



Estimated Population, Texas Counties, 2023




Estimated Numeric Change, Texas Counties, 2022-2023

- Population increase driven by in-migration





Texas Places with the Largest Numeric Growth from 2022-2023 and Ranks in the U.S.




Texas Places With the Fastest Growth Rate From 2022 to 2023 and Ranks in the U.S.






Estimated Components of Population Change for Texas, 2010-2020, 2020-2021, 2021-2022, and 2022-2023





Texas State-to State Net Domestic Migration, 2022










Domestic Migrant and Texas Resident Characteristics in Texas


Residents: Current Texas residents who have lived in Texas for a year or more.


Net Domestic Migrants: The difference in the number of people who moved to Texas from another state in the U.S. and those who moved out of Texas in the last year.





















Texas Birth Rates, 2007-2022




Births per 1,000 women aged 15-44



Texas Birth Rates by Age Group of Mothers, 2009, 2019




Estimated Racial/Ethnic Composition of Texas Population, 2022



- Survey of New Residential Units in Incorporated Places


TDC Population Projections and what we produce



Projections are "conditional statements about the future"*


- > Data driven: Identify patterns from historical data
- > Total population and population by age, race, and sex for Texas and all its counties;
- ➤ 5 race/ethnic groups: Hispanic, NH White, NH Black, NH Asian, and NH Other;
- From the most recent Census (2020) out to 40 years in the future (2060);
- ➤ Two migration scenarios are provided;
- ➤ Produced every two years; Release in the fall of even-numbered years.

Projected Population Change, Texas Counties, 2020-2060




Projected Population Growth in Texas, 2020-2060

Boundary and Annexation Research Initiative



Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)



 U.S. Census Bureau and the Texas Demographic Center both administer a boundary and annexation survey to municipal governments and counties (local elected officials and other municipal staff)

Local governmental units may respond via online through survey links

BAS is conducted annually (Jan – March)

Our Boundary Annexation Survey (BAS) learning journey



 Accurately recording BAS changes is important to population estimates at the local level

Accurate population data justifies funding to local governments

Recording and documentation process varies

 Collaboration with Texas Geographic Information Office (TxGIO) to streamline process in the future


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


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
