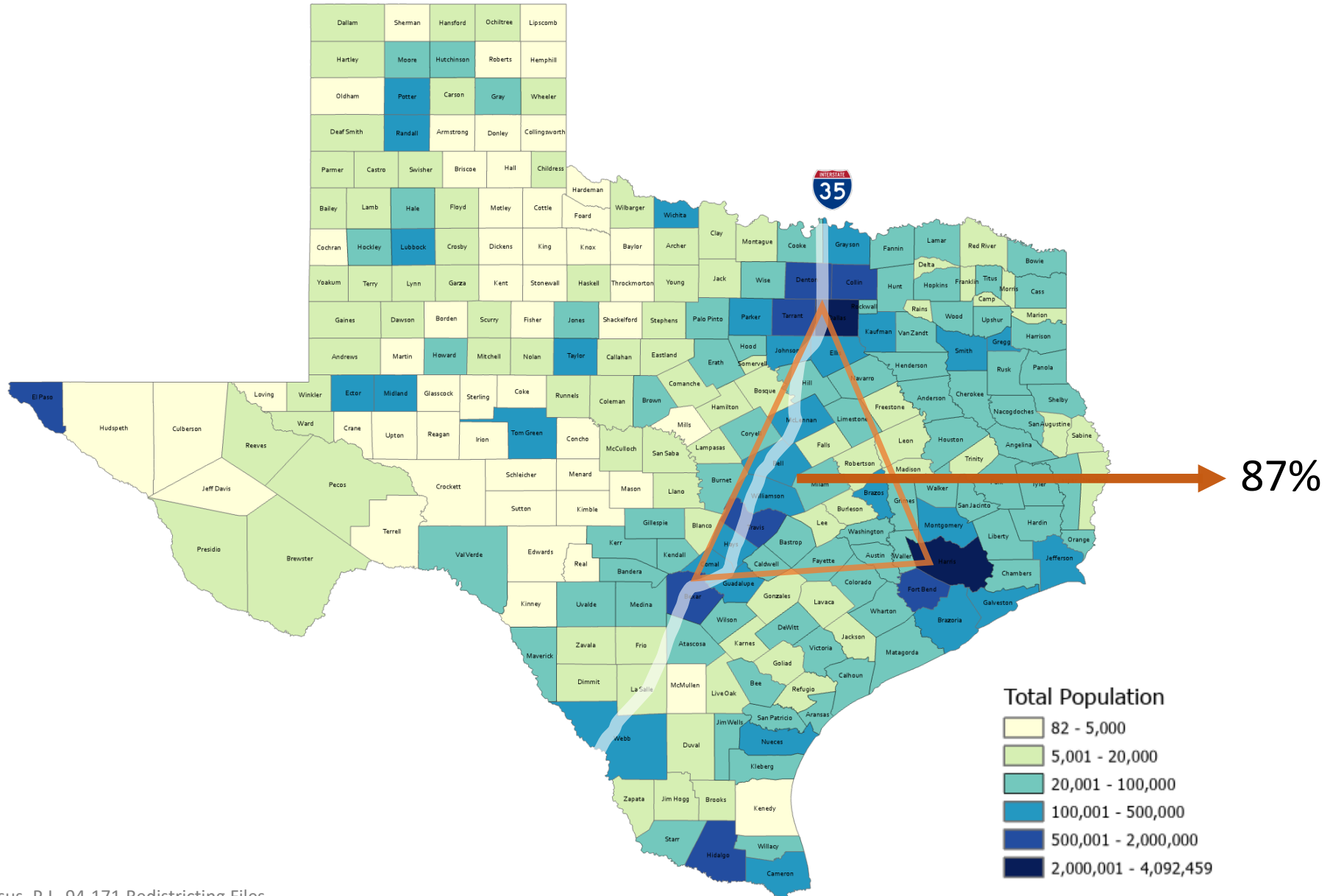

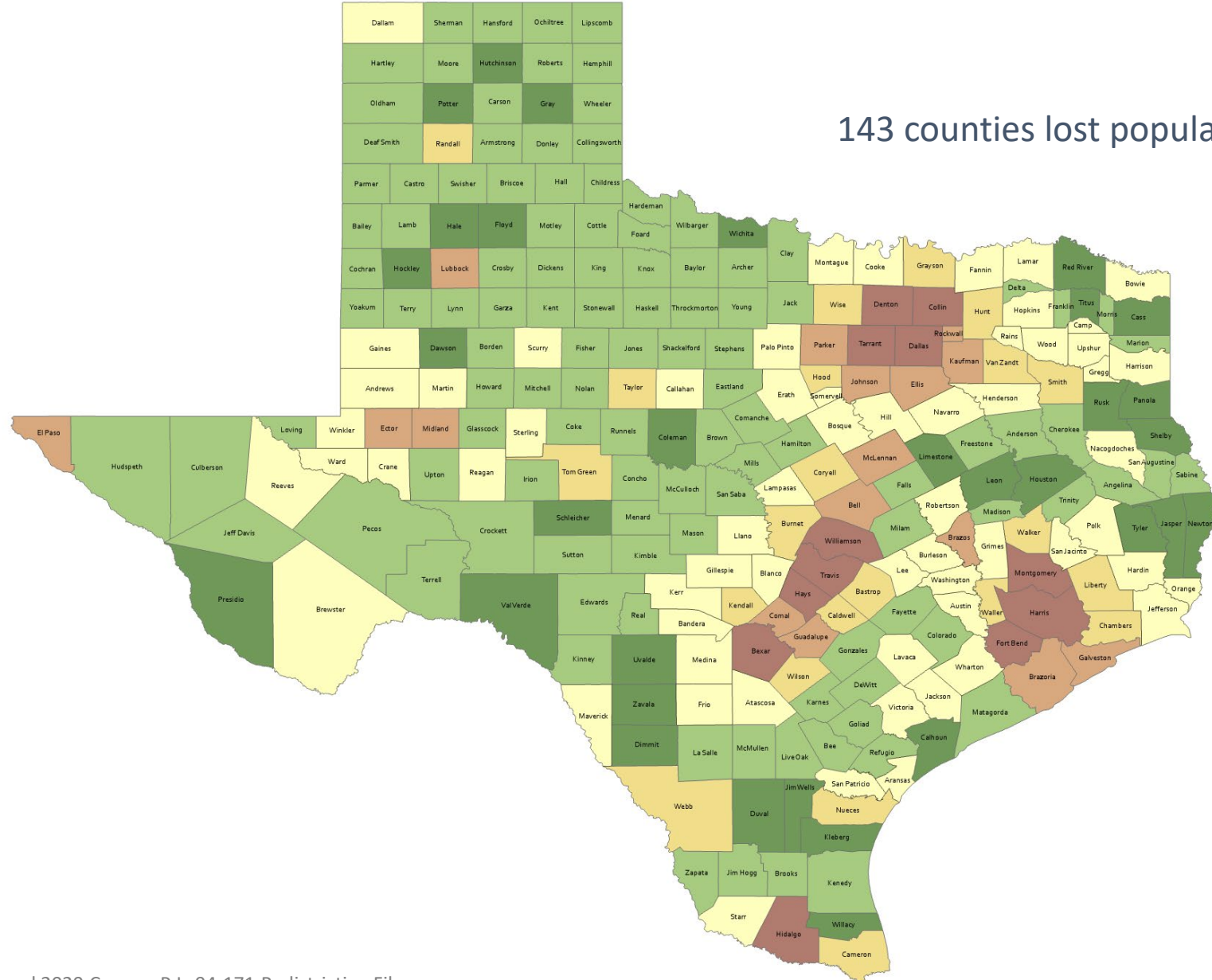


Census 2020 Population, Texas Counties

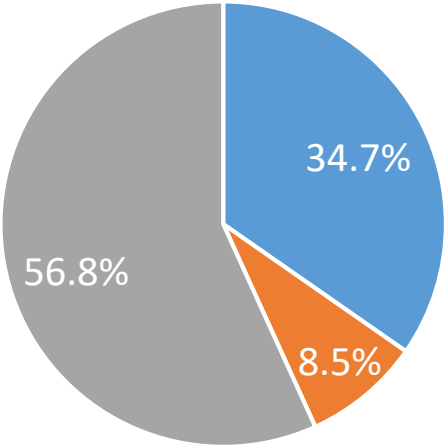
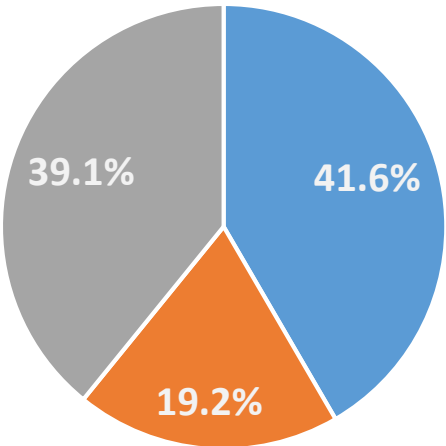
Estimated Components of Population Change, 2010-2020 and 2020-2021

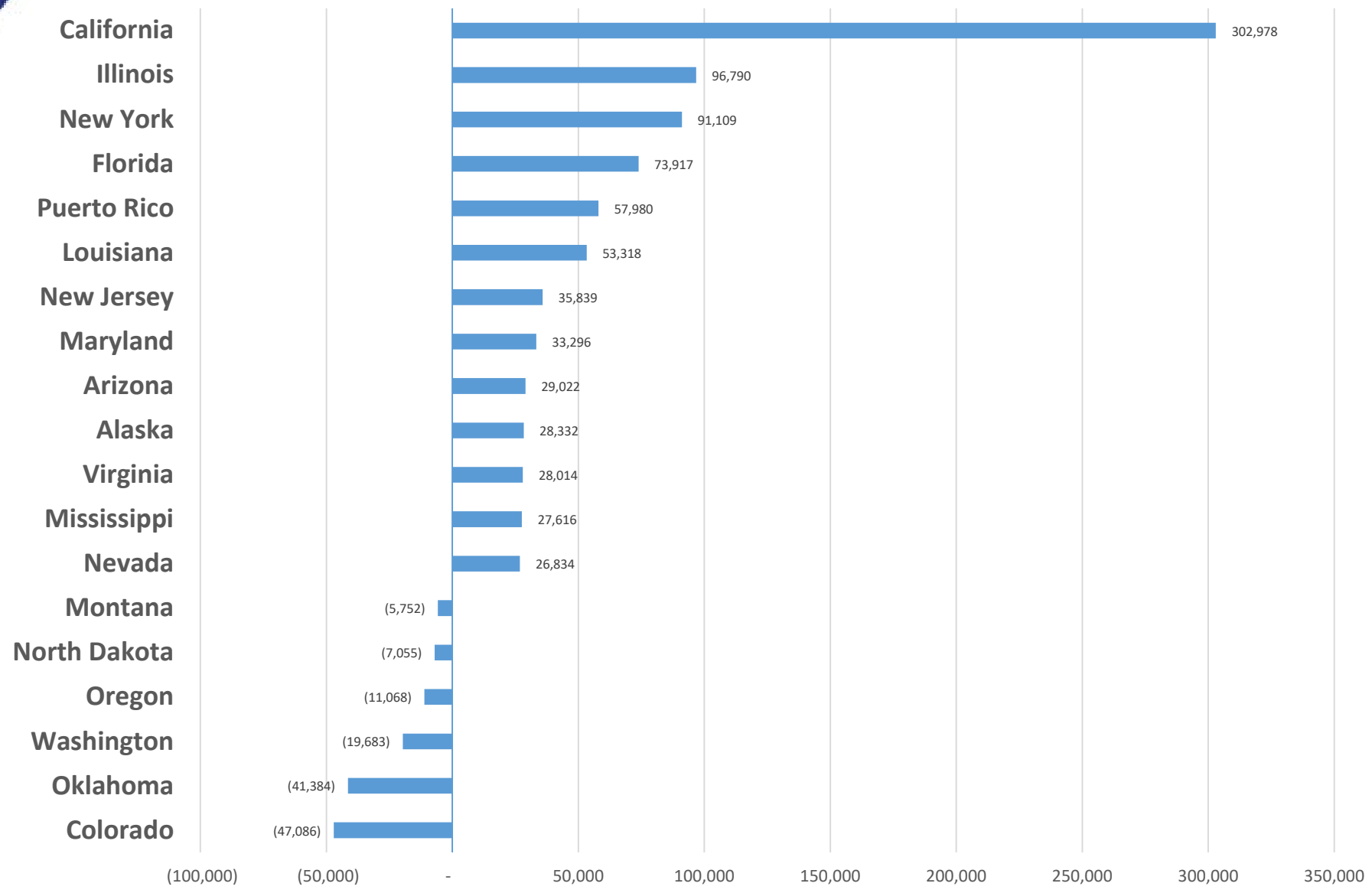

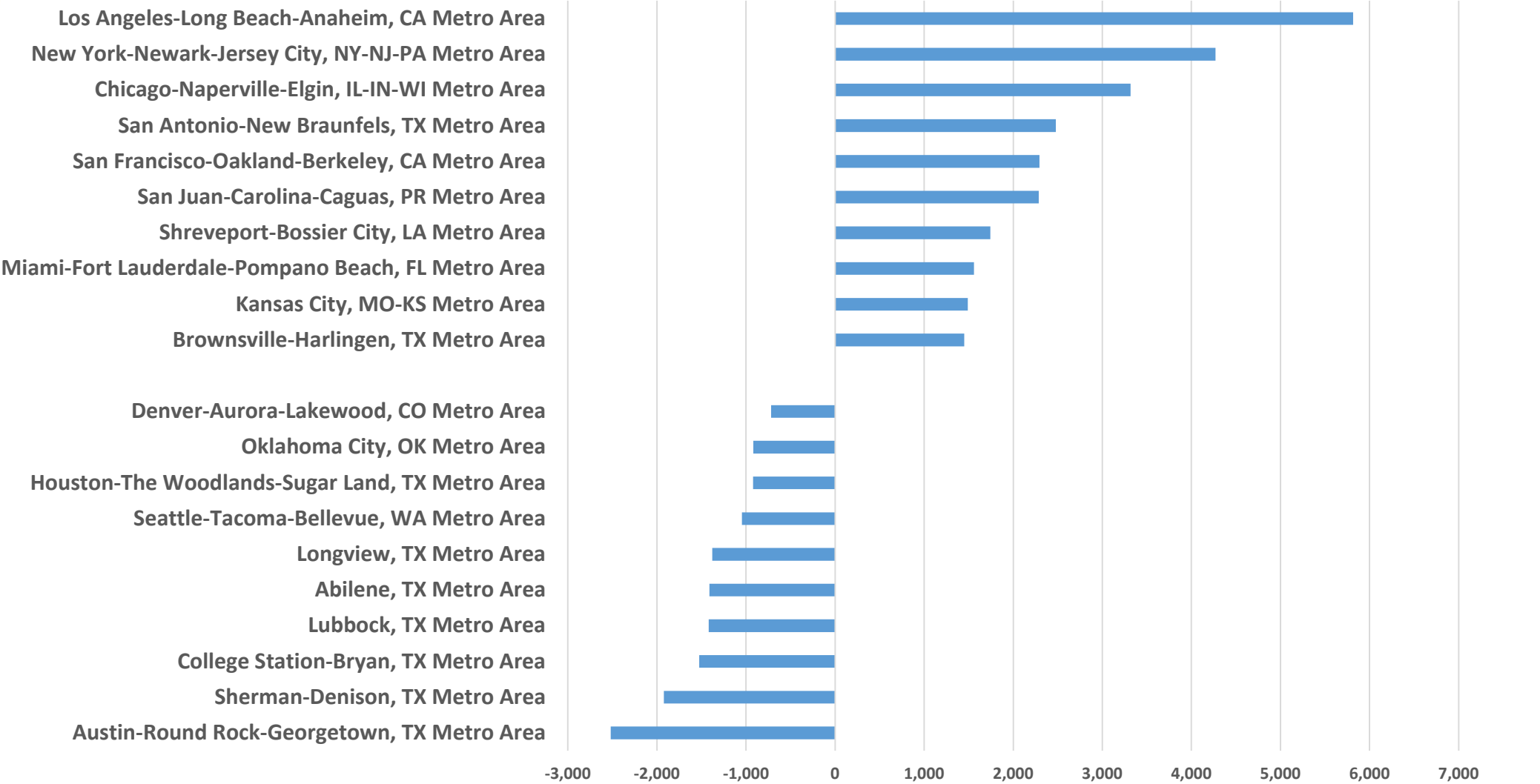


Estimated Net Domestic Migrants Between Texas and Other States, 2010-2019



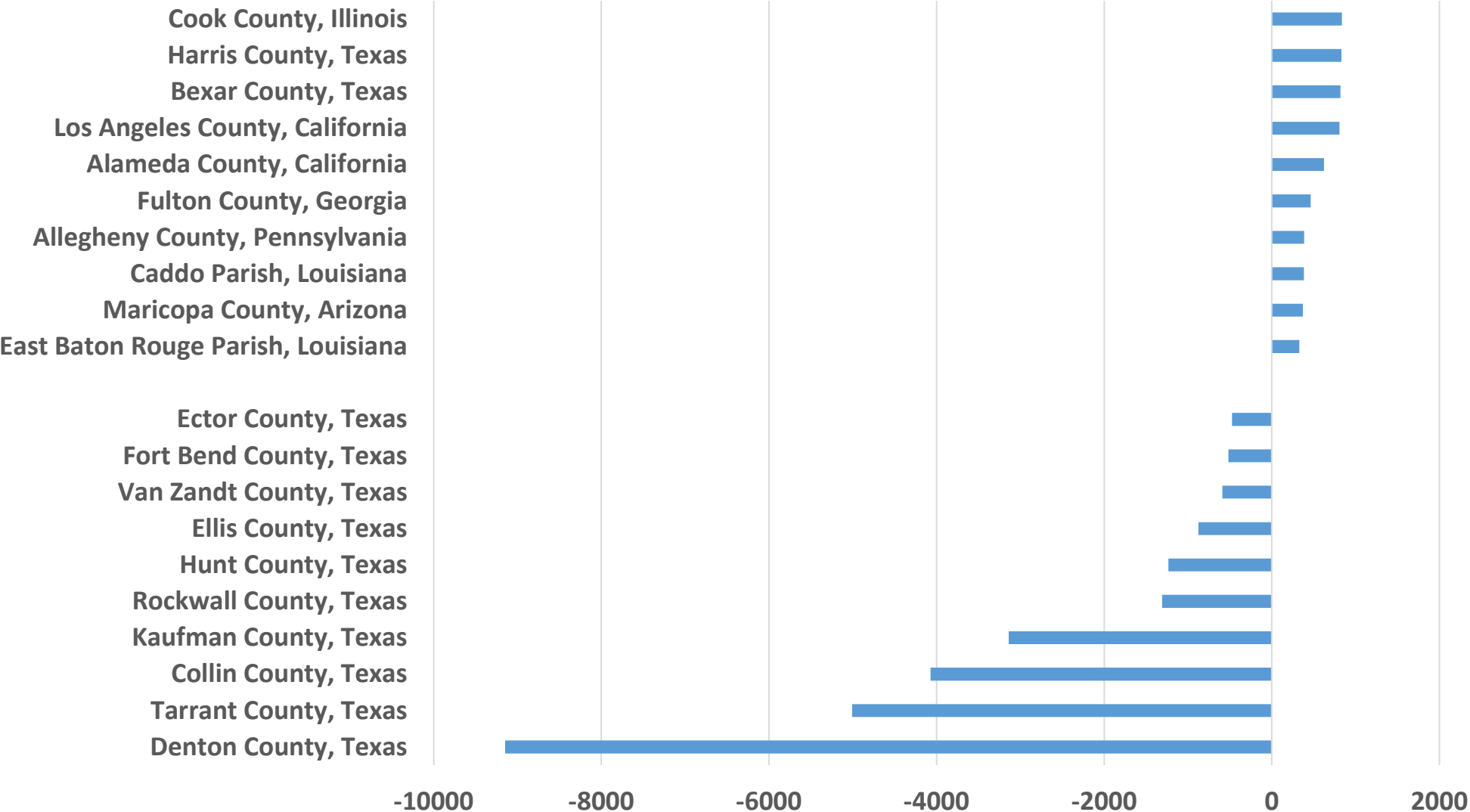


Estimated Net Domestic Migrants Between Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington, TX Metro Area and Other Metro Areas, 2015-2019



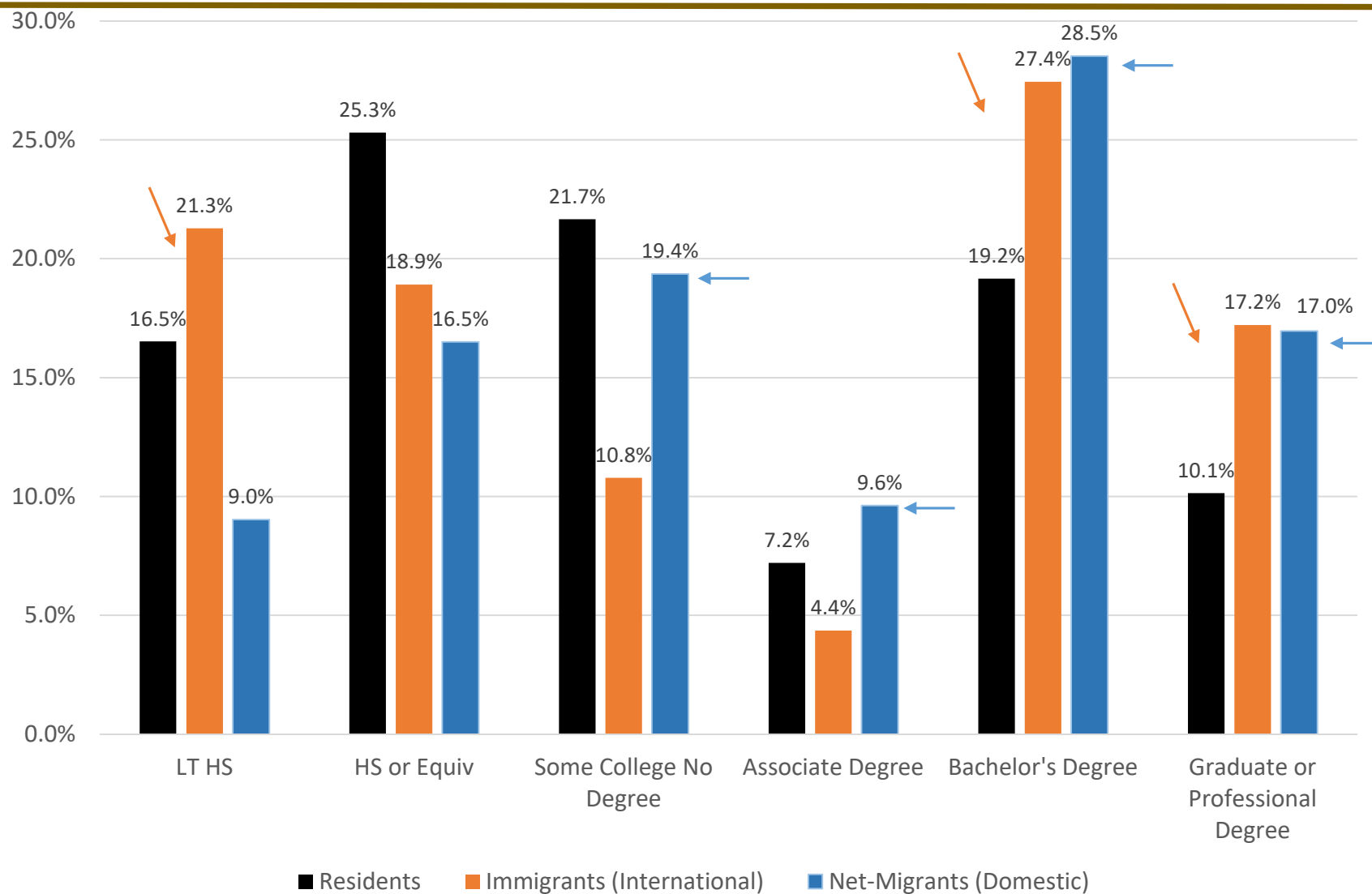


Estimated Net Domestic Migrants Between County, TX Other Counties, 2015-2019



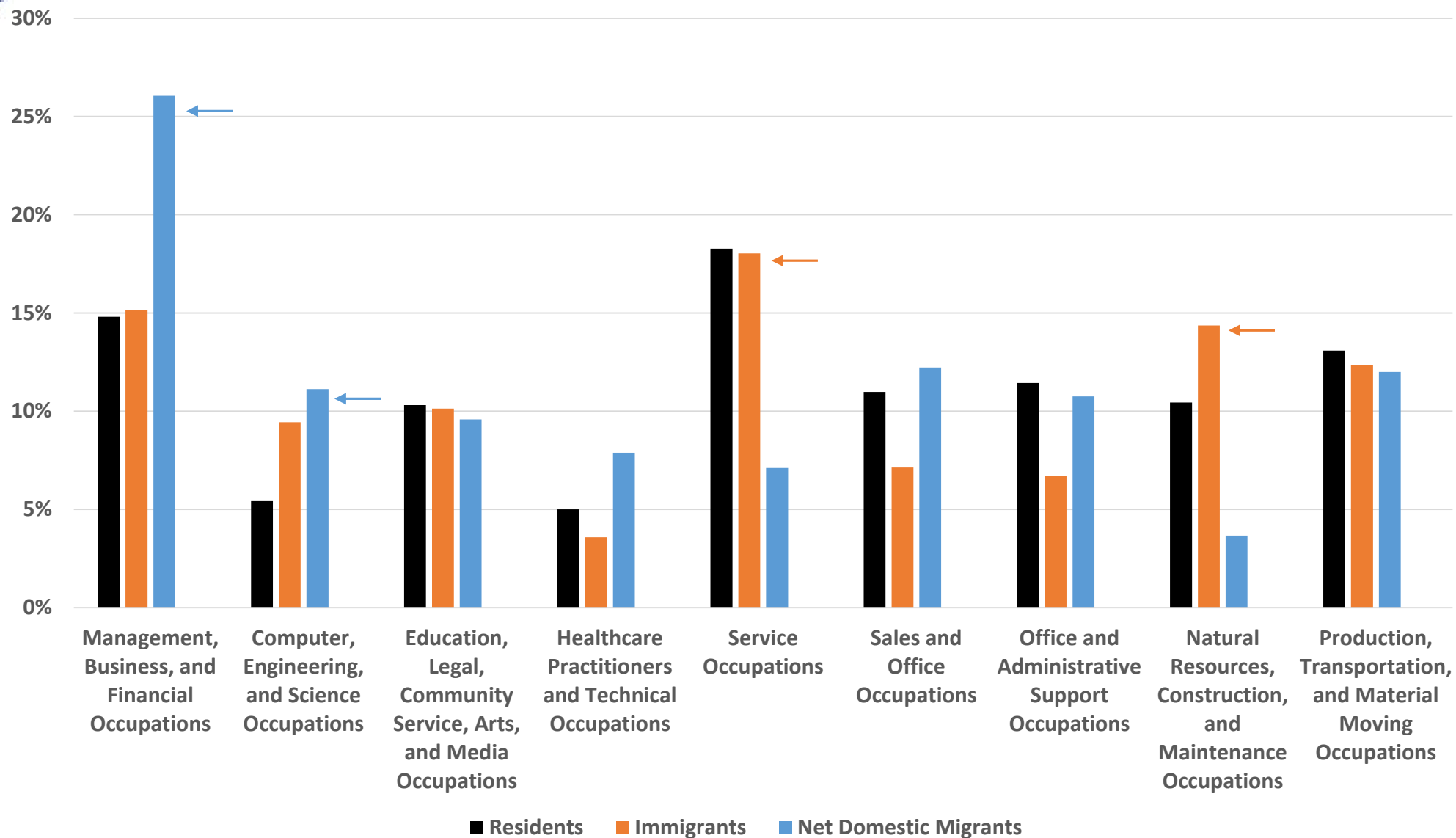

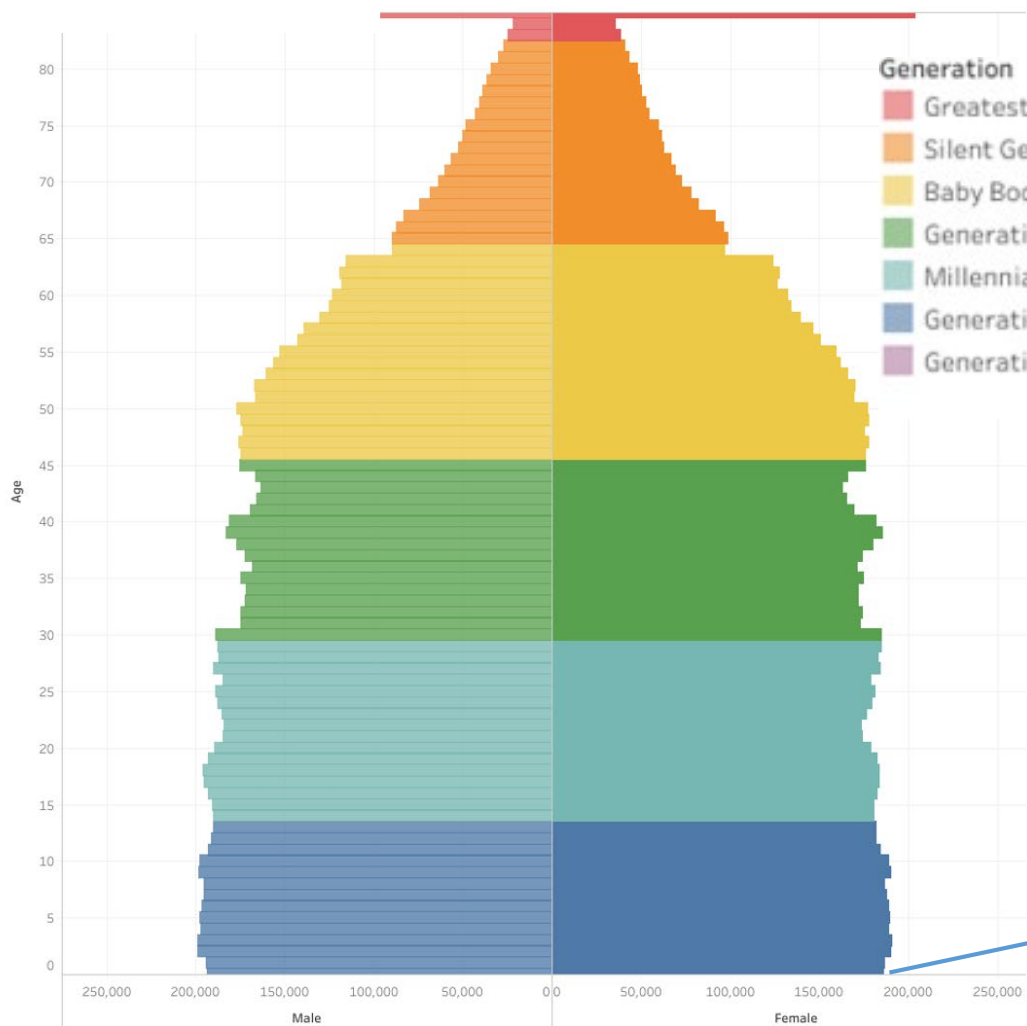

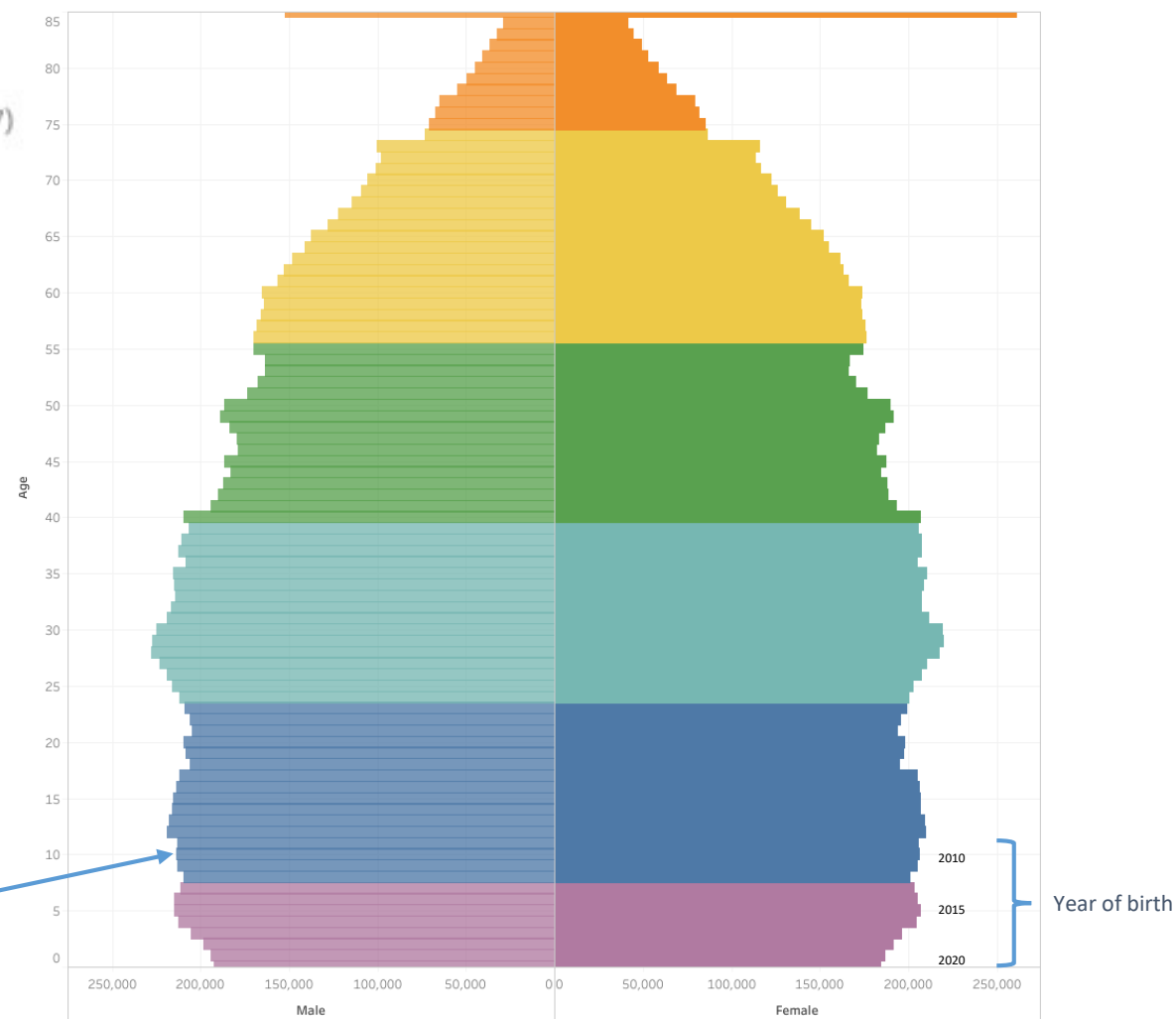


Generational Population Pyramids, Texas, 2010 and 2020

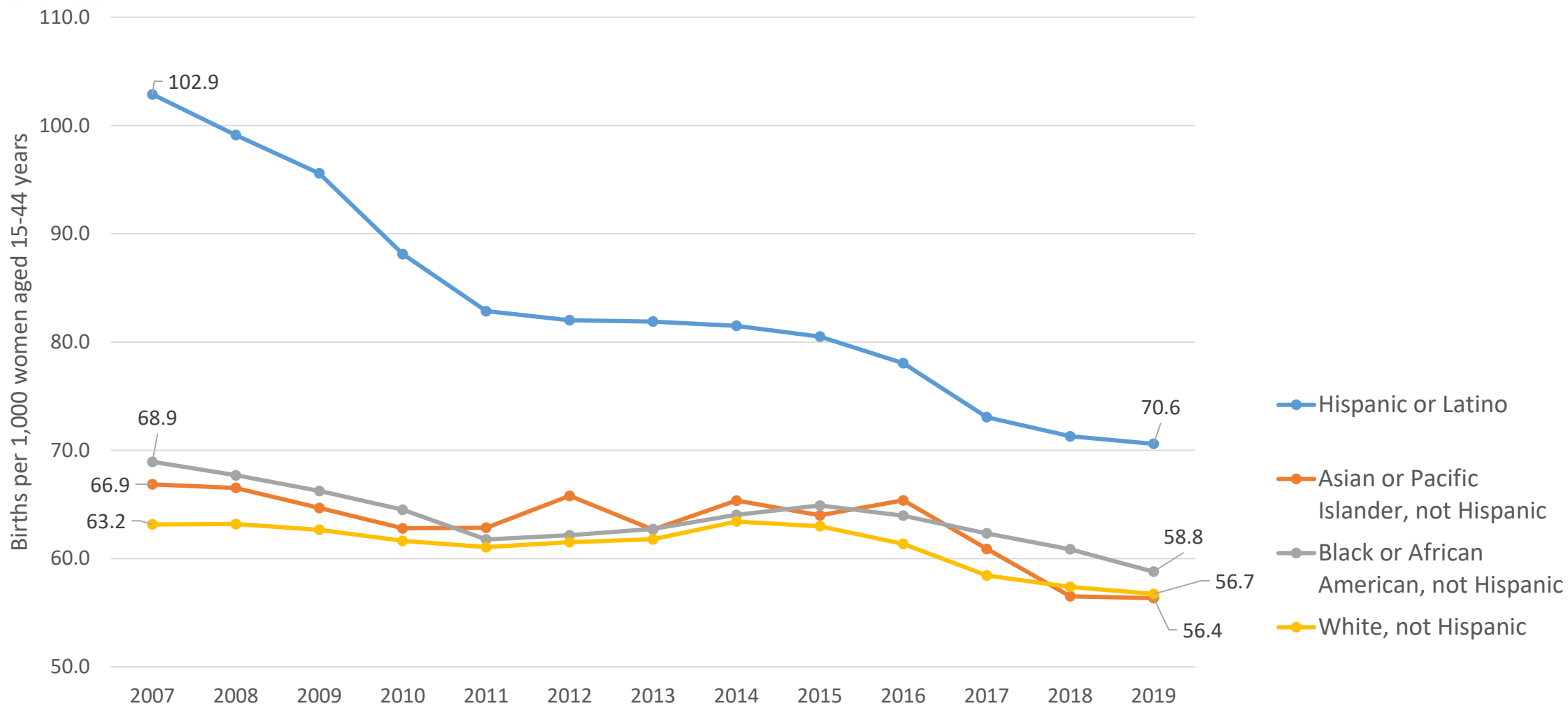

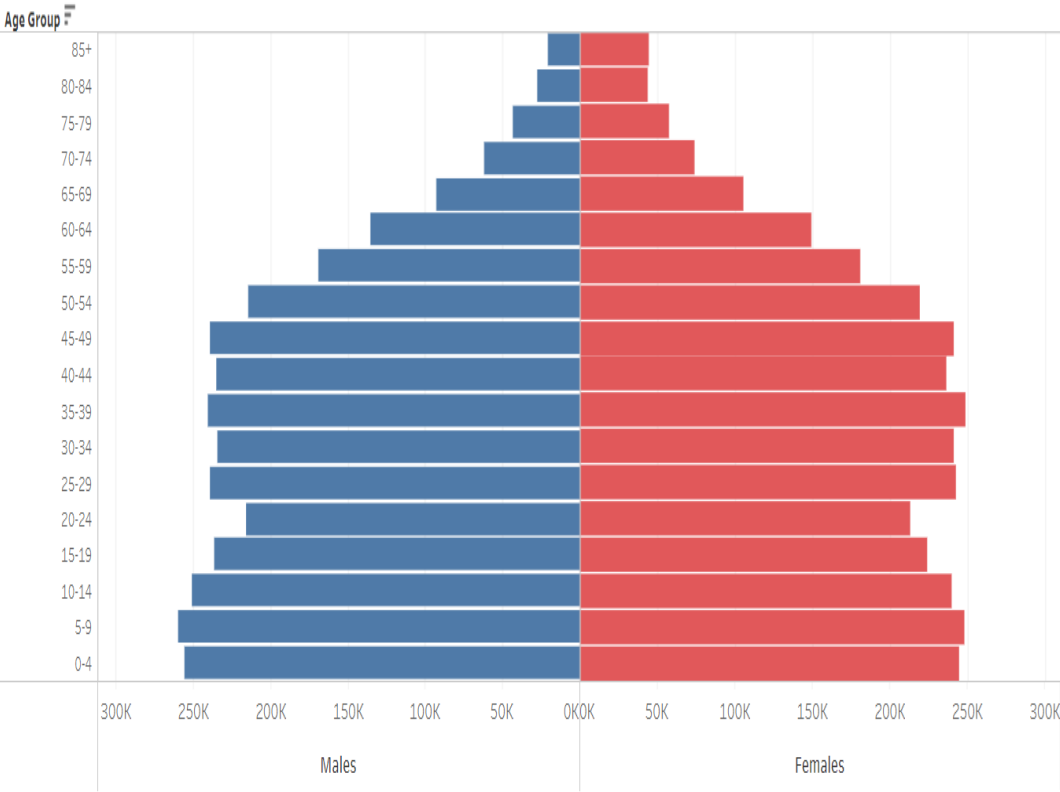
Texas Birth Rates, 2007-2019



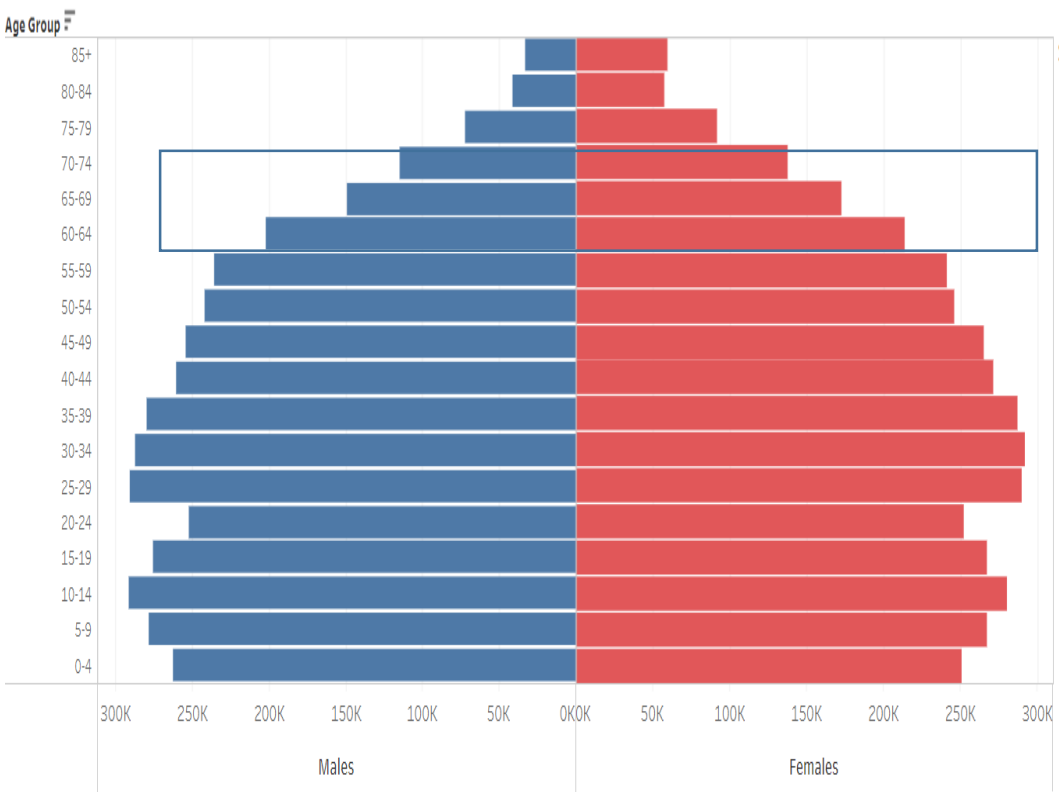


Generational Population Pyramids, DFW, 2010 and 2020

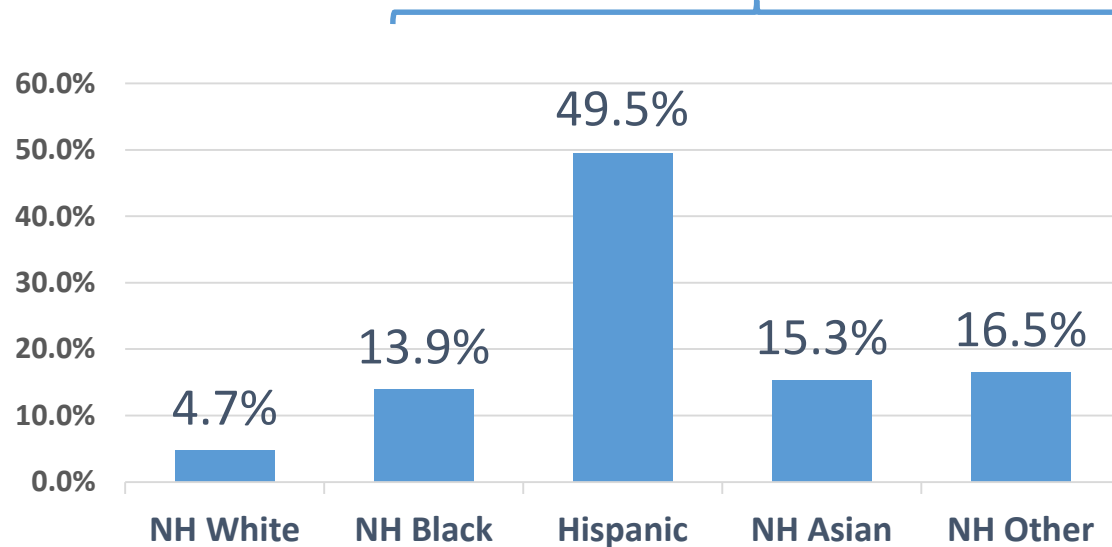

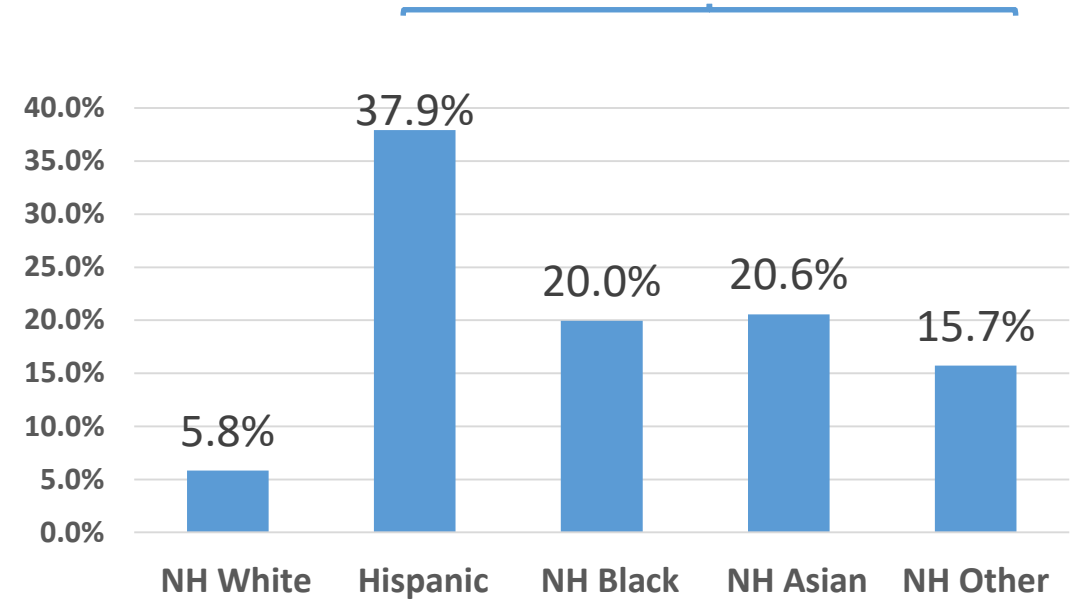
Racial/Ethnic Contributions to Population Growth, 2010-2020

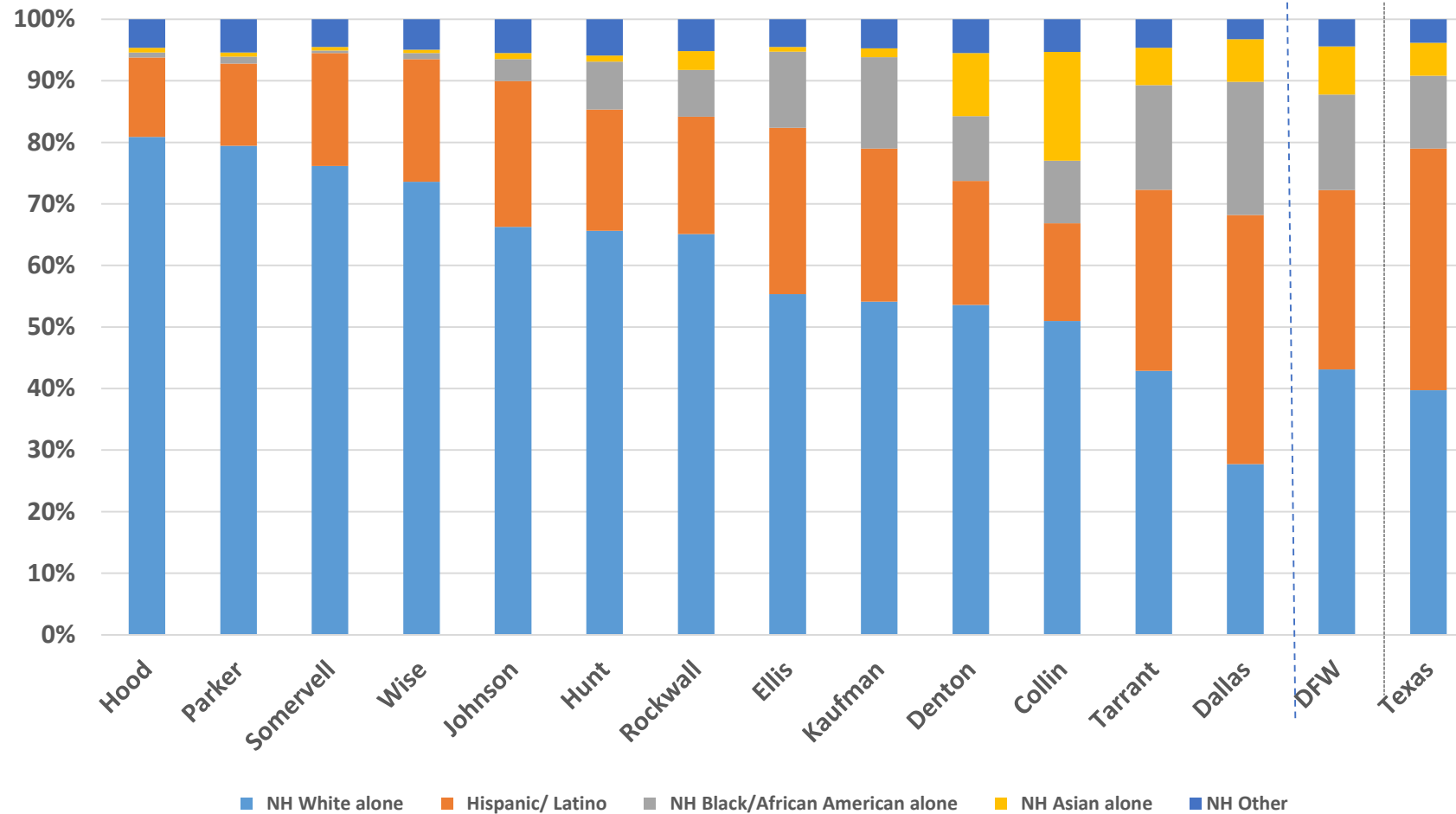

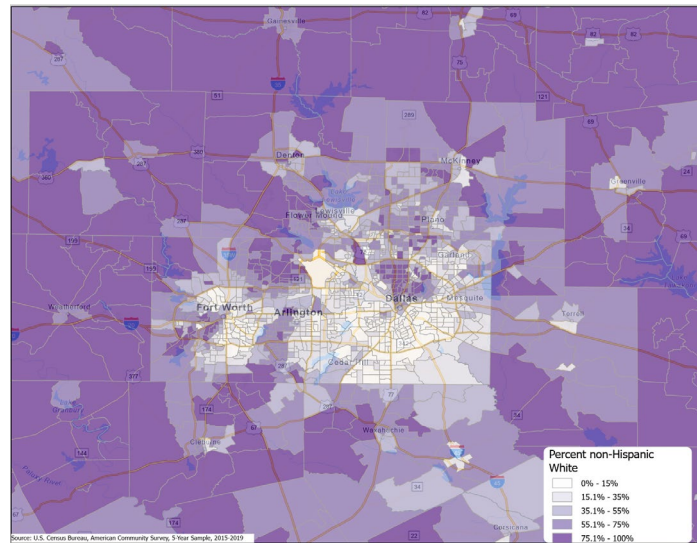
Race/Ethnic Percentages, Counties in the DFW Area and Texas, 2020



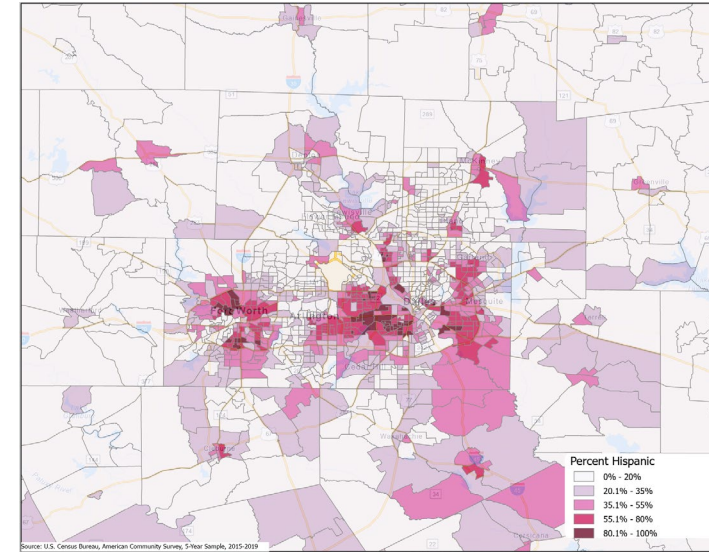


Percent of Population by Race/Ethnicity, Metroplex area, census tracts, 2015-2019

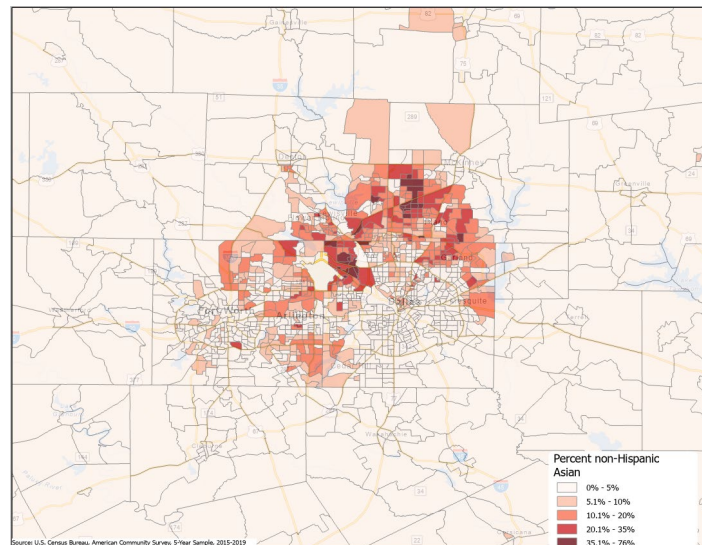

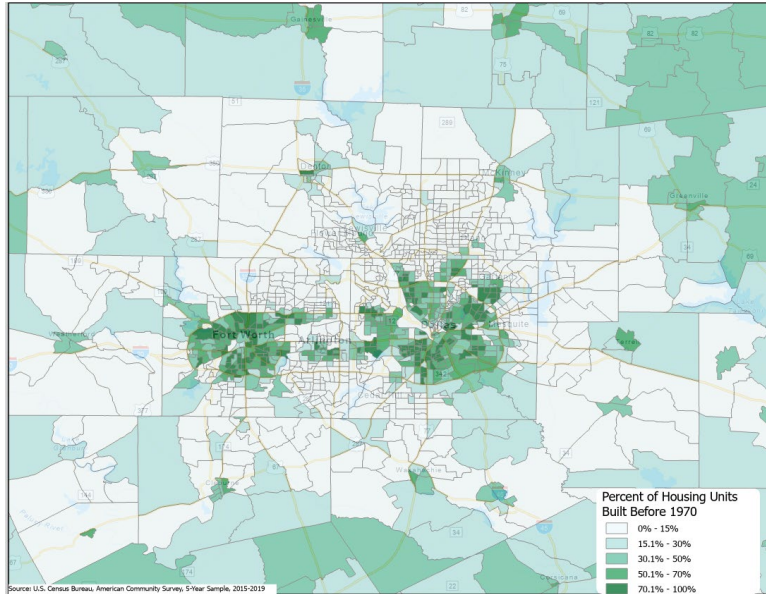

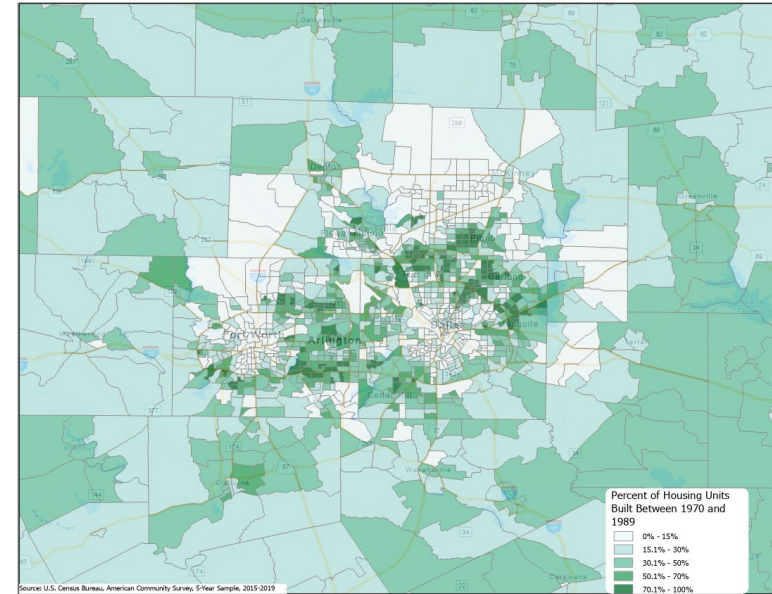


Percent of housing stock by year built, Metroplex area, census tracts, , 2015-2019

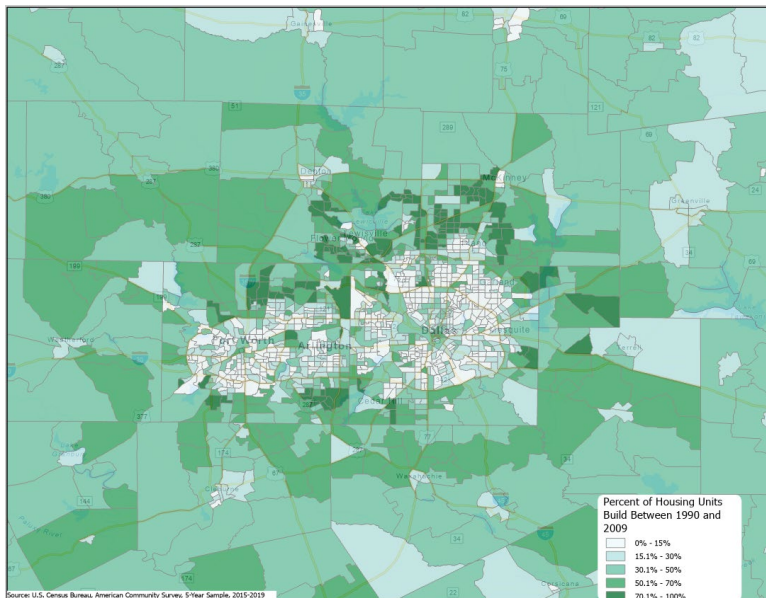

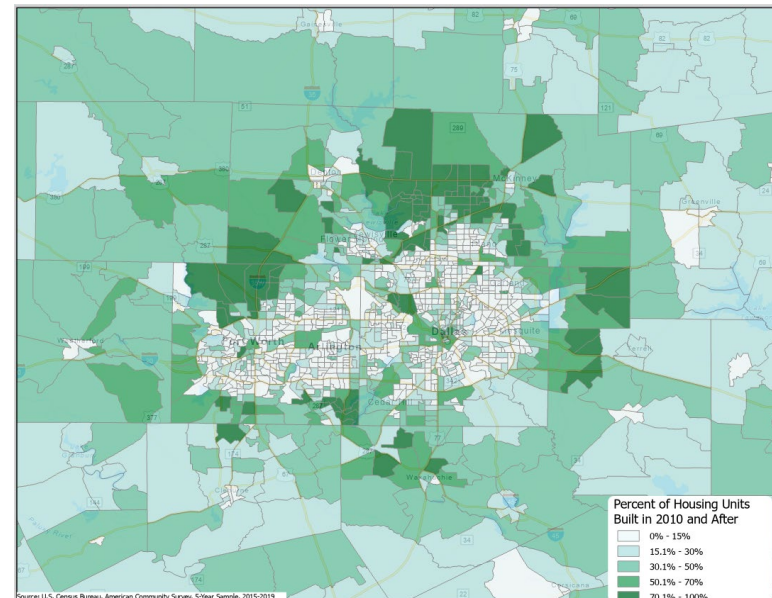

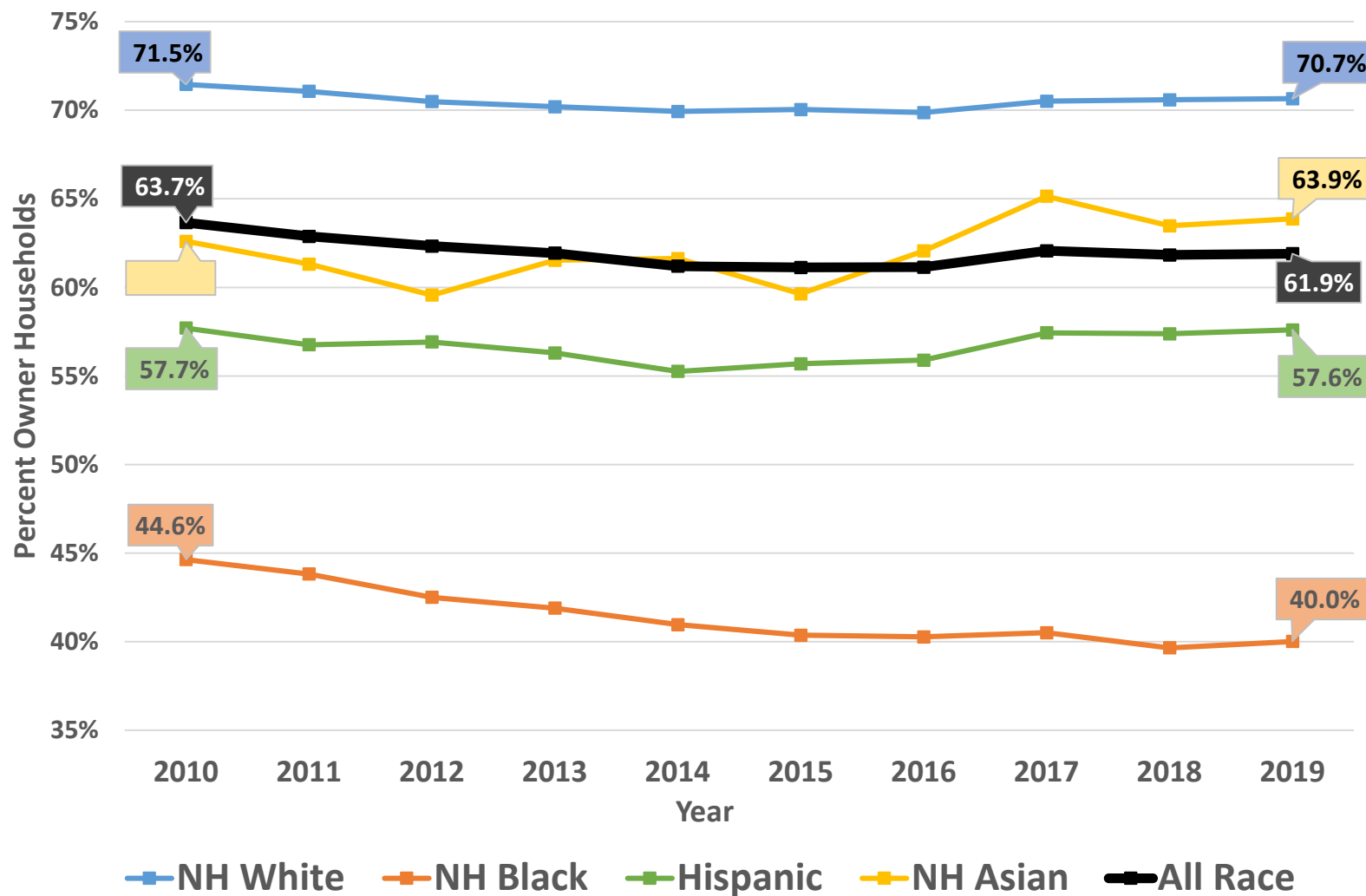

Percentage of Owner Households by Race/Ethnicity of the Householder 15 and Over, Texas, 2010 - 2019



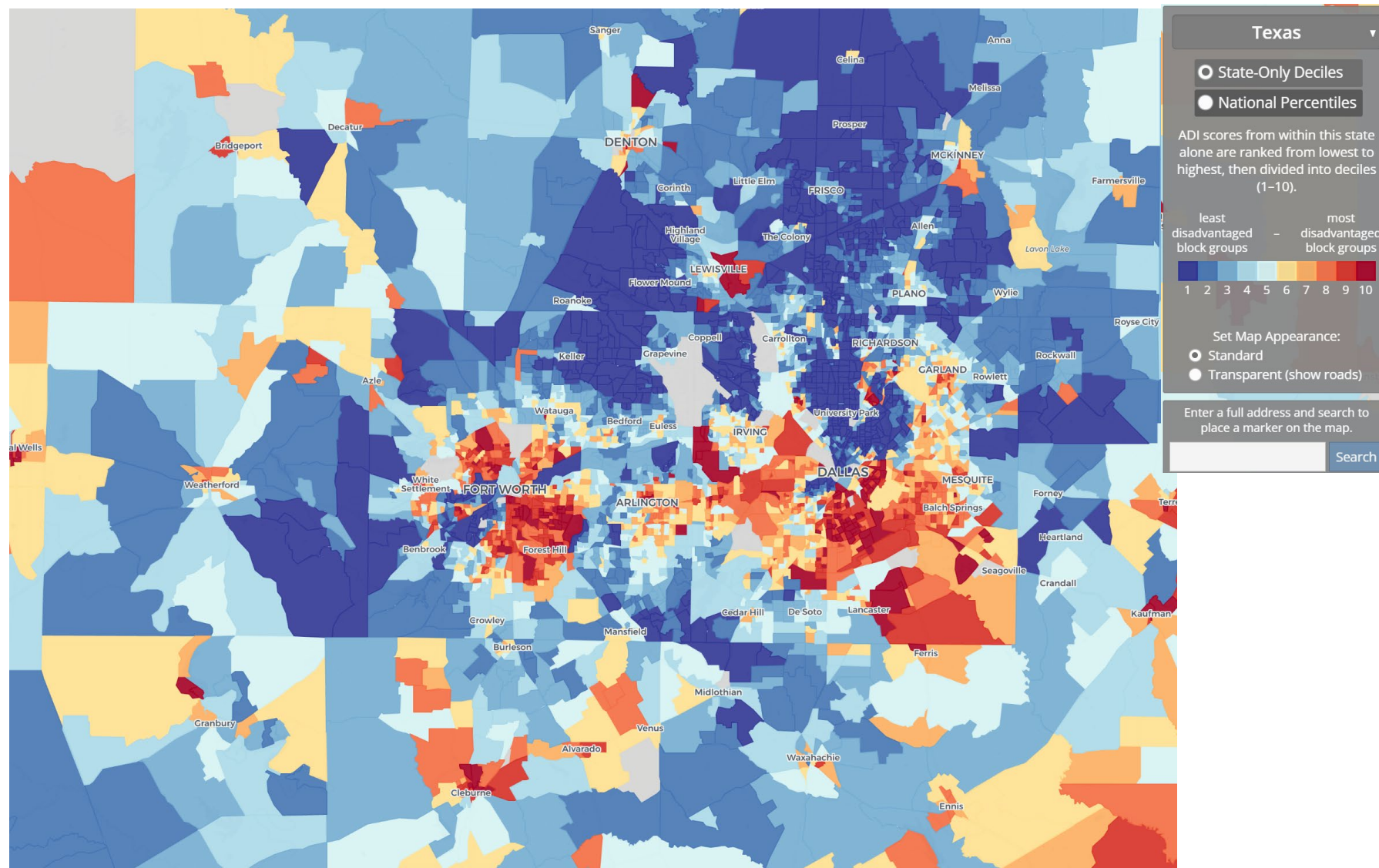

Area Deprivation Index in the San Antonio Area, Census Block Group, 2015-2019

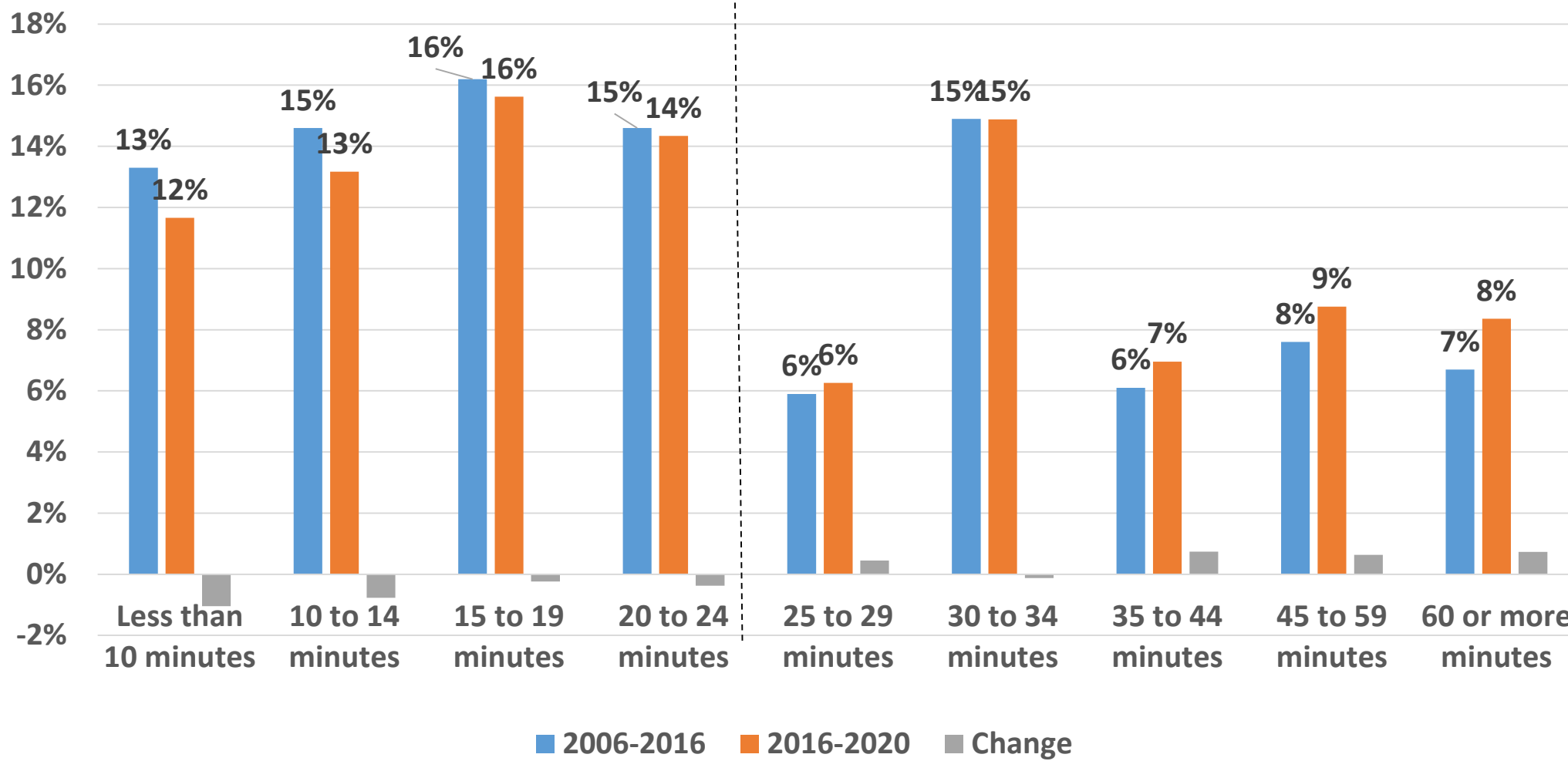
Area Deprivation Index (ADI)

Change in Travel Time to Work, Texas, 2006-2010 and 2016-2020



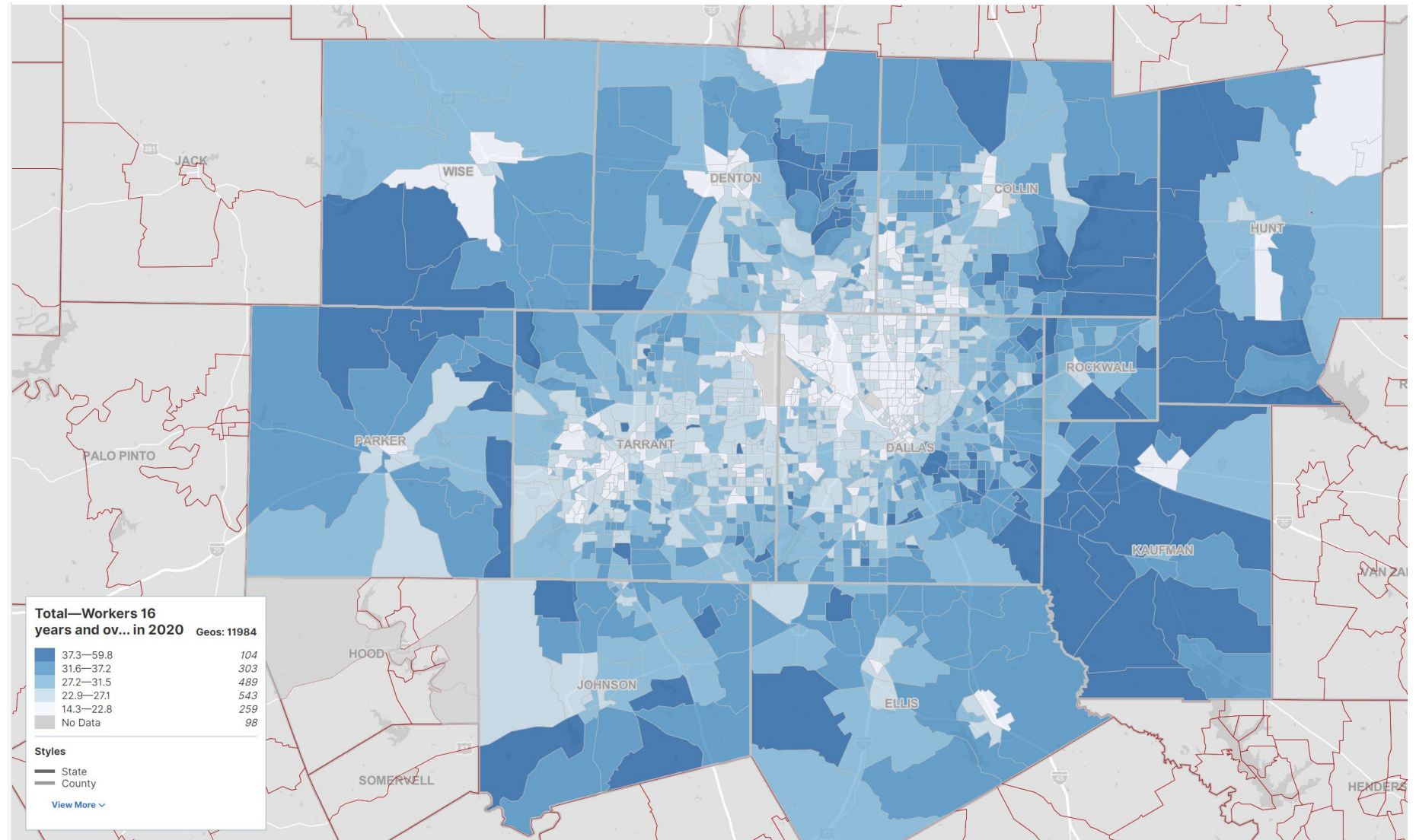


Mean Travel Time to Work (minutes), Metroplex area, census tracts, 2016-2020

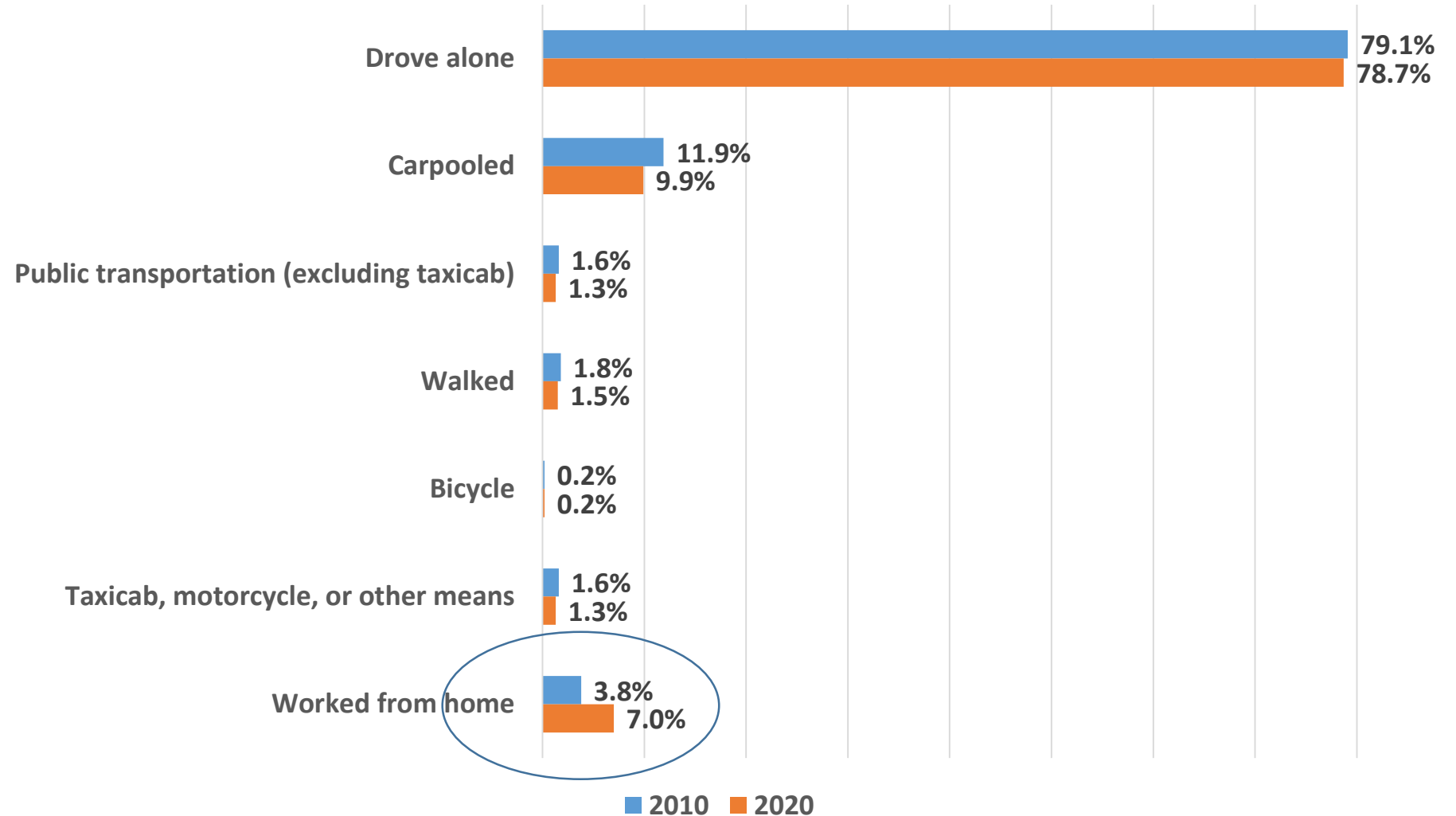

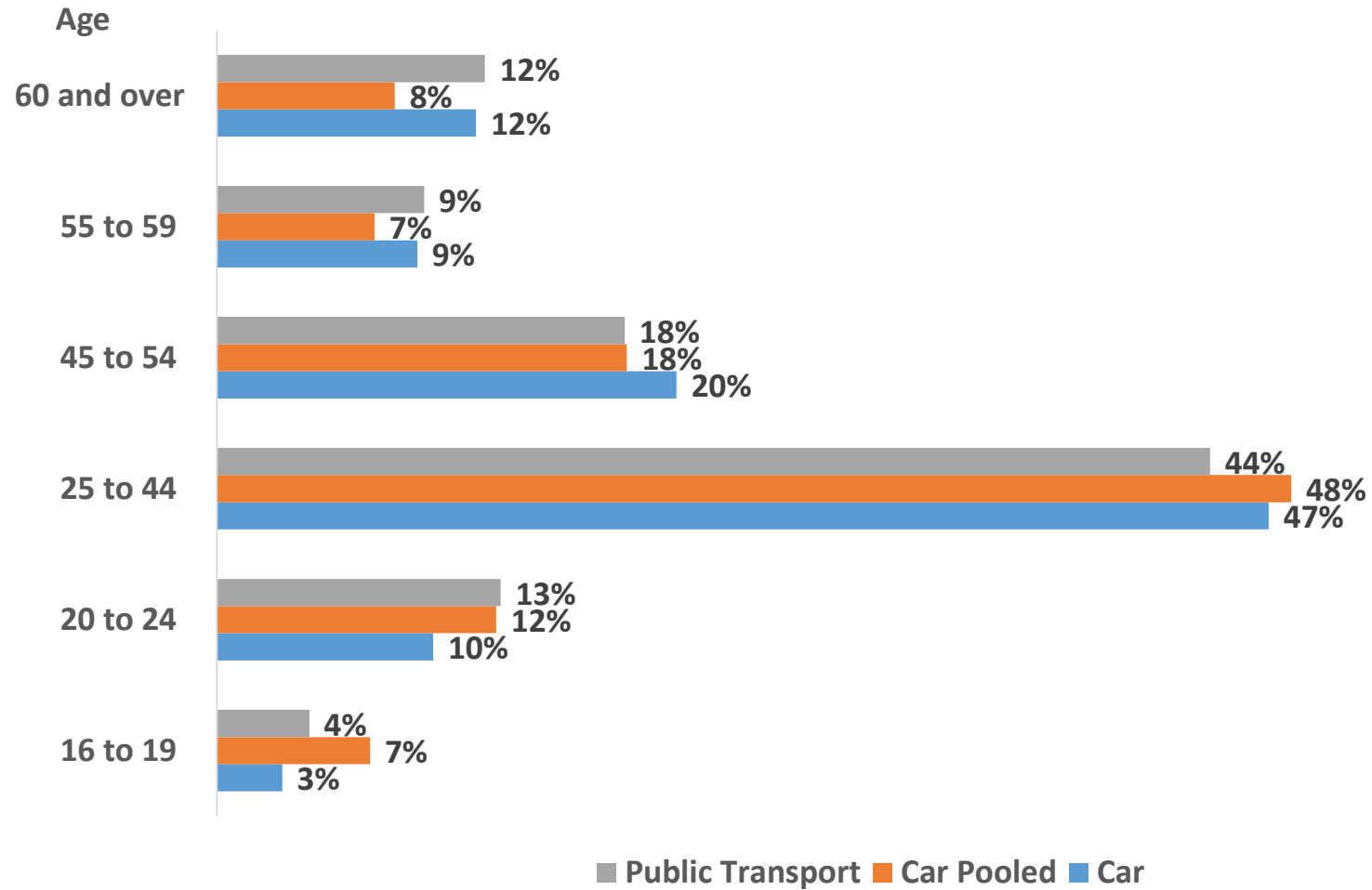


Means of Transportation, Texas, 2006-2010 and 2016-2020



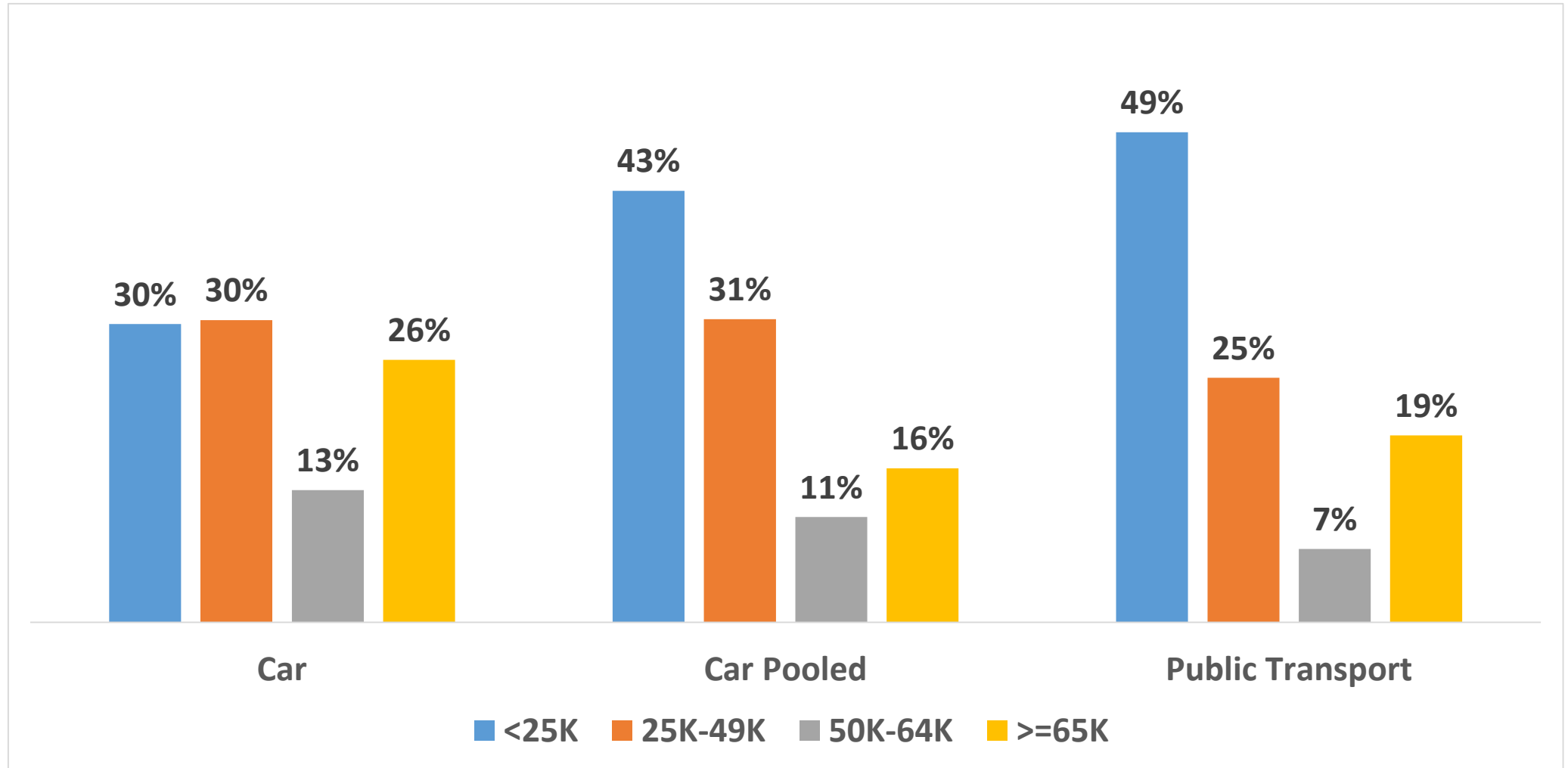


Means of Transportation by Age, Texas, 2020





Means of Transportation by Income, Texas, 2020



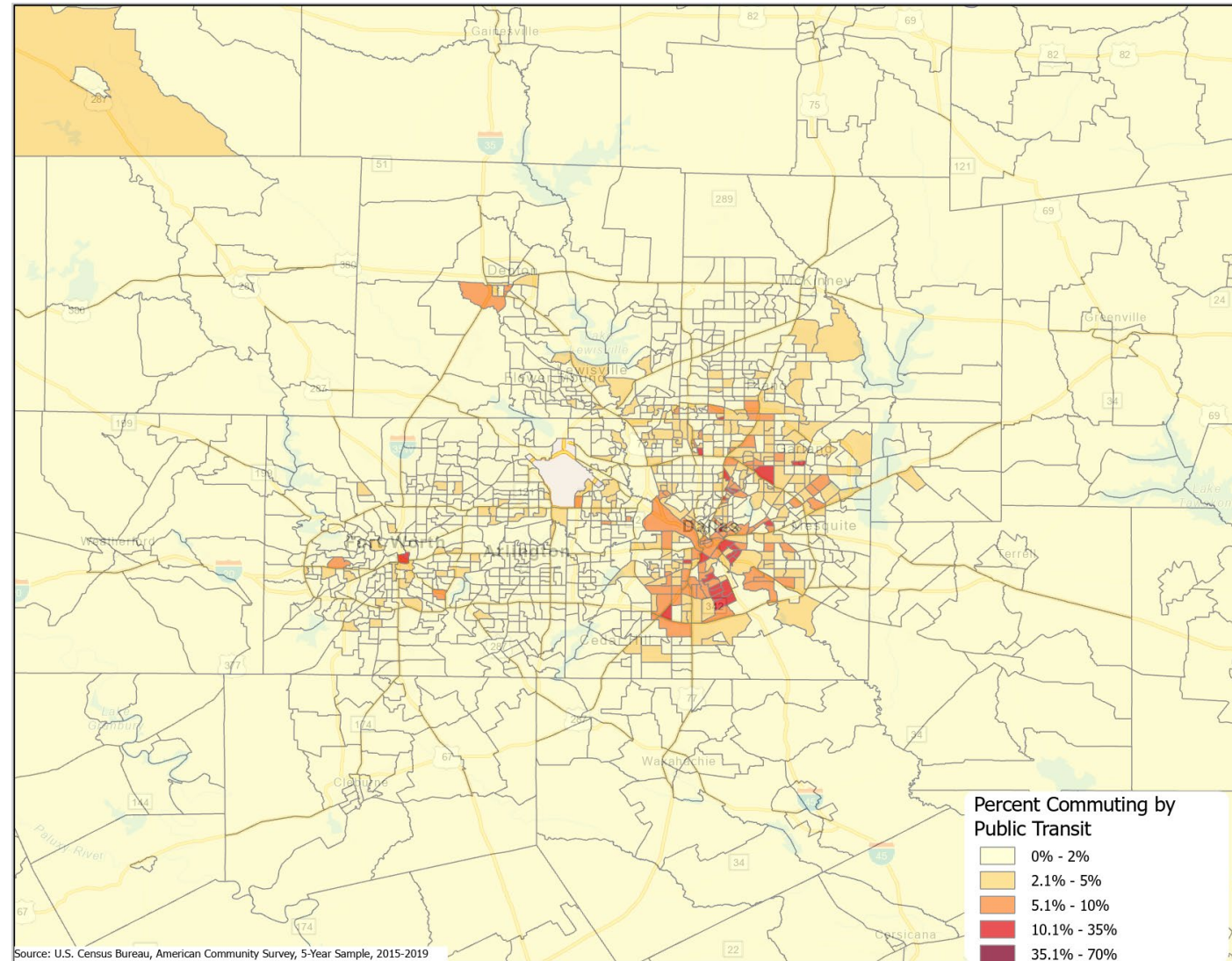


Percent Commuting by Public Transit, Metroplex area, census tracts, 2015-2019

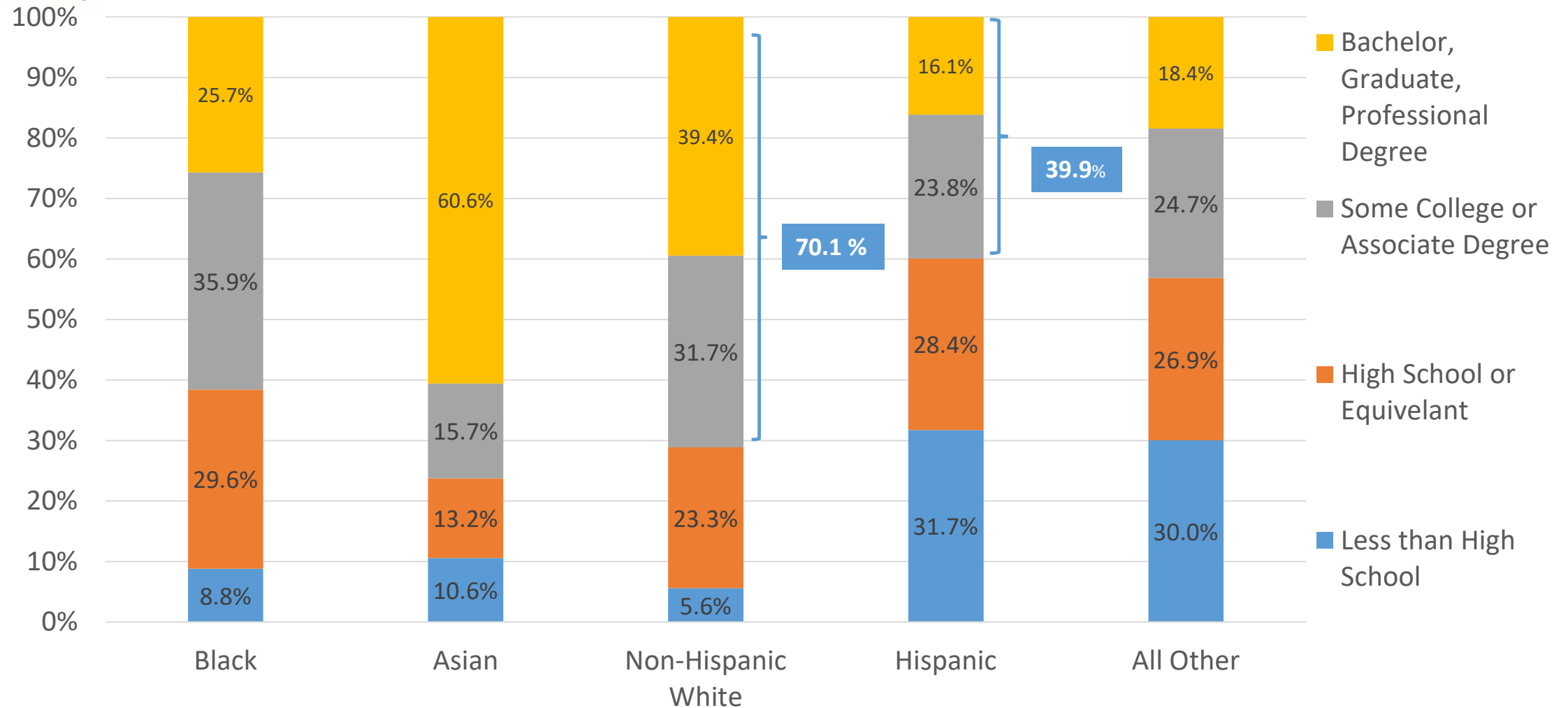

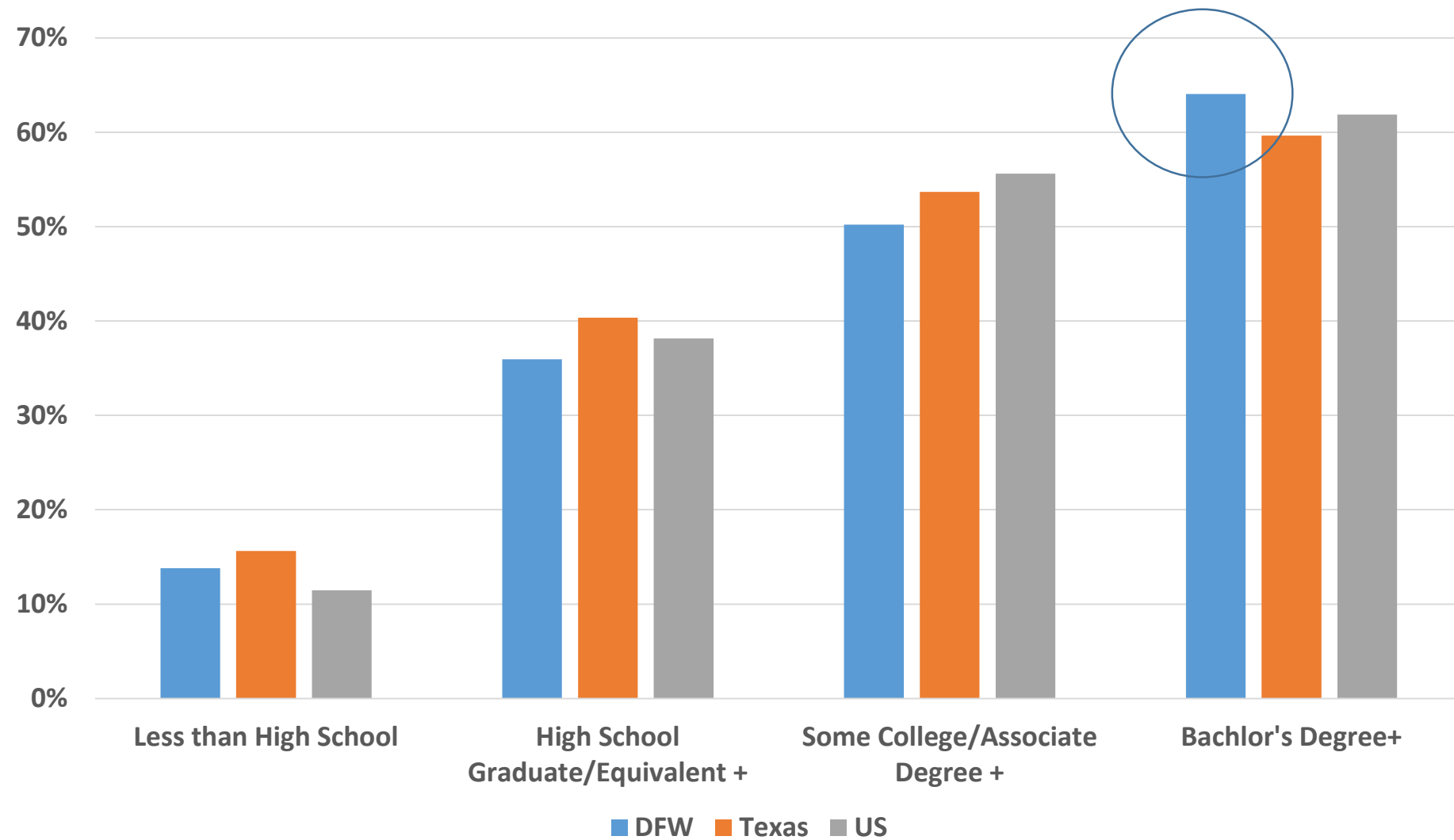


Educational Attainment of Persons Age 25 Years and Older by Race/Ethnicity, Texas, 2019





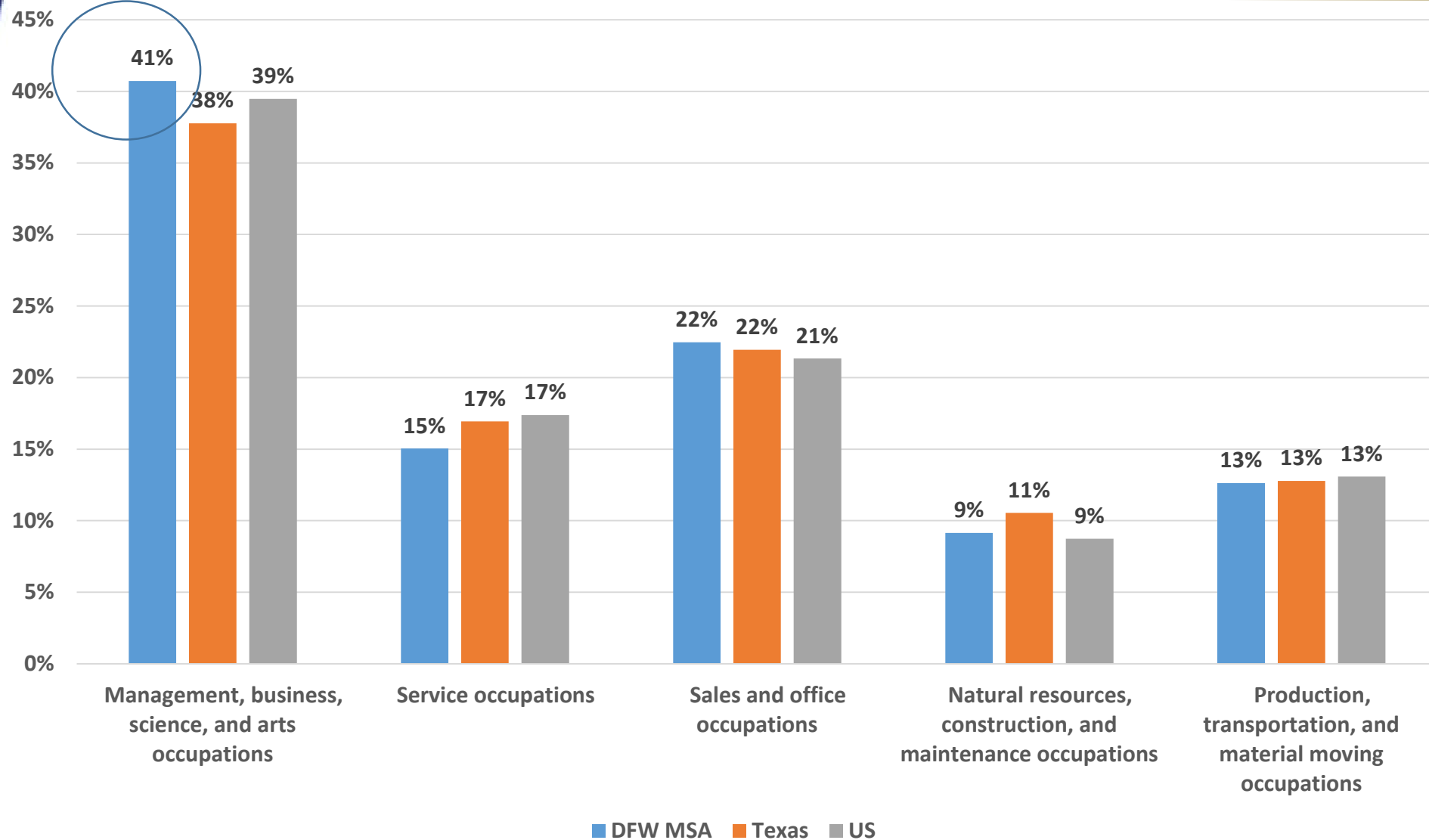
Educational Attainment of Persons Age 25 Years and Older DFW, Texas and the US, 2016-2020

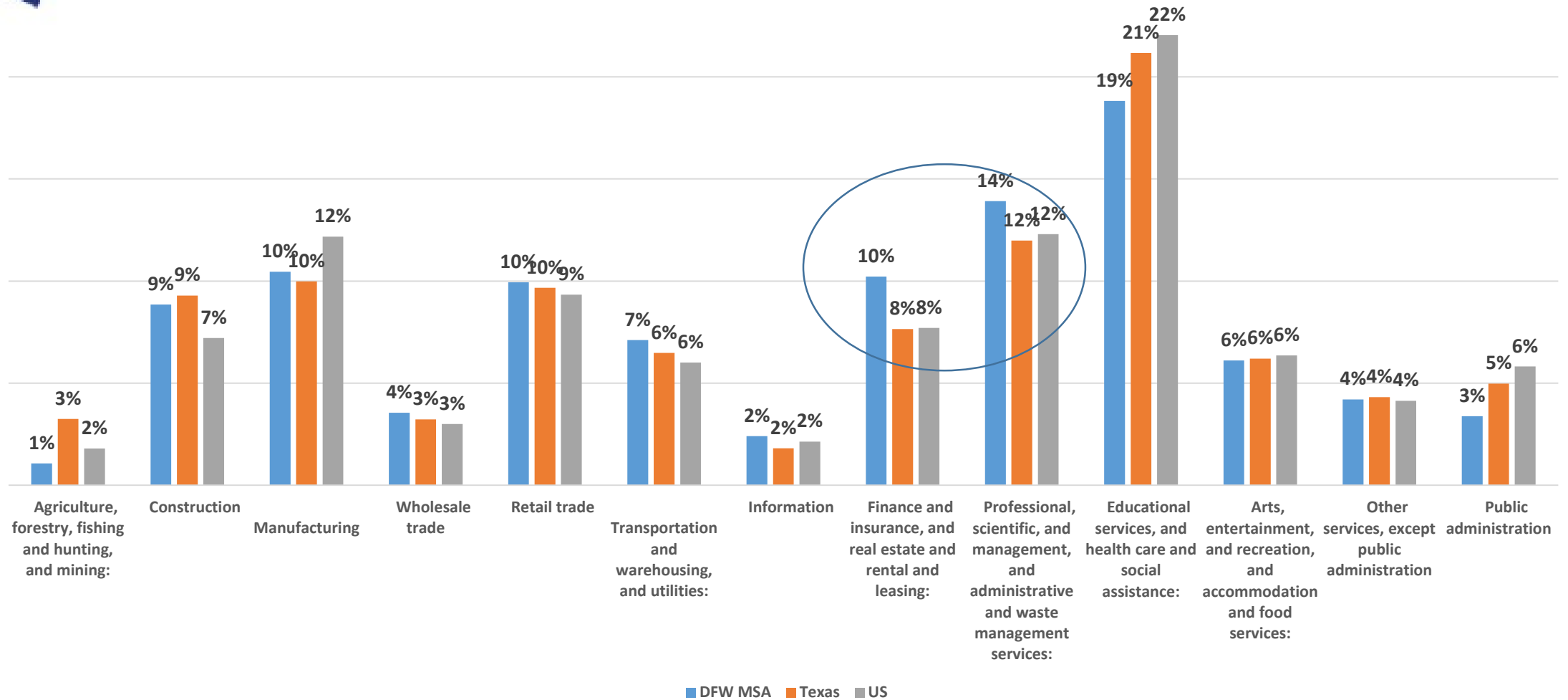


Occupations for the Civilian Employed Population 16 Years and Older DFW, Texas and the US, 2016-2020



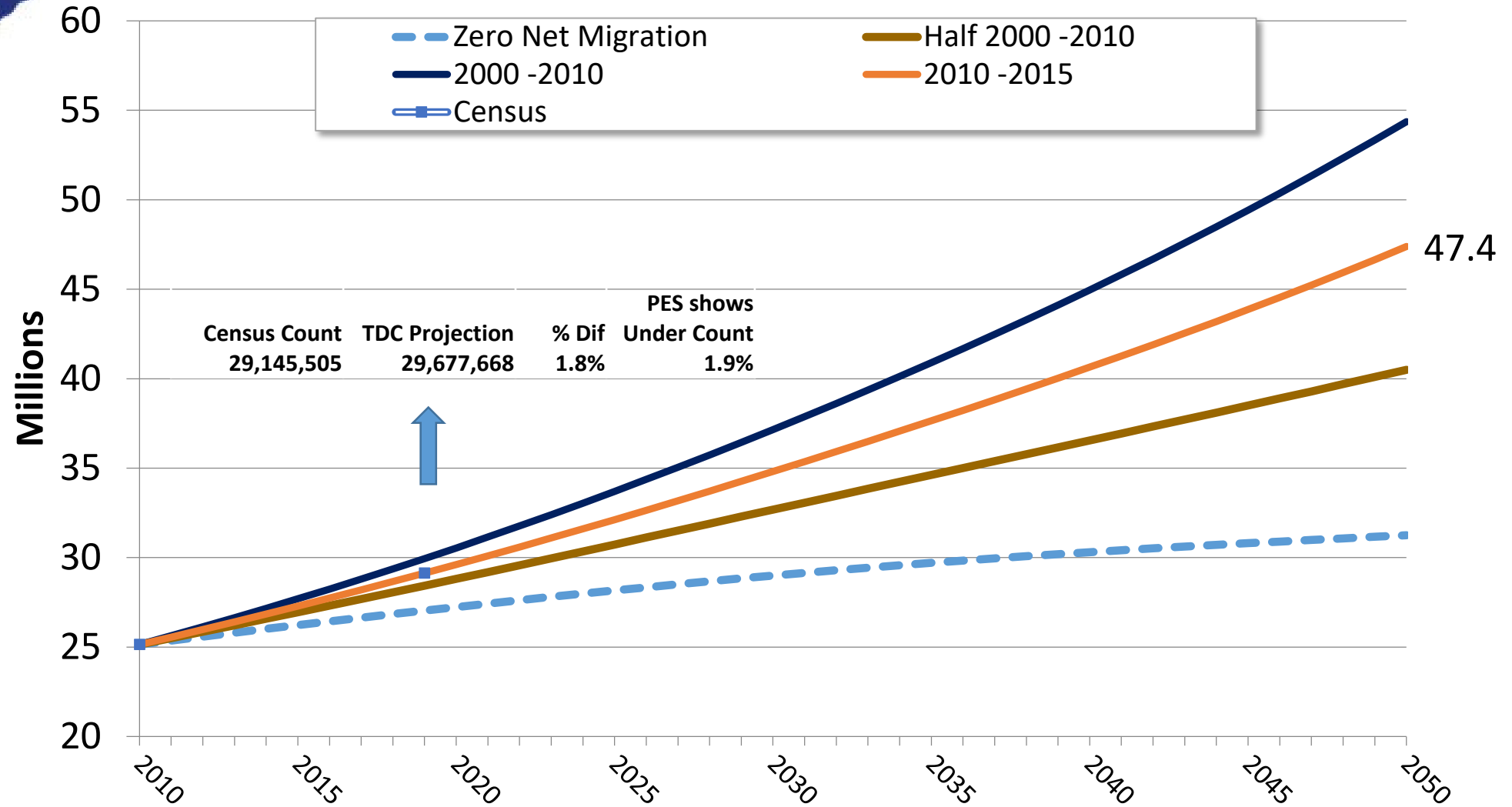


Industry for Full-time, Year-round Civilian Employed Population 16 Years and Older DFW, Texas and the US, 2016-2020



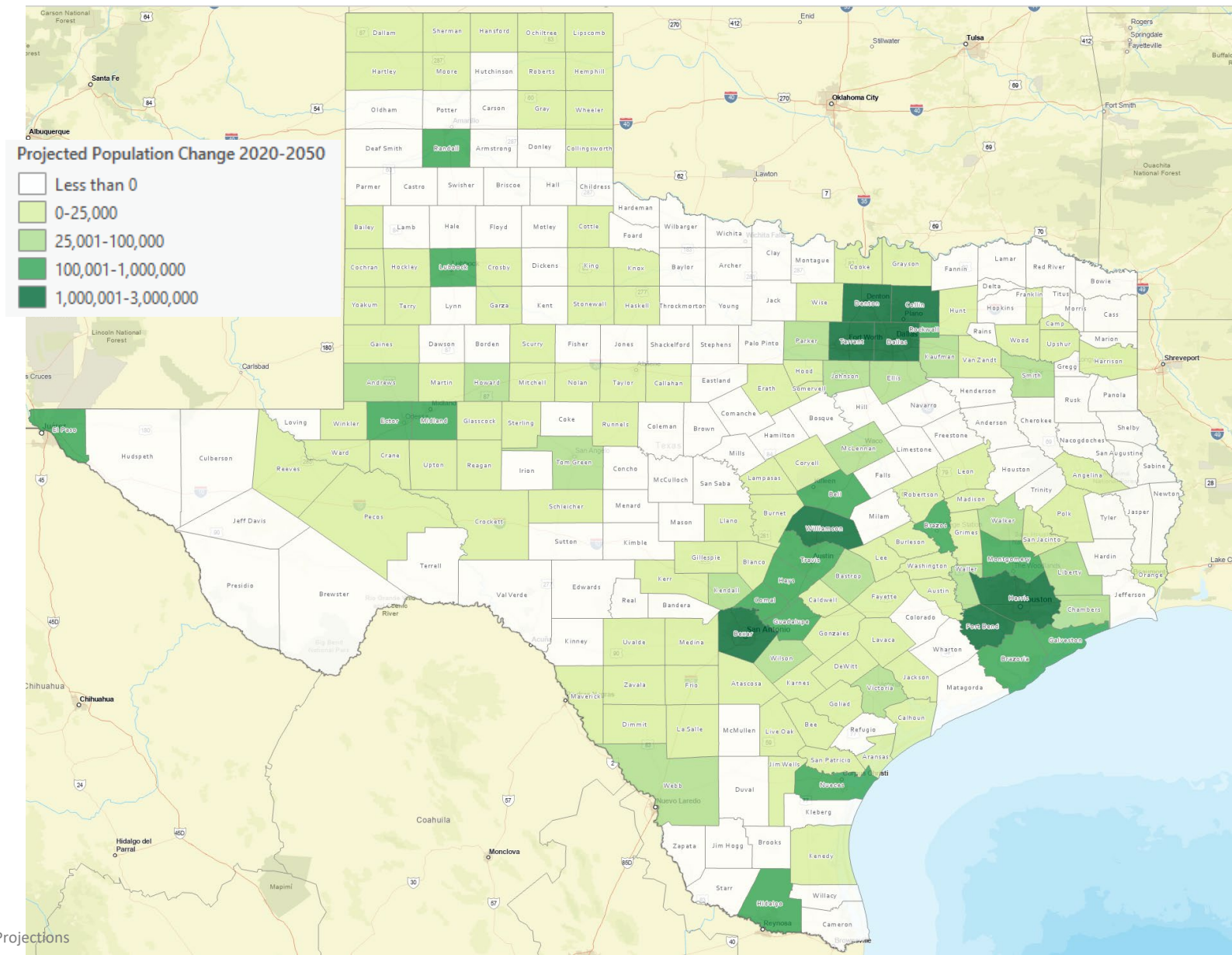


Projected Population Growth in Texas, 2010-2050





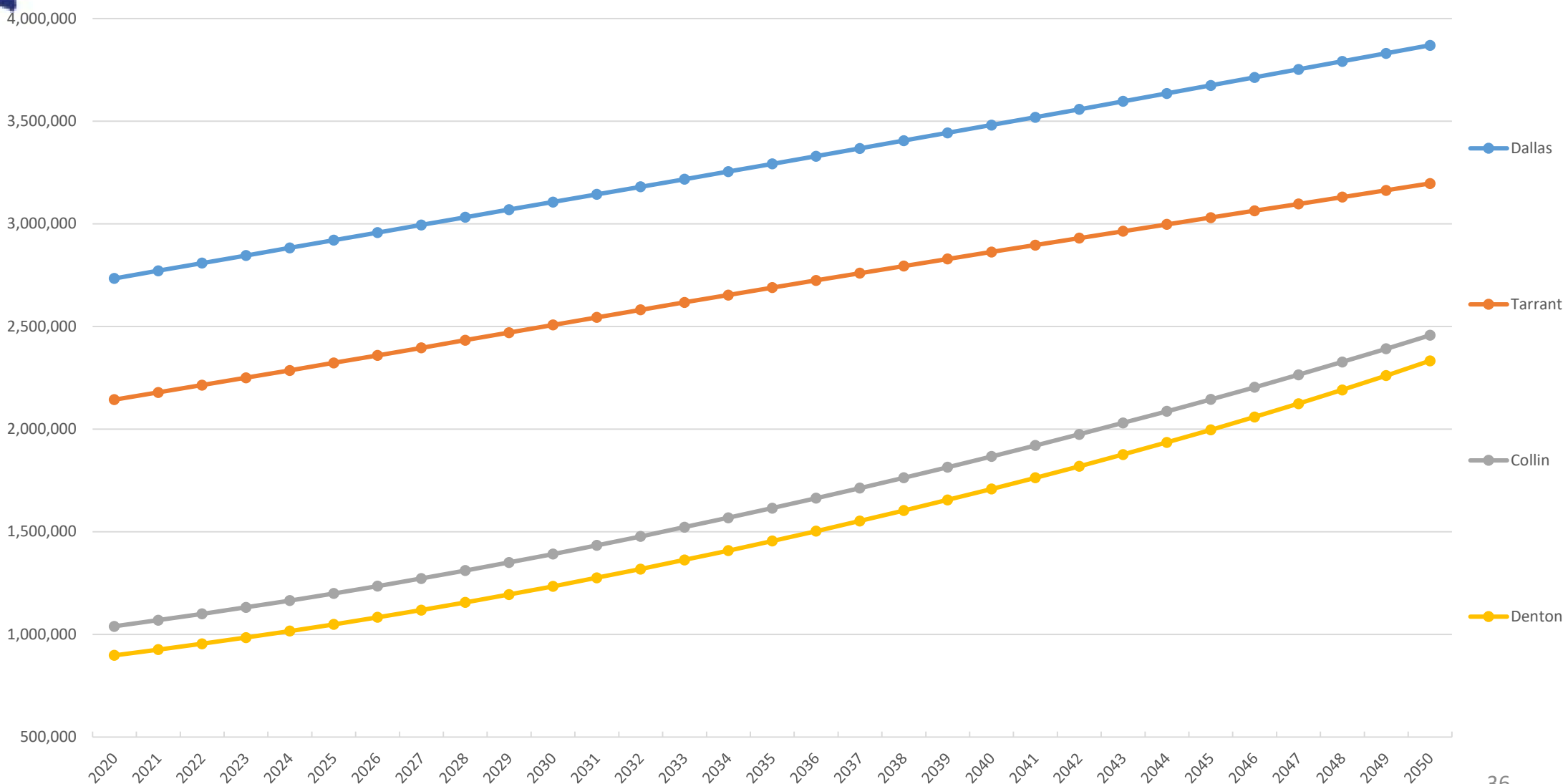
Projected Population Change, Texas Counties, 2020-2050

P.L. 94-171 Redistricting Data Summary

Public Law (P.L.) 94-171, enacted by Congress in December 1975, requires the Census Bureau to provide states the opportunity to identify the small area geography for which they need data in order to conduct legislative redistricting. The law also requires the U.S. Census Bureau to furnish tabulations of population to each state, including for those small areas the states have identified, within one year of Census day.

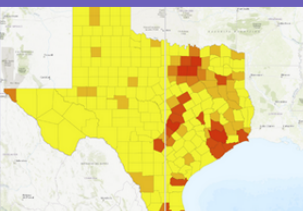

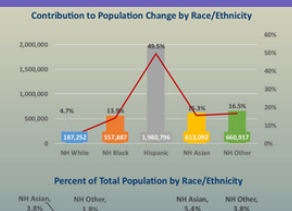

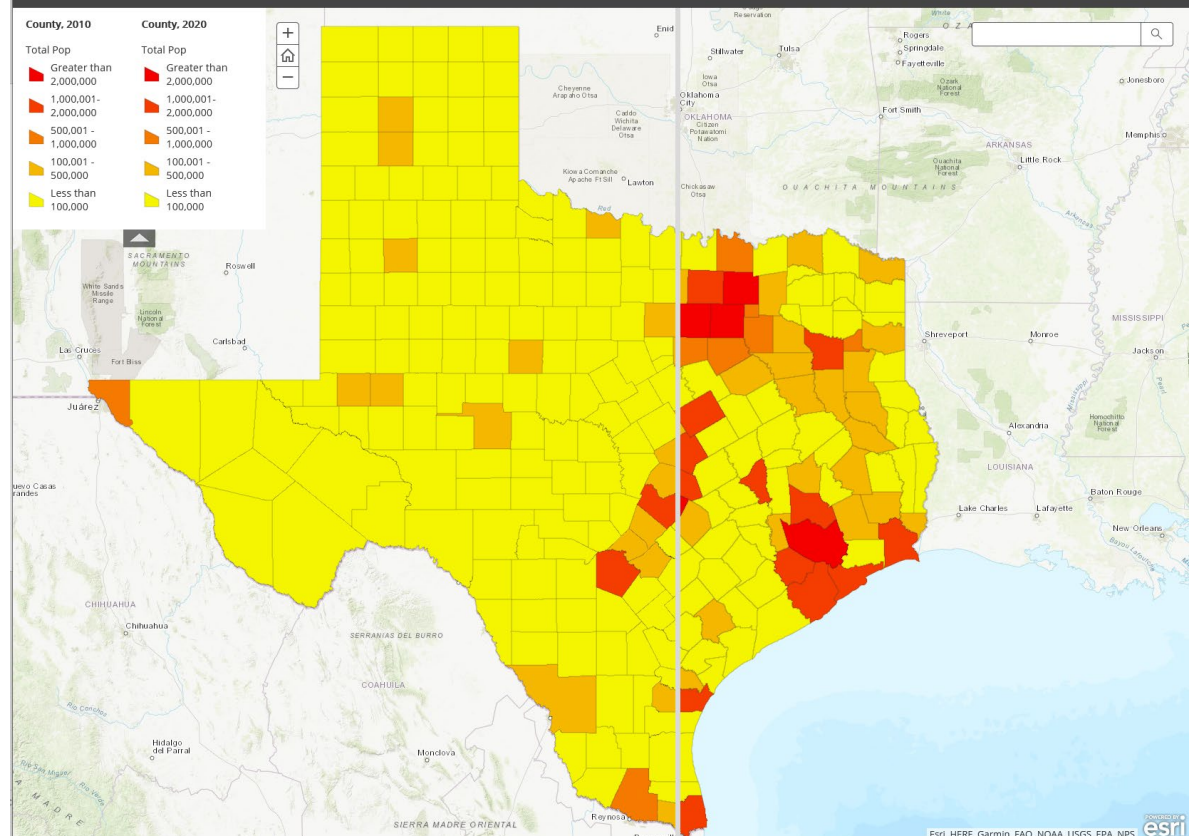
