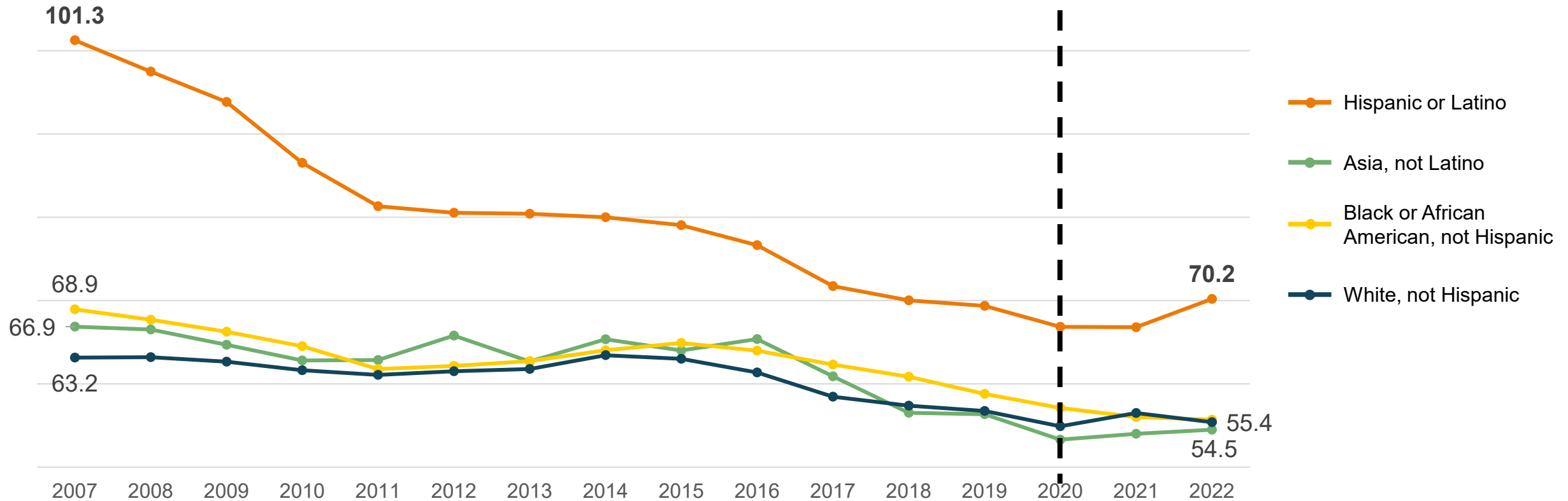

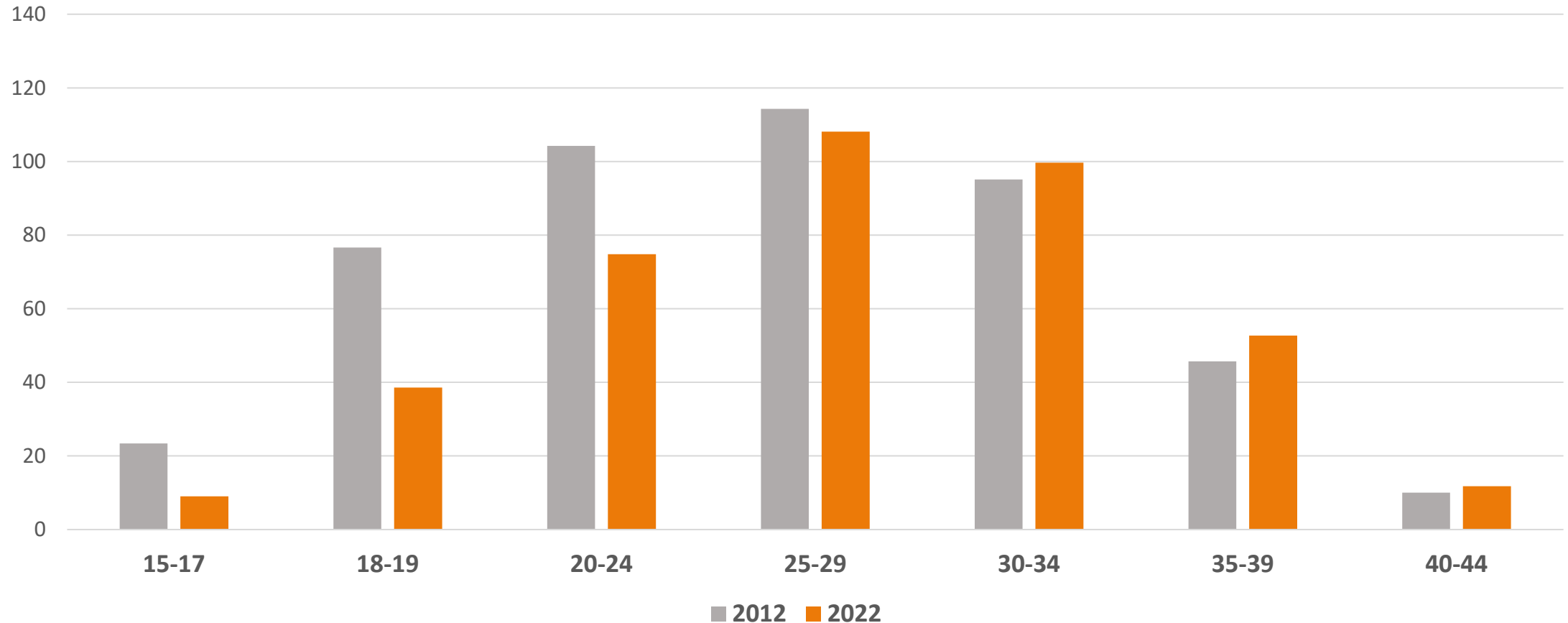
Texas Birth Rates, 2007-2022

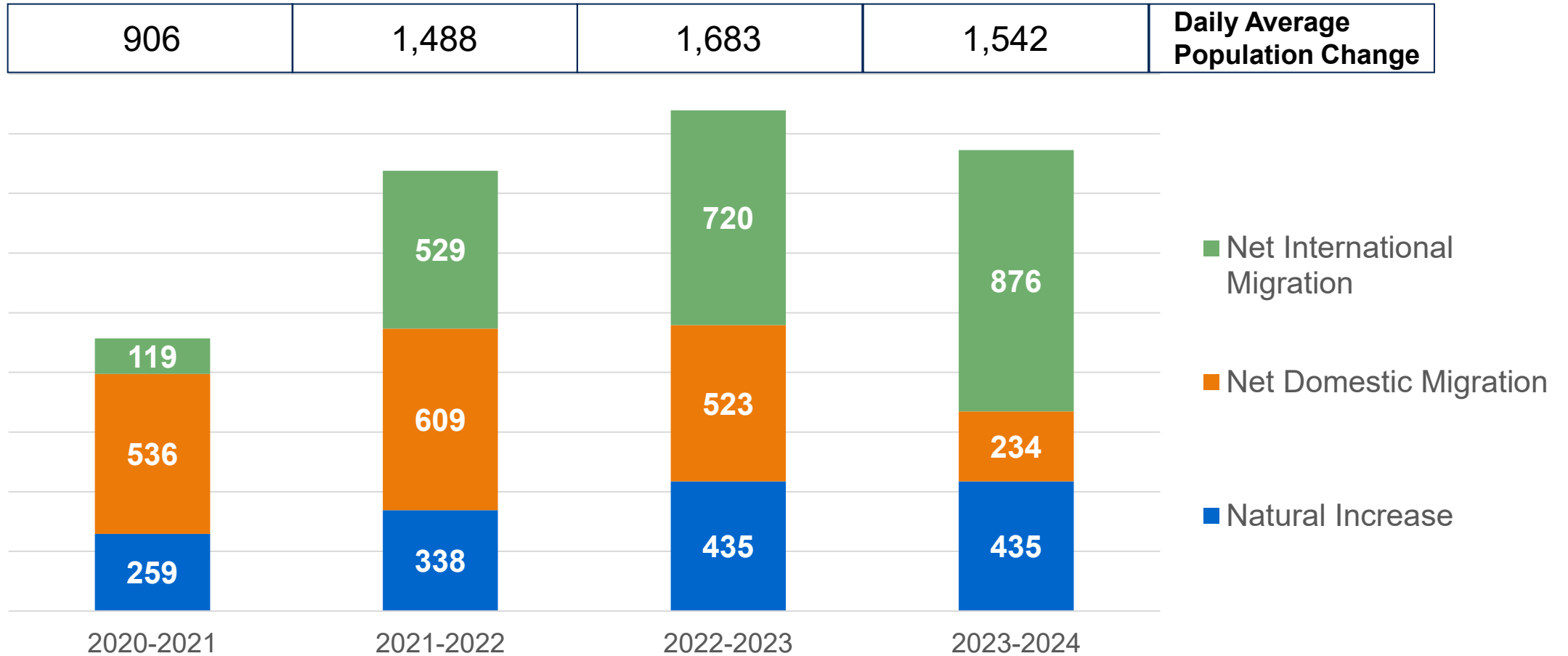
Texas Birth Rates by Age Group of Mothers, 2012, 2022



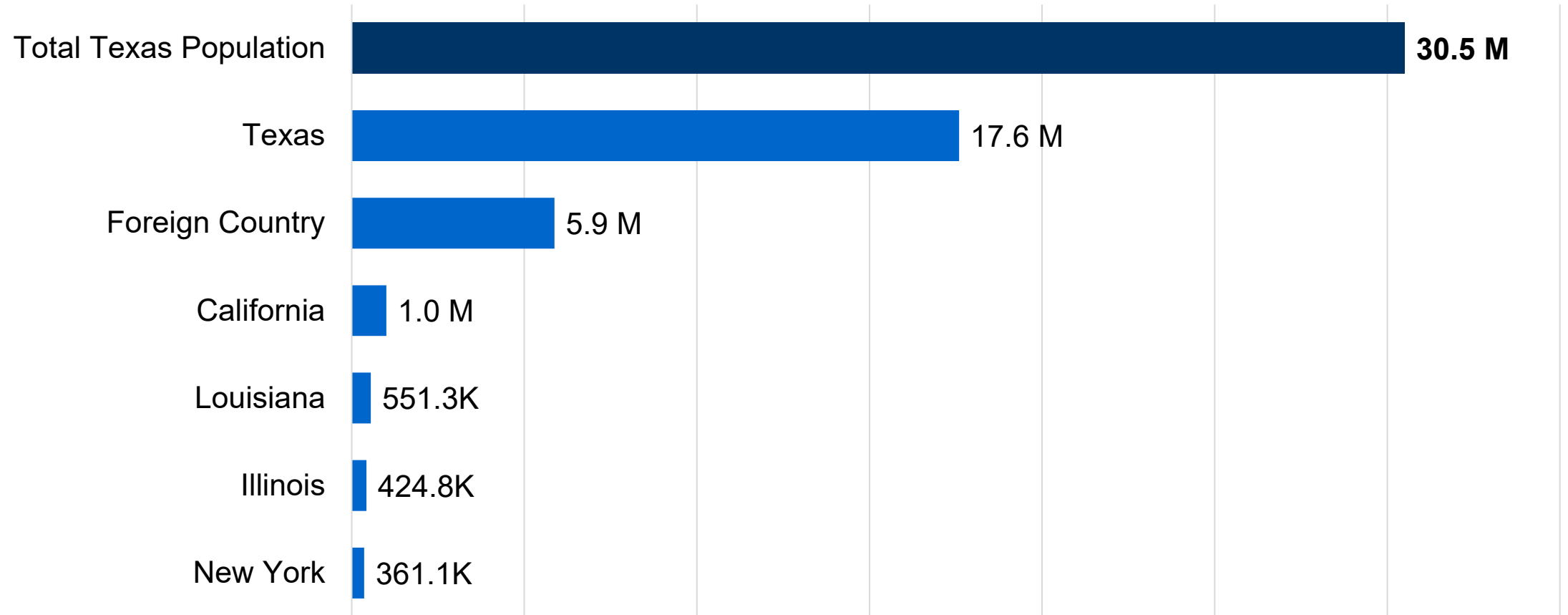

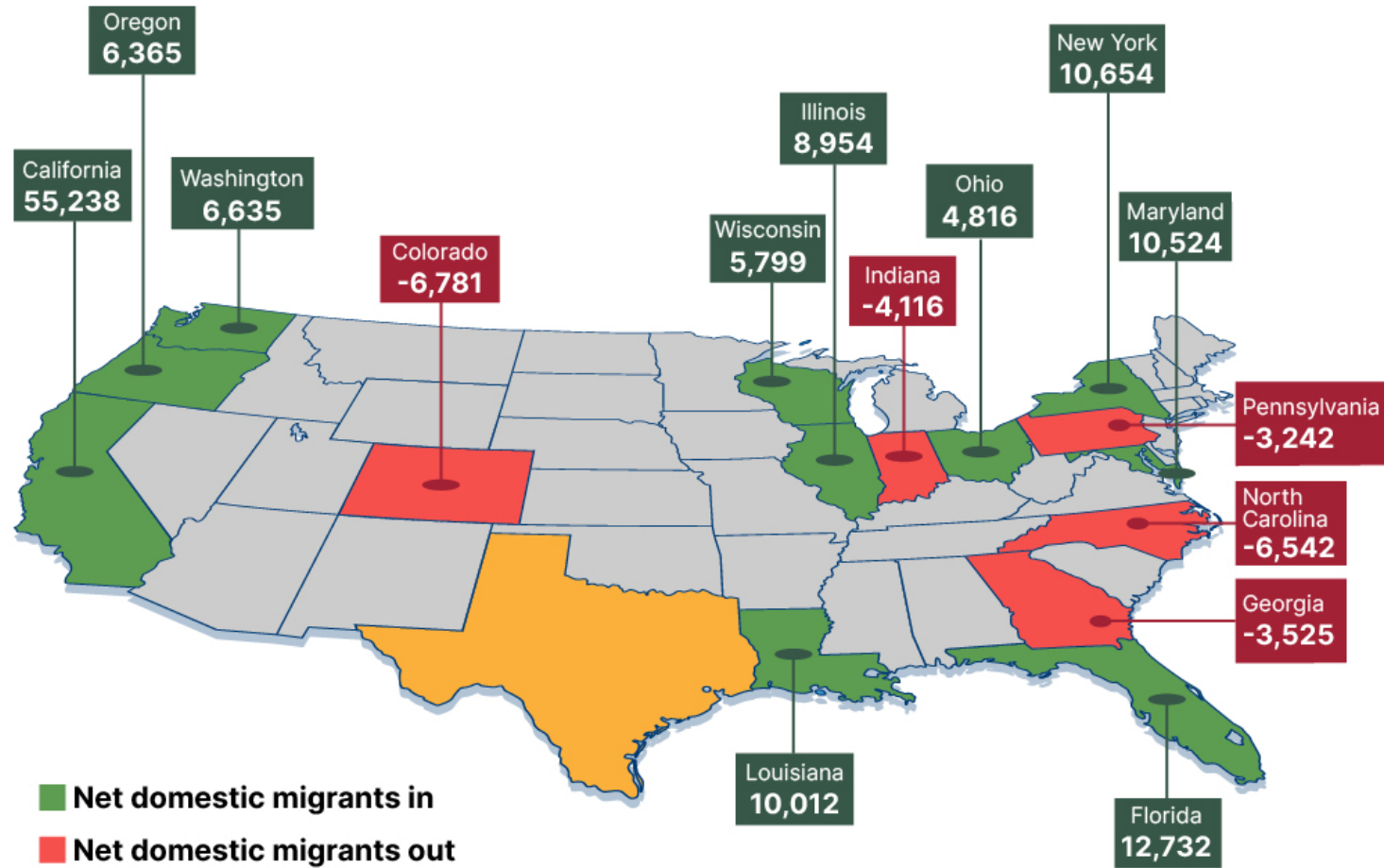
Texas Daily Population Growth and Components of Change 2020-2024

Texas State-to-State Net Domestic Migration, 2023

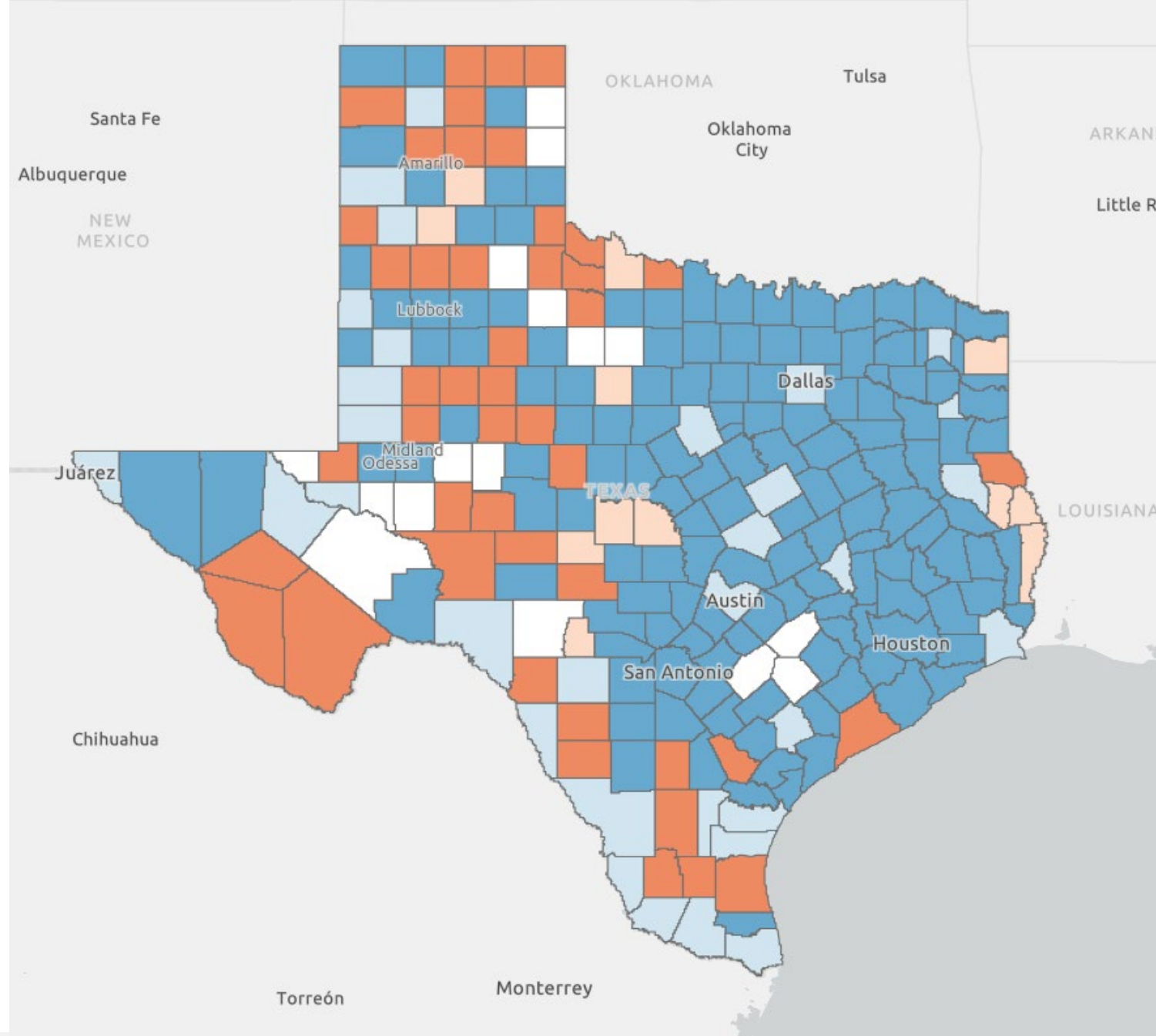


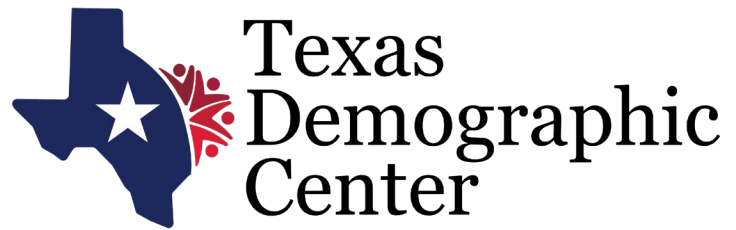

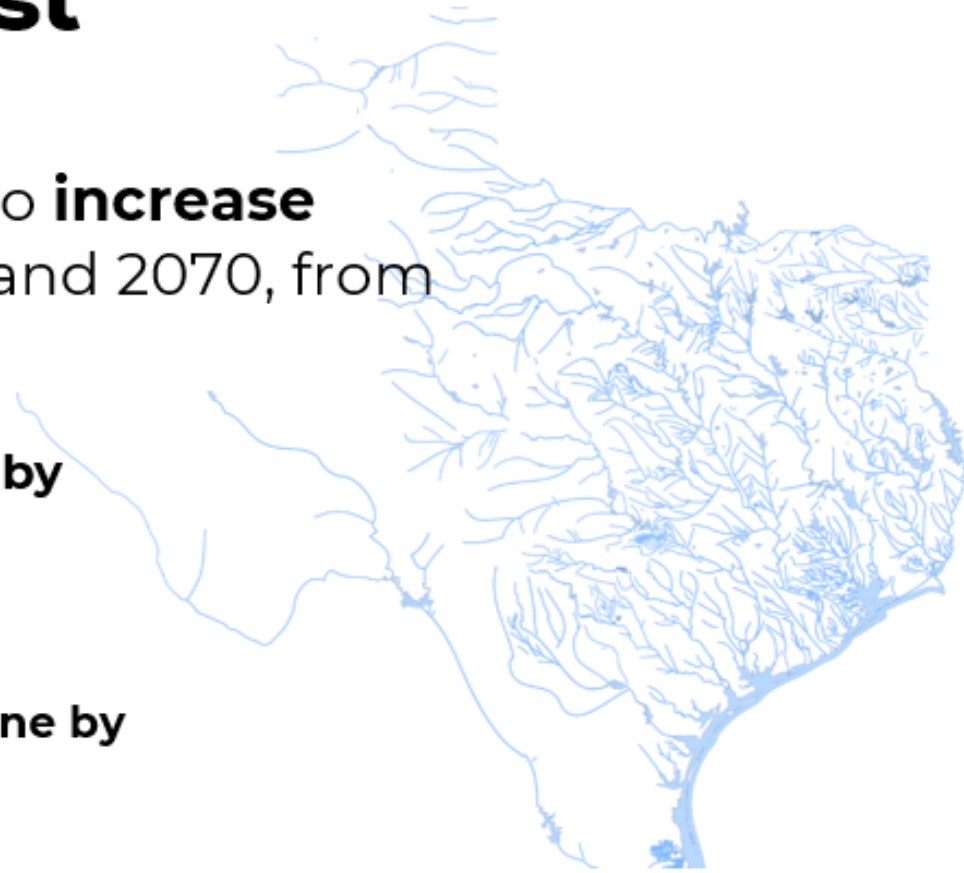


Texas Water Forecast

Water demands are projected to **increase by approximately 17%**

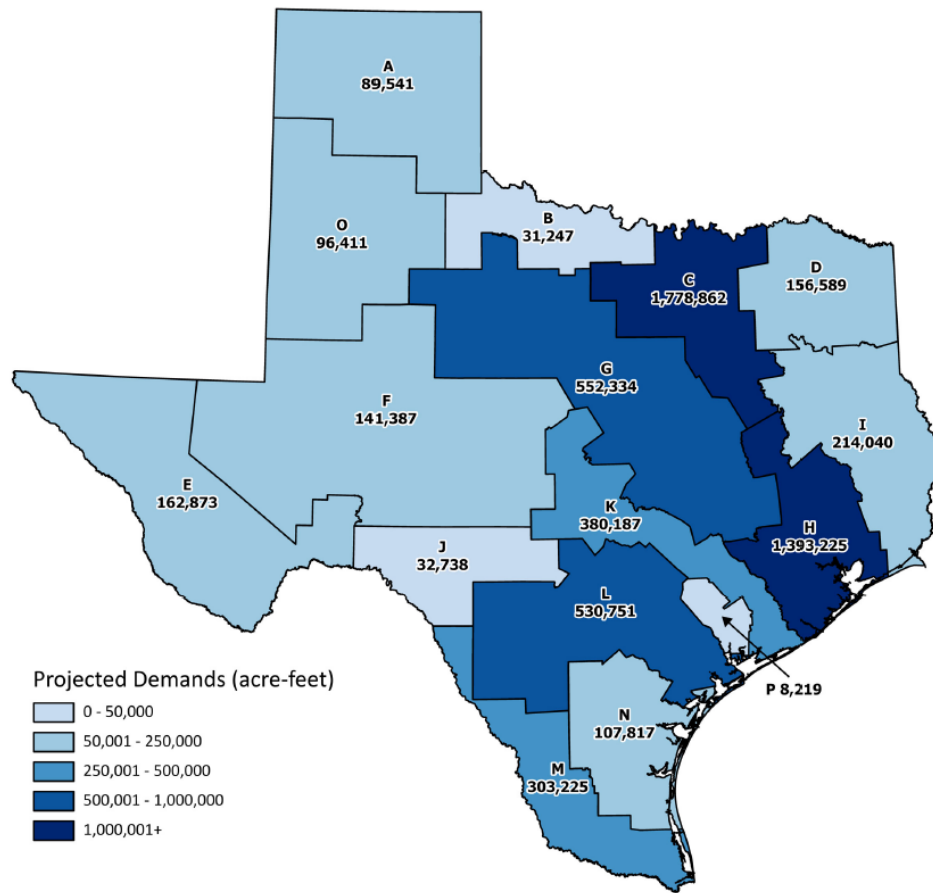
Existing water supplies are expected to **decline by approximately 18%**



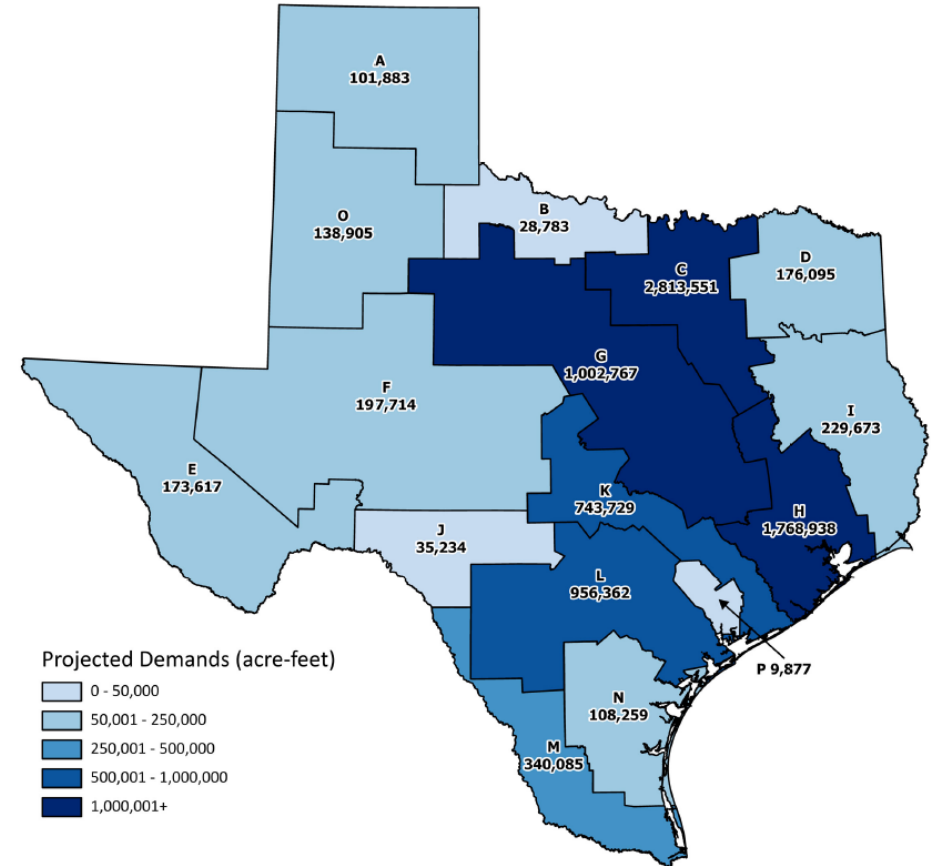

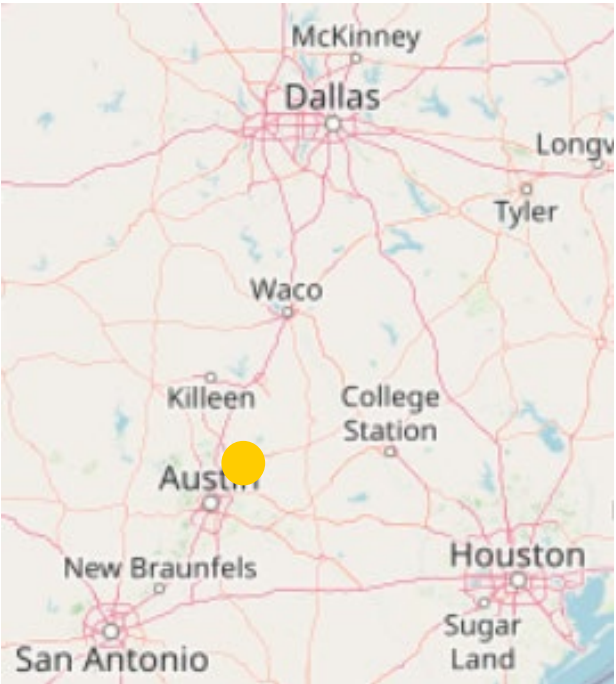

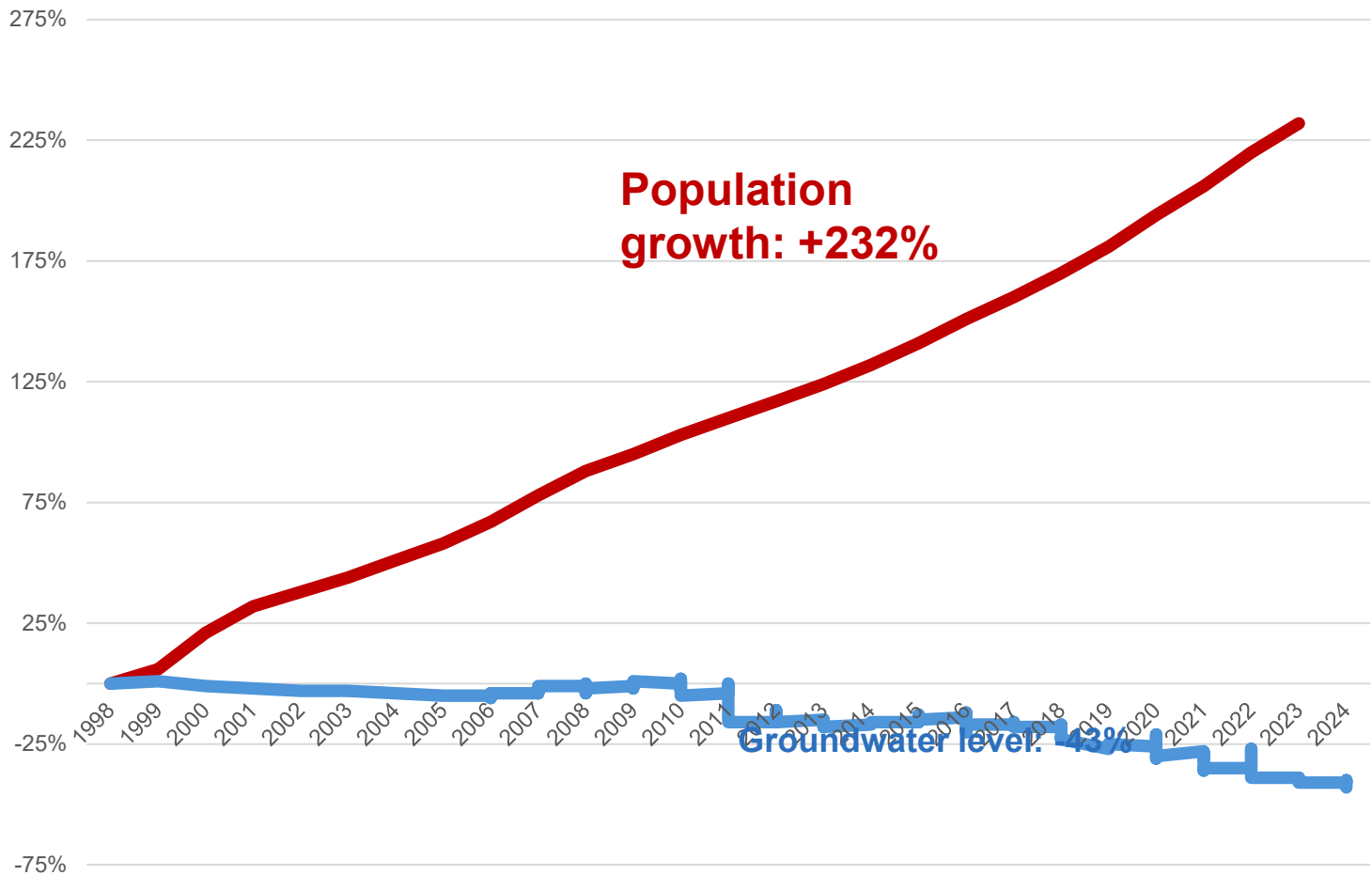

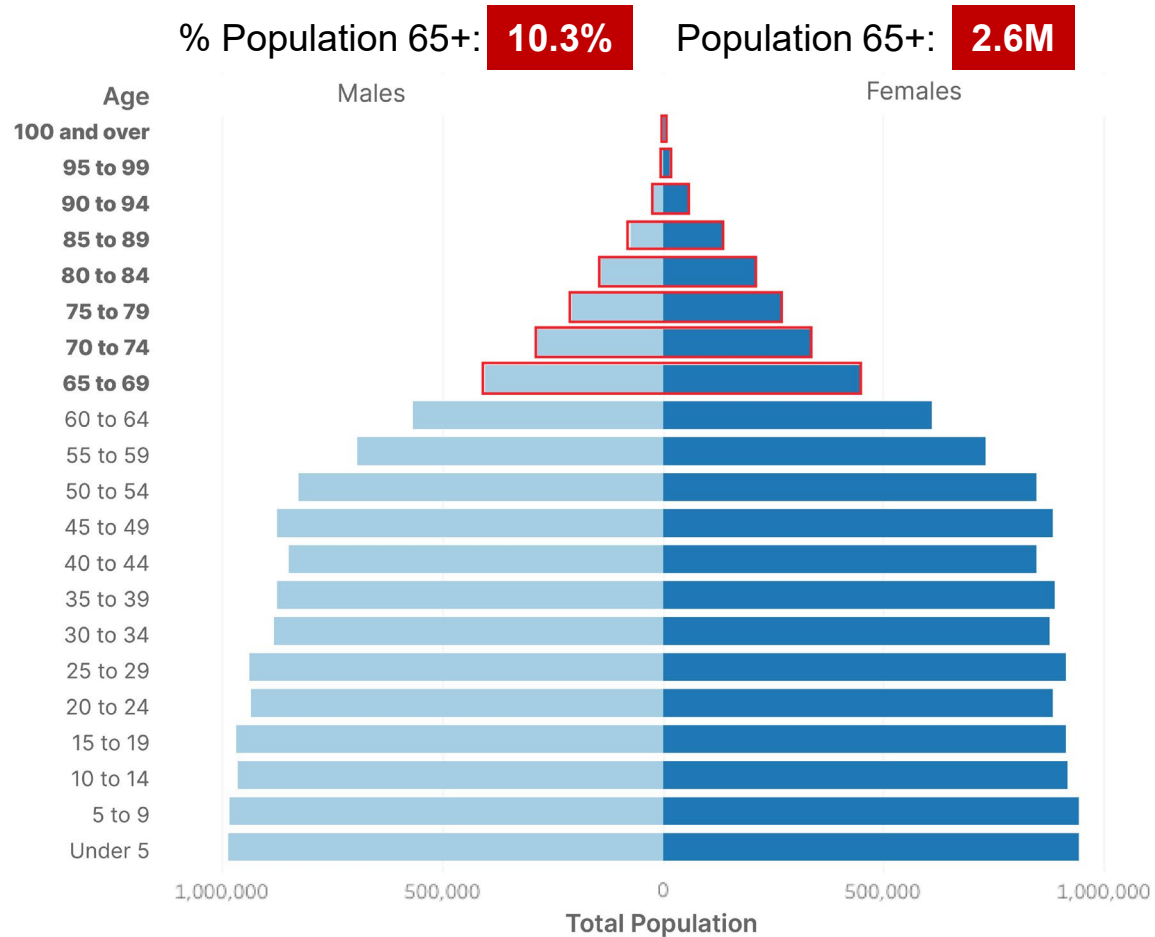
Williamson County Population Growth vs Aquifer Decline

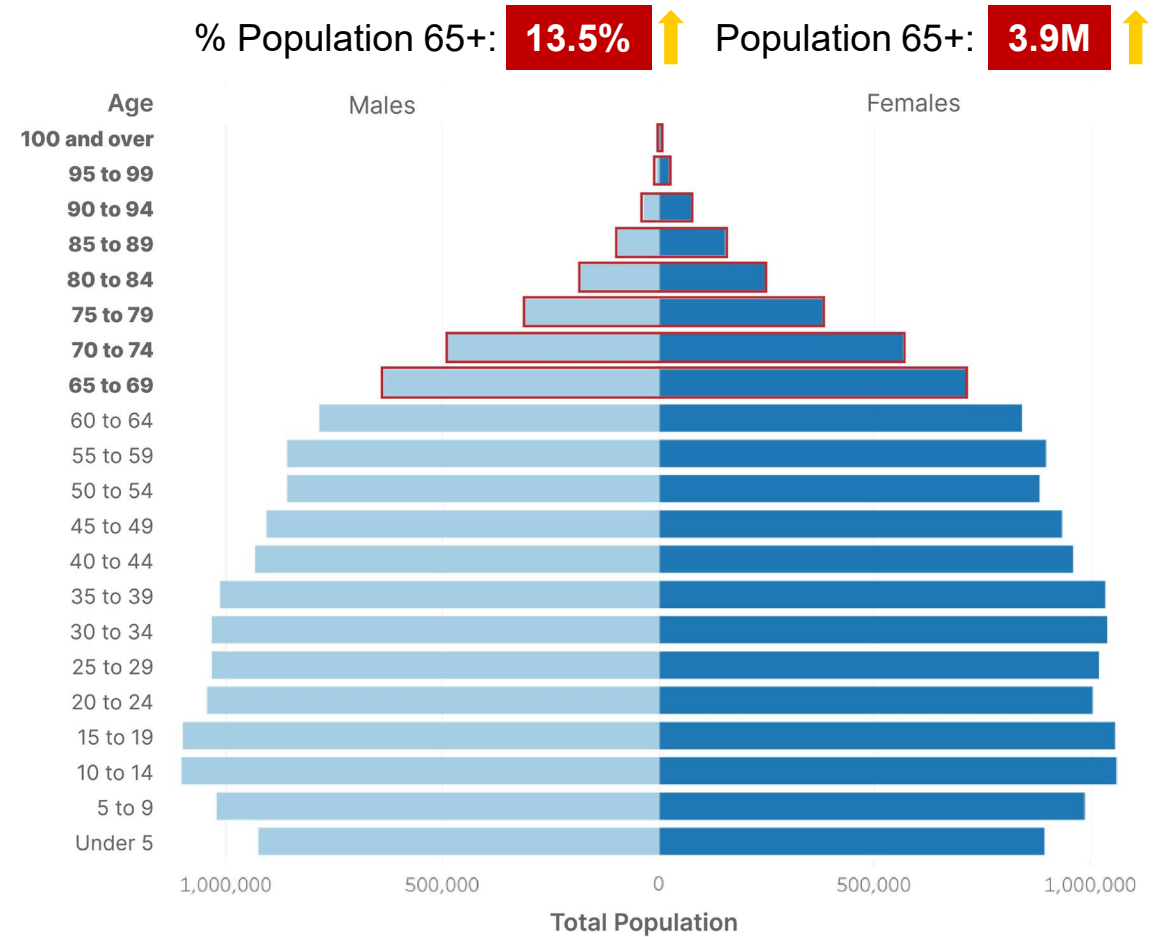
Texas Population Pyramid

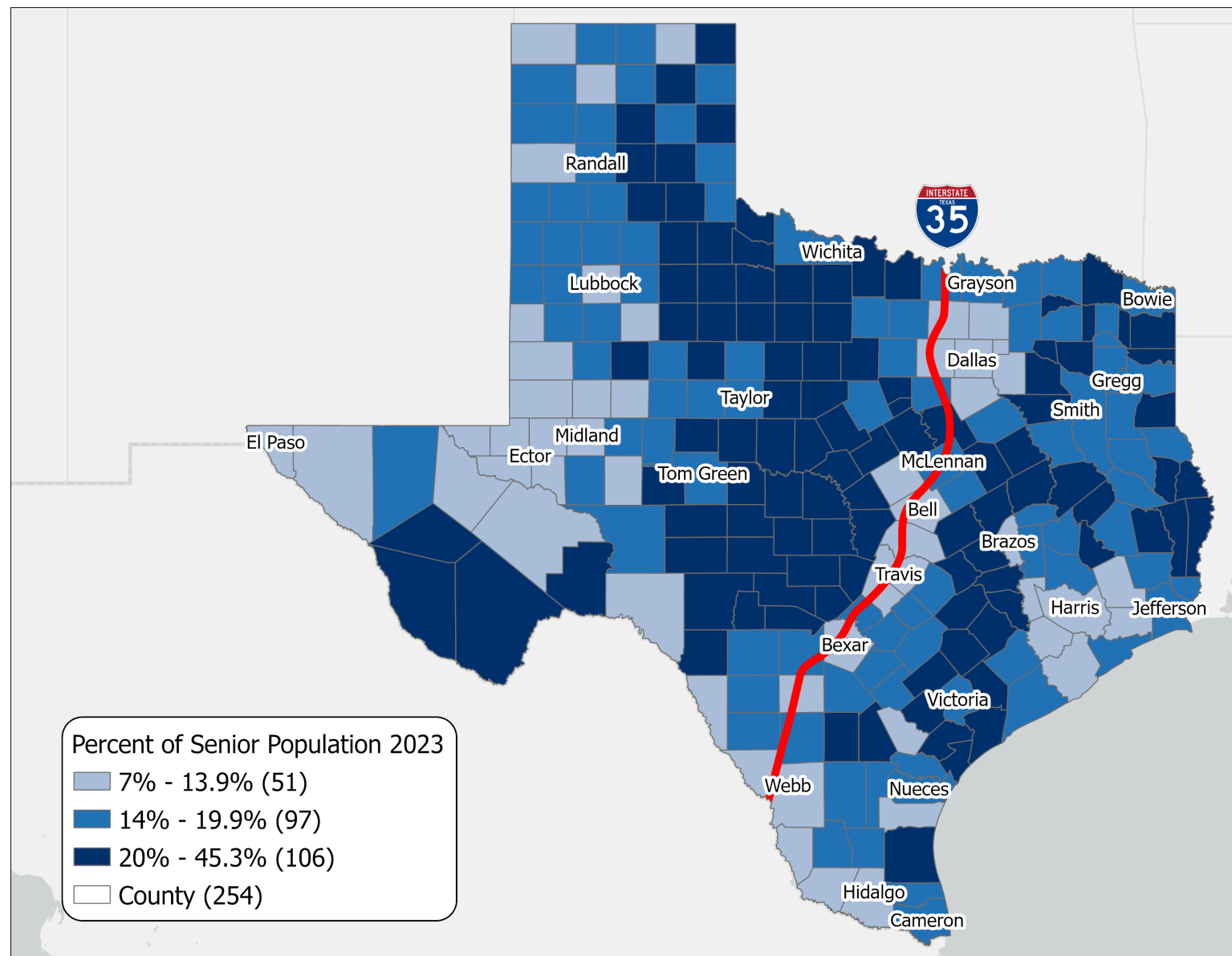

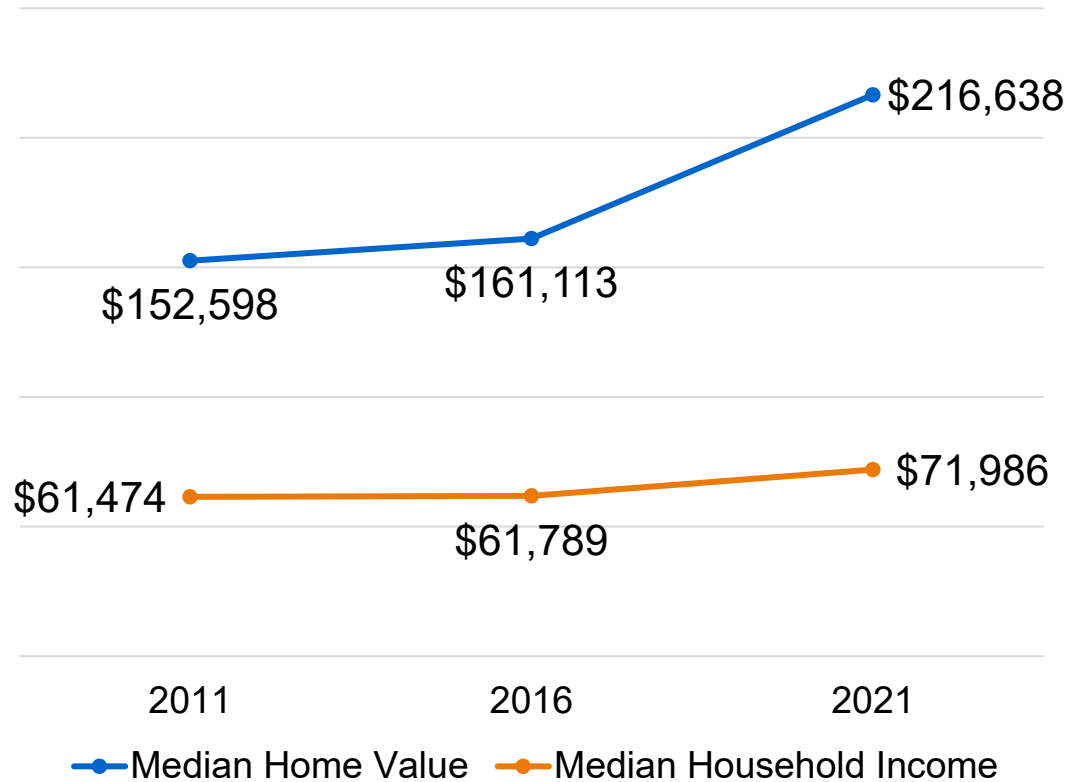

Percent of Senior Population 65+ in Texas, 2023

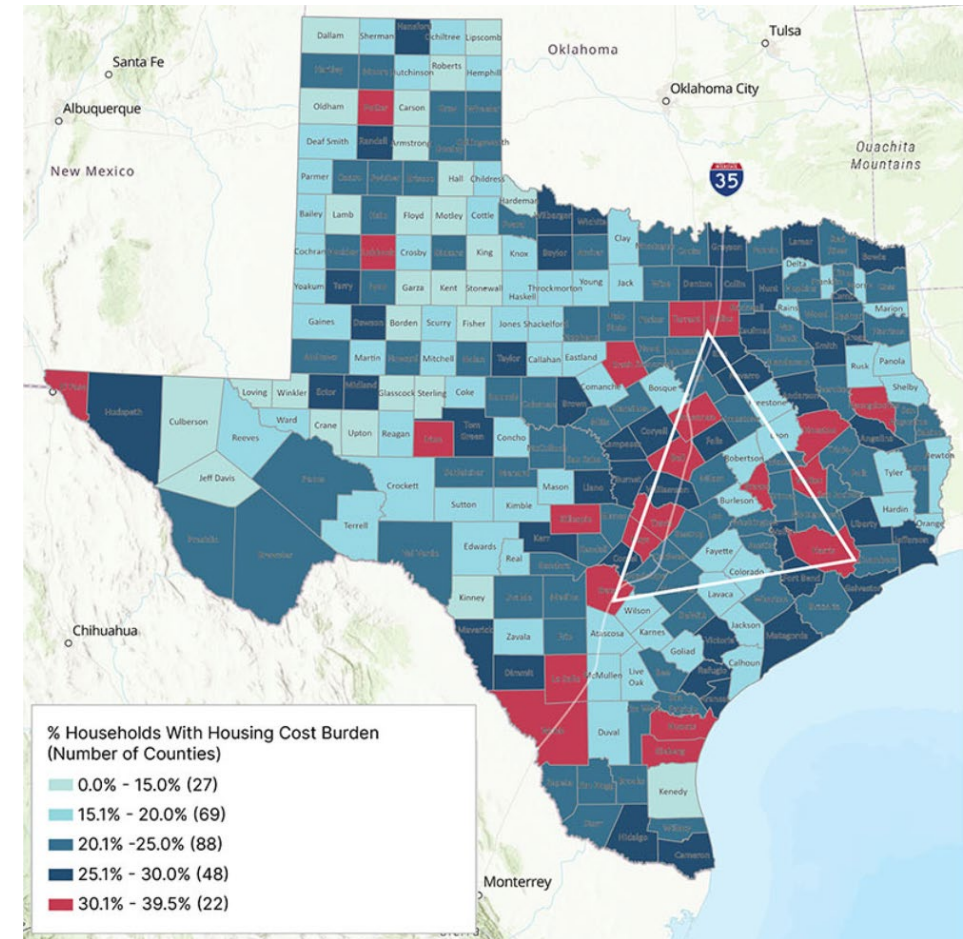


Housing Cost Burden in Texas, 2017-2021

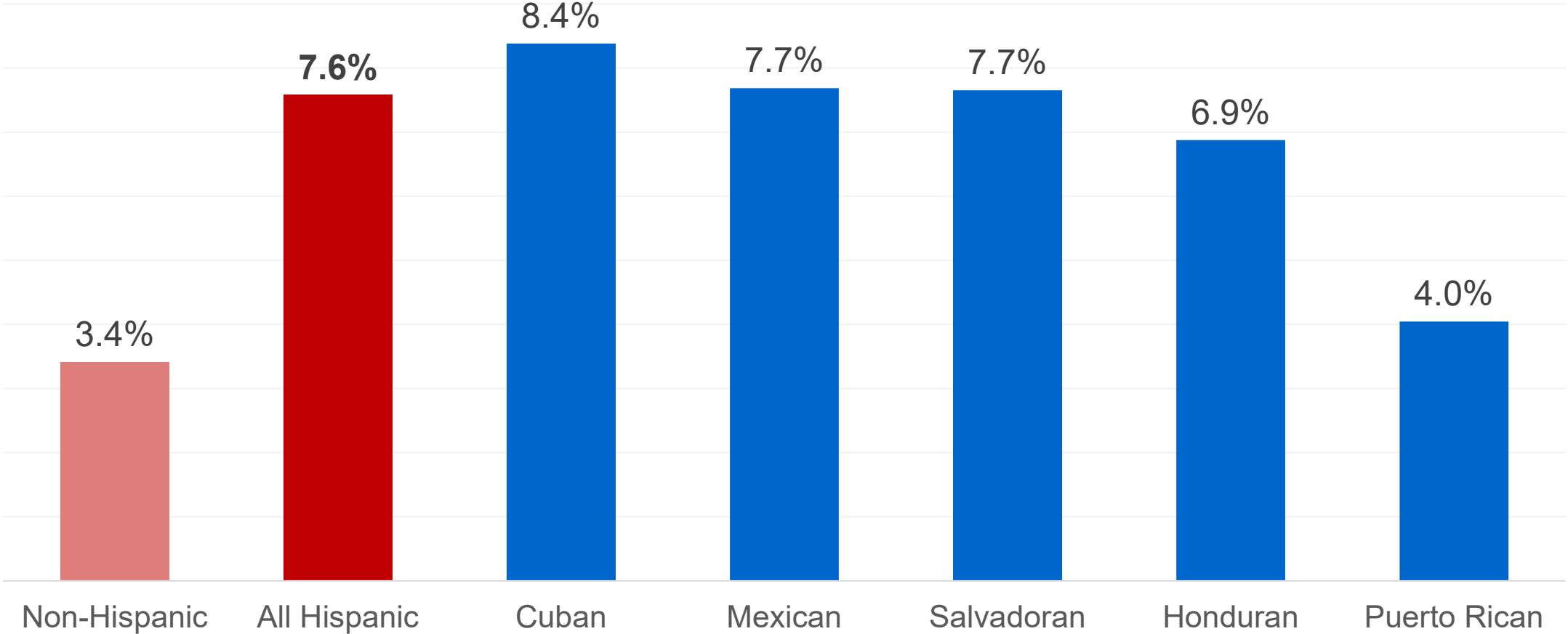
Median Home Value and Median Household Income in Texas, 2011-2021

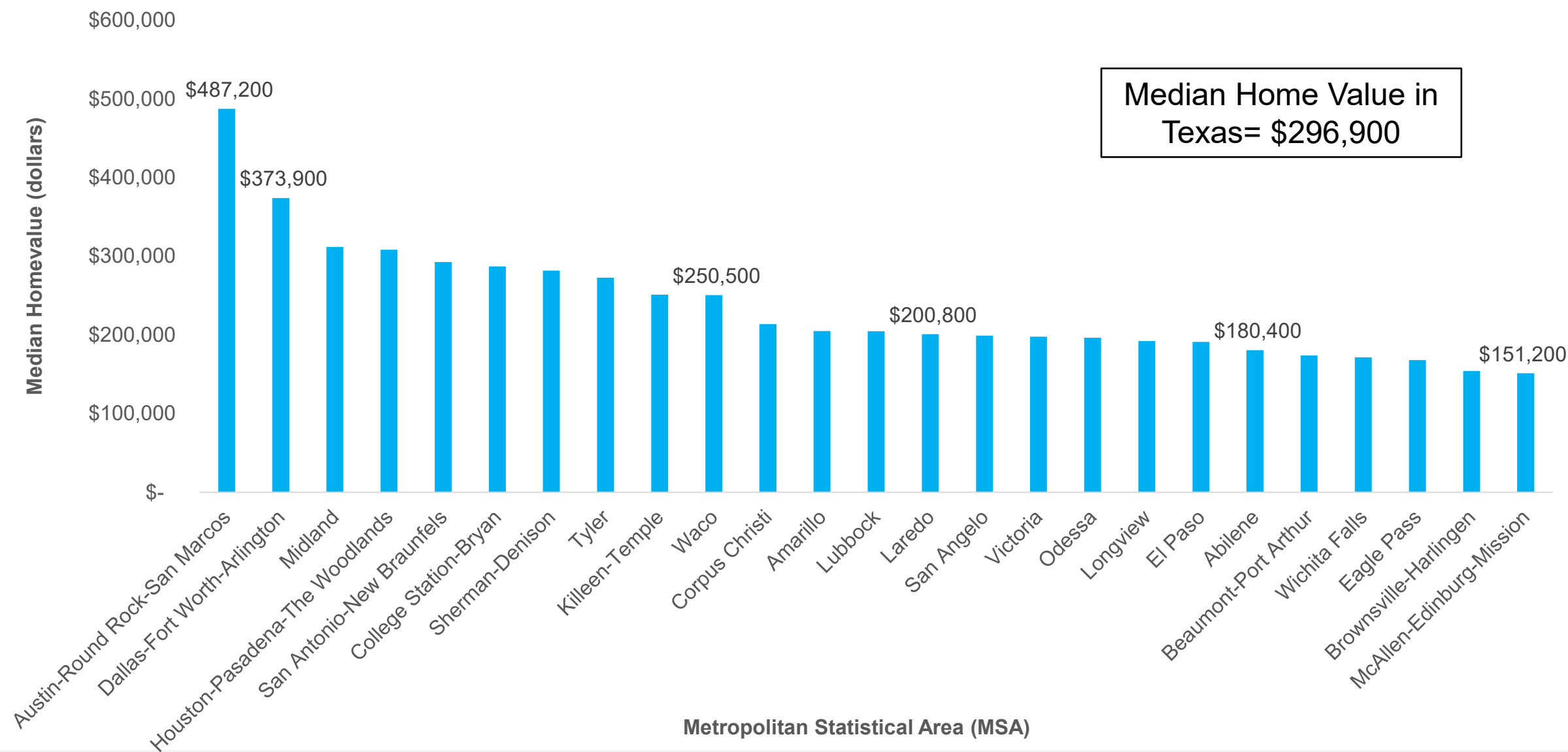


Percent of Multigenerational Households by Hispanic Origin, Texas

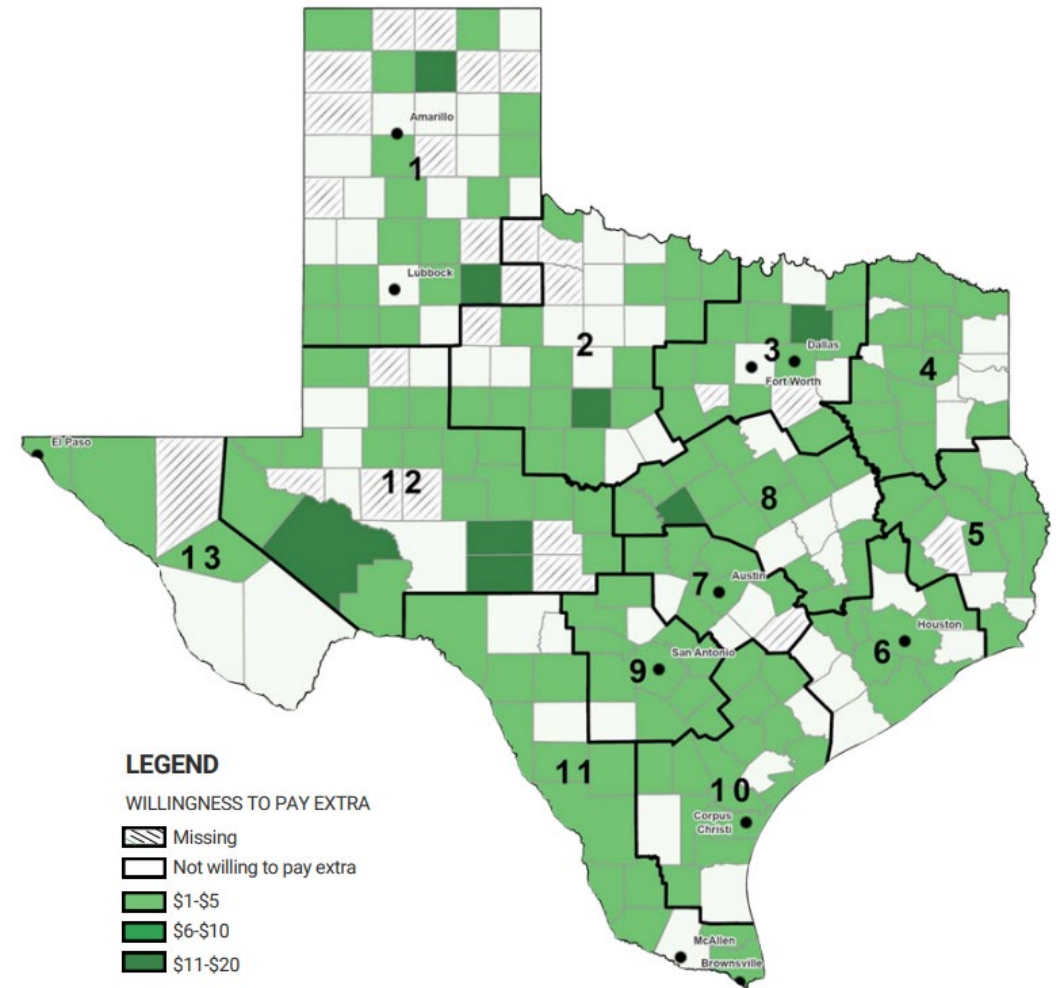
Median Home Value by MSA in Texas, 2023

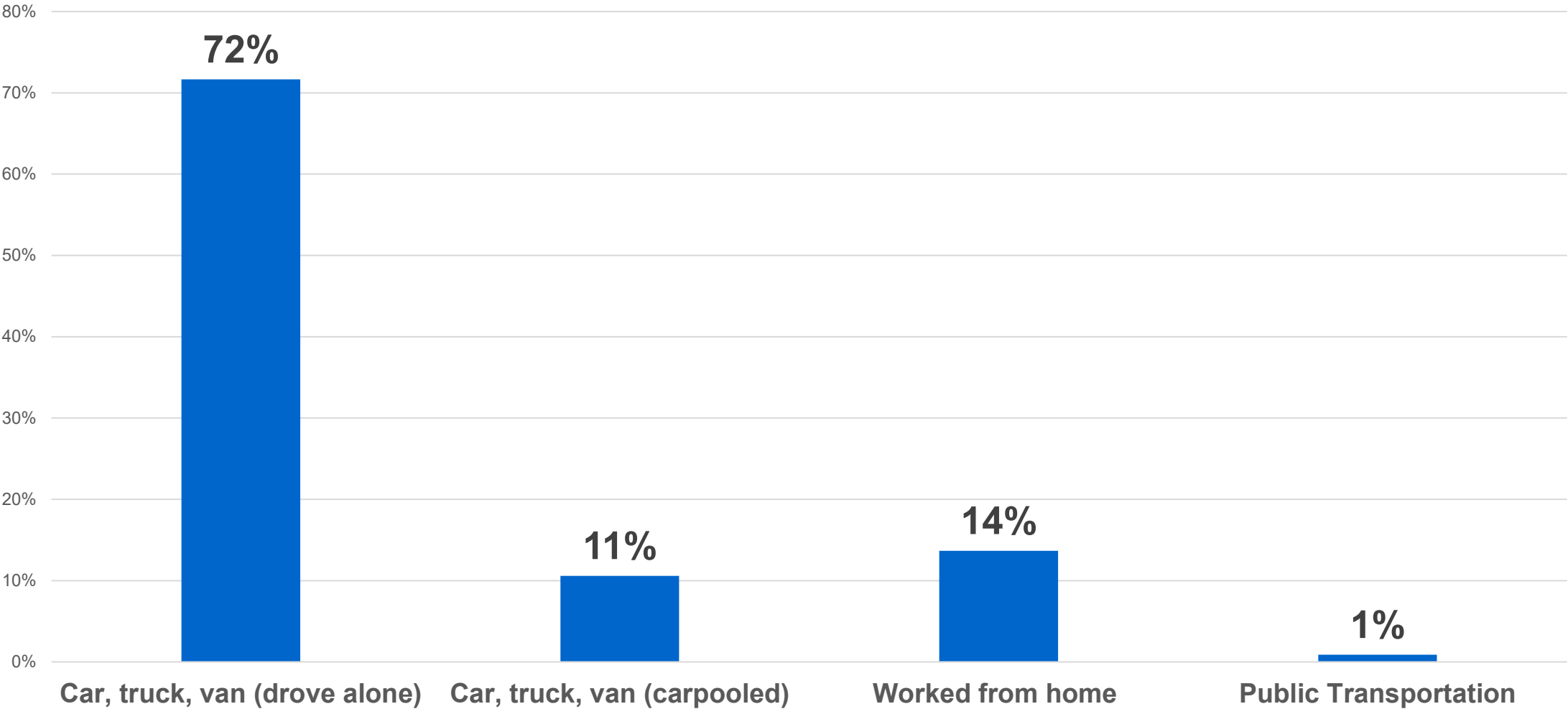
Migration in Texas

Net Domestic Migrants: The difference in the number of people who moved to Texas from another state in the U.S. and those who moved out of Texas in the last year.

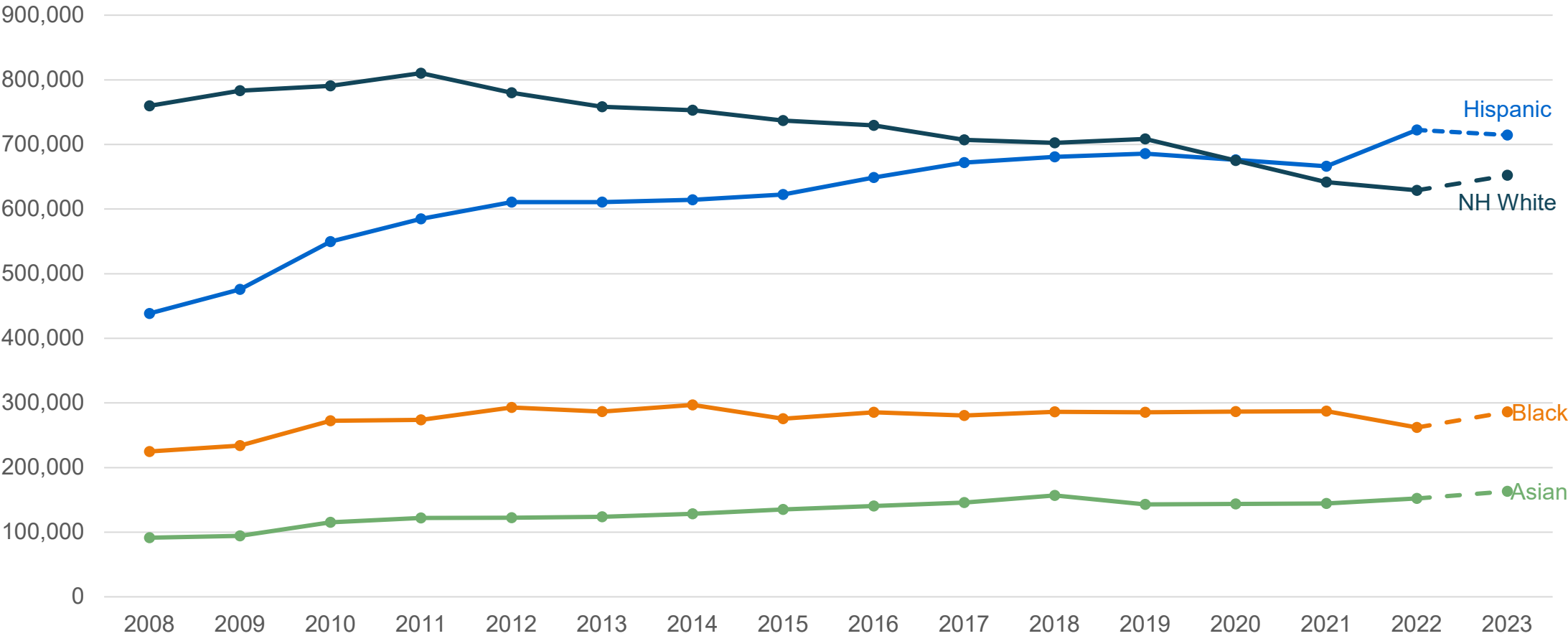


Means of Transportation in Texas, 2023

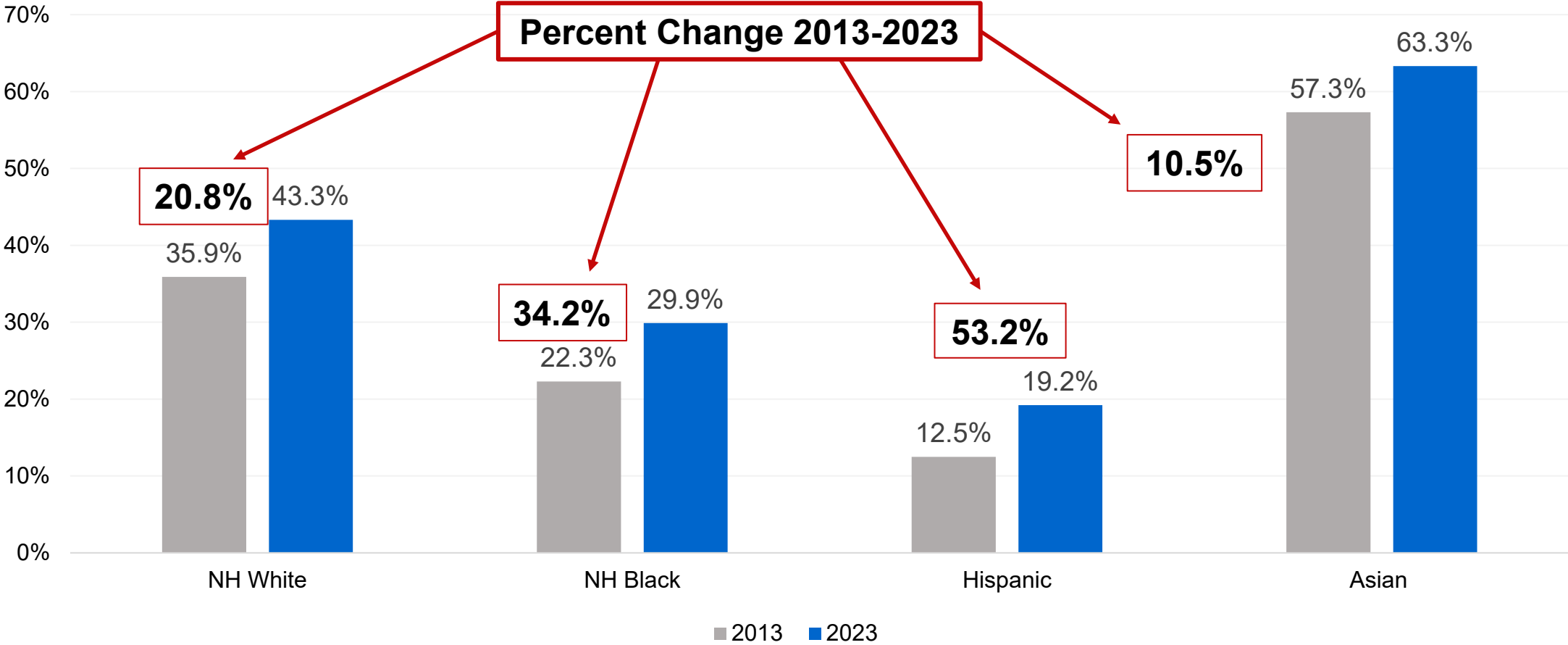
College and Graduate Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity in Texas, 2008-2023

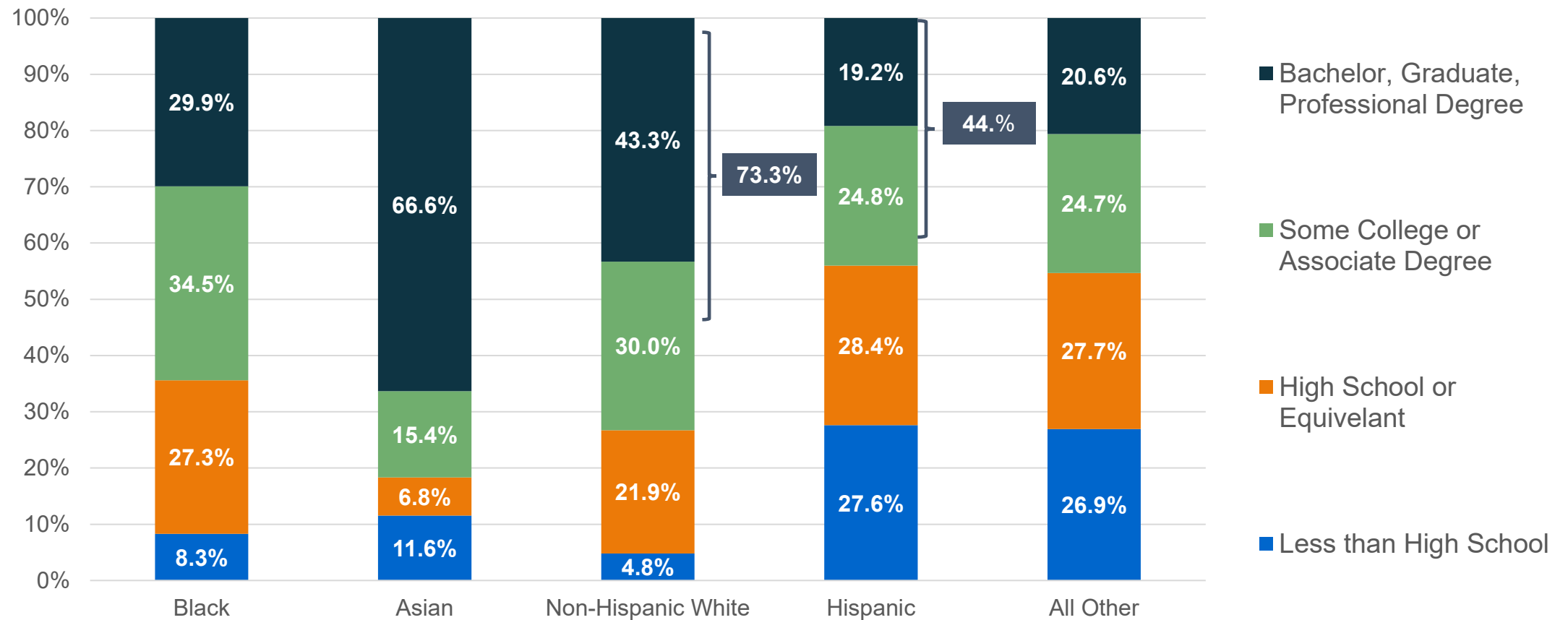

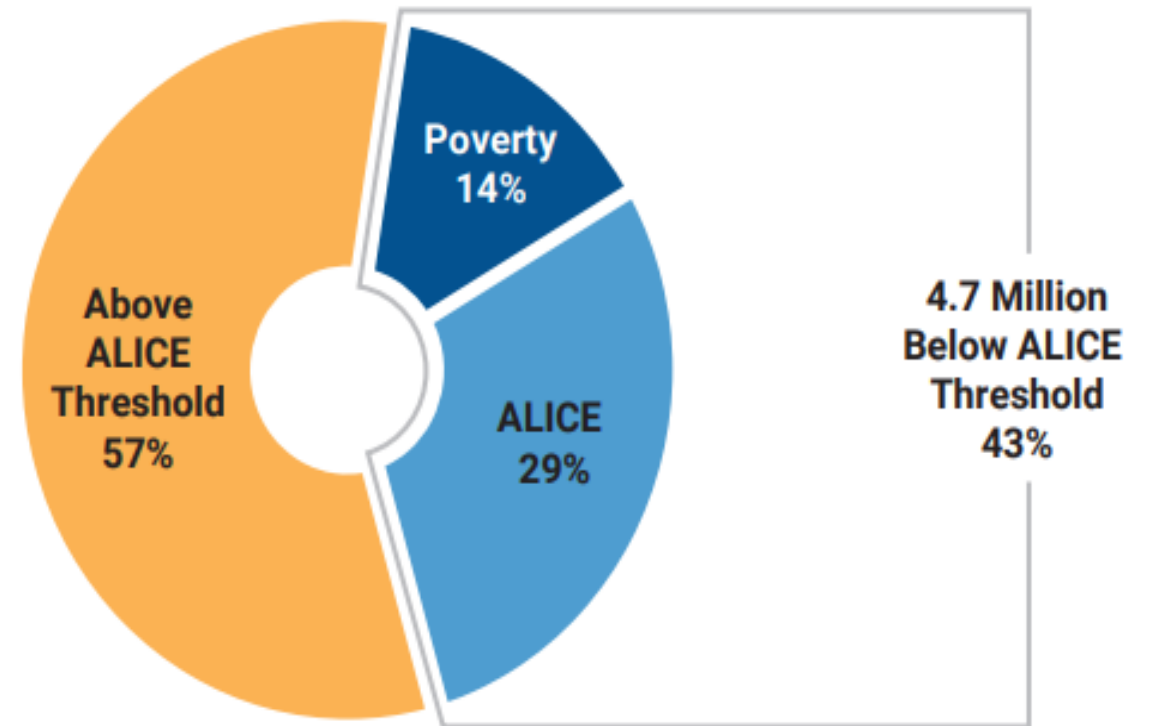

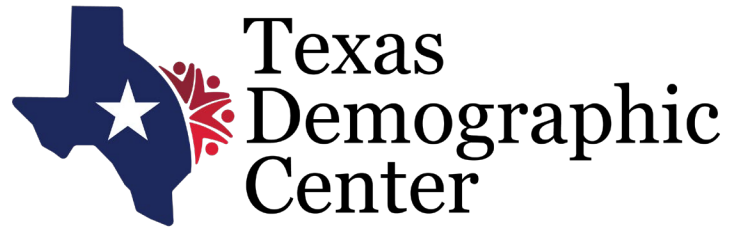
- ALICE households earn above the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)

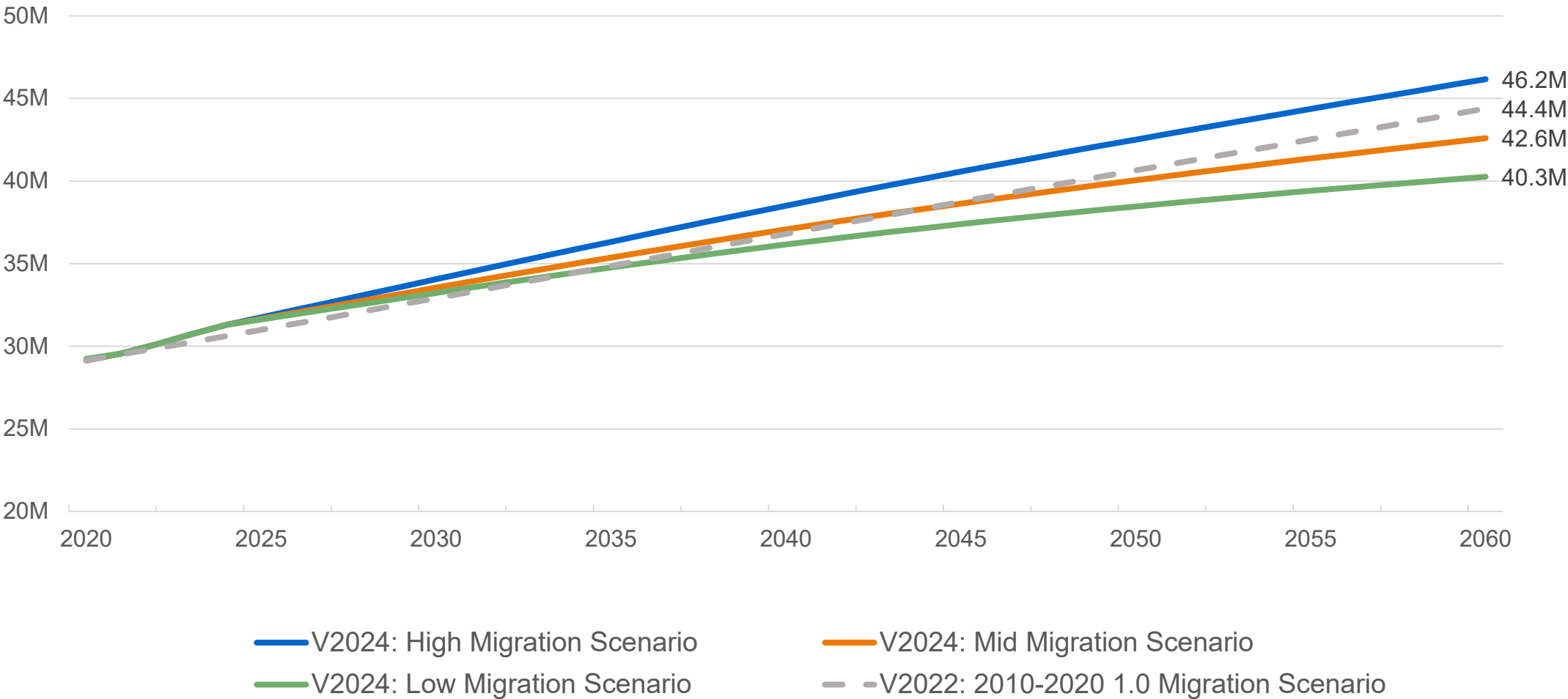

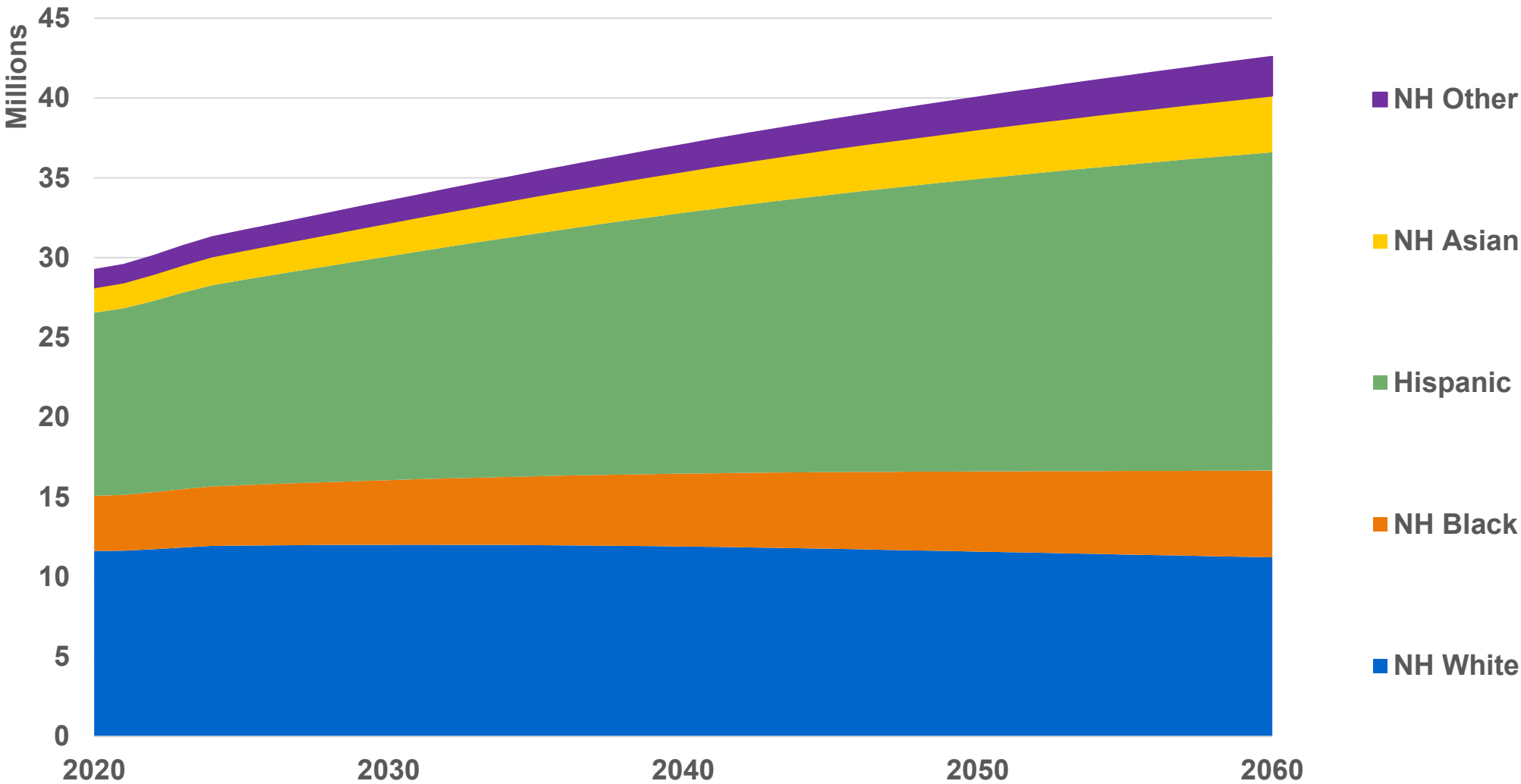


Projected Population Growth in Texas with Various Migration Scenarios 2020-2060

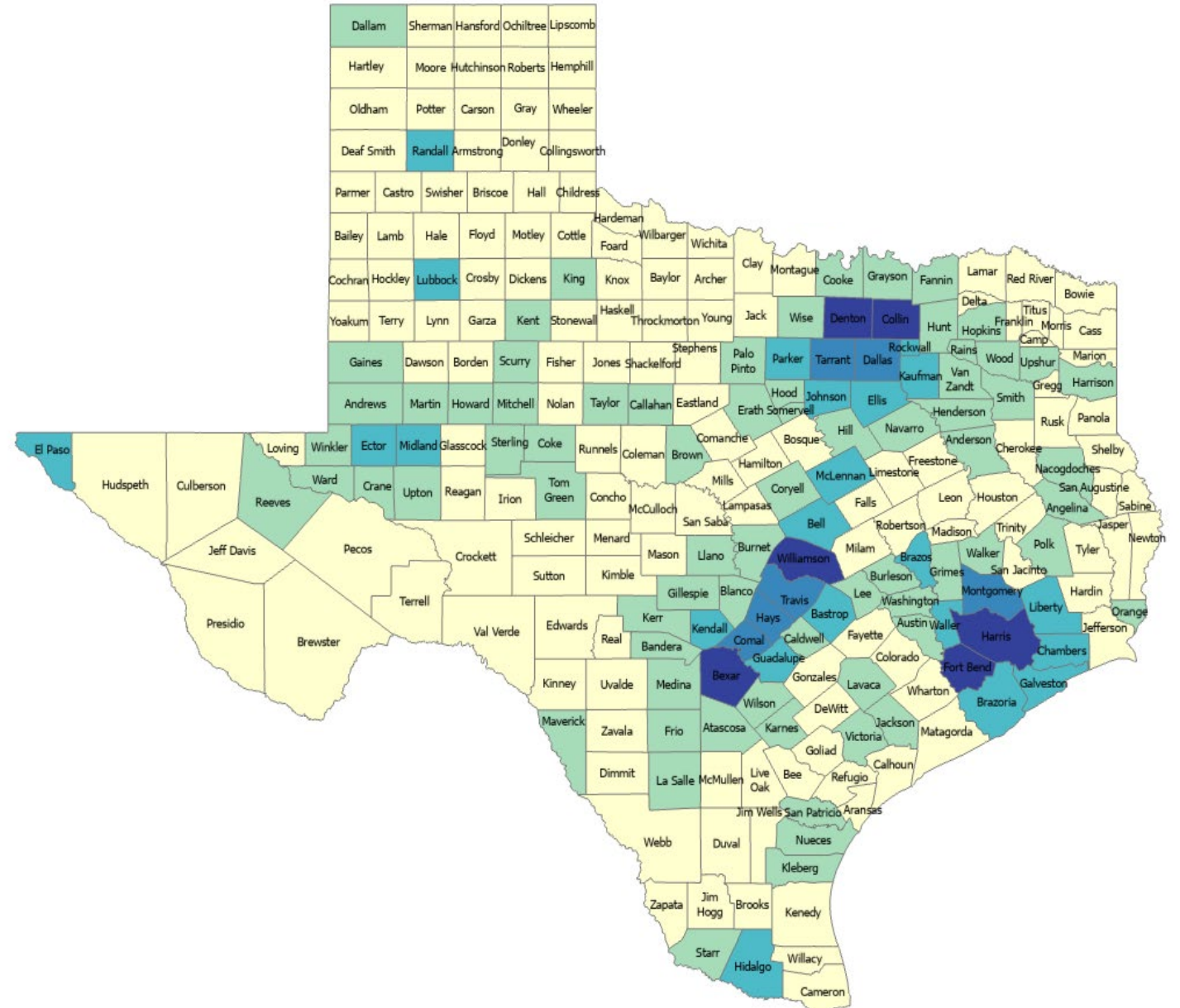
Projected Population by Race/Ethnicity
