



Texas Senate District 28, PLANS172

Counties included wholly or partially in Senate District 28: Baylor, Borden, Childress, Coke, Coleman, Concho, Cottle, Crane, Crosby, Dawson, Dickens, Eastland, Fisher, Floyd, Foard, Garza, Hale, Hardeman, Haskell, Hockley, Irion, Jones, Kent, Kimble, King, Knox, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Mitchell, Motley, Nolan, Reagan, Runnels, Schleicher, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephens, Sterling, Stonewall, Sutton, Taylor, Terry, Throckmorton, Tom Green, Upton, Ward, and Wilbarger.

Between 2010 and 2020, a little over half of the counties in Senate District 28 are projected to see population gains, with the bulk of the growth driven by growth in Lubbock and Tom Green counties. The following counties are projected to experience population decline: Baylor, Coke, Coleman, Dawson, Dickens, Eastland, Floyd, Foard, Hale, Hardeman, Irion, Jones, Kent, Kimble, Lamb, Lynn, Mason, Menard, Motley, Schleicher, Stephens, Throckmorton, and Wilbarger. During this time, the non-Hispanic (NH) White population is projected to decrease in population size in most counties, except for Borden, Crane, King, Lubbock, Mitchell, Sterling, Upton, and Ward. The Hispanic, NH Black, NH Asian, and NH Other population groups are projected to increase in population size in most counties, except for Hispanic decline in Hale and Lamb, and NH Asian decline in Coke, Concho, and Crane.
