


### Numeric Change, Texas Counties, 2010-2020

**95.3%** attributable to growth of Hispanic, NH Asian, NH Black, and NH Other







#### **Estimated Racial/Ethnic Composition of Texas Population, 2022**






#### **Estimated Numeric Change, Texas Counties, 2021-2022**





#### **Estimated Percent Population Change, Texas Counties, 2021-2022**






#### **Components of Population Change, Texas, 2011 to 2022**




### Texas' Daily Population Growth and Components of Change, 2020-2023




### Texas State-to-State Net Domestic Migration, 2022





#### Texas Birth Rates, 2007-2019




### **Enrollment in Nursery School and Preschool, Texas**



### **Generational Population Pyramids, Texas, 2010 and 2020**





Percent of the Population Aged-25 Years and Older with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher by Race/Ethnicity, Texas, 2011 and 2021









#### **Poverty Rates by Age Groups in Texas**






### Change in Income Inequality, Texas Counties, 2012-2022






#### Housing Cost Burden in Texas, 2017-2021





#### Median Home Value and Median Household Income in Texas, 2011-2021






### Percent of Multigenerational Households by Hispanic Origin, Texas




#### **MEDICARE** COVERAGE RATE

FOR THE TOTAL POPULATION






## **Civilian Noninstitutionalized Population with a Disability, Texas 2021**












#### **Projected Percent Population Change, Texas Counties, 2020-2060**
