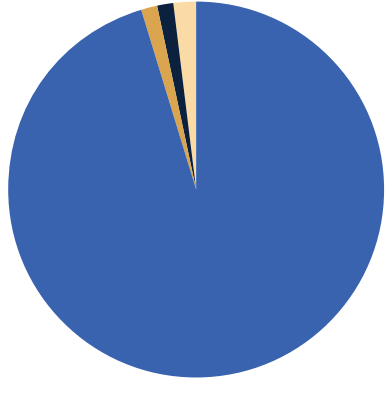


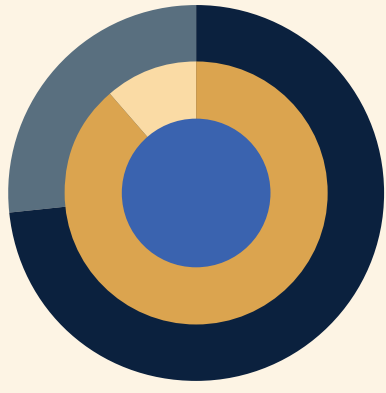
Commuters' Characteristics and Commuting Time in Texas

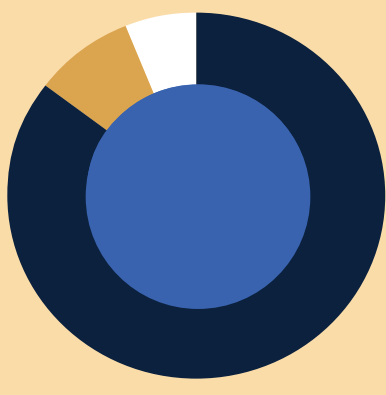
Transportation Mode Choice by Commuters 2015-2020

- 95.3% Car, Truck, or Van
- 1.3% Public Transportation (excluding taxicab)
- 1.5% Walked
- 1.7% Taxicab, Motorcycle, Bicycle, or Other Means



How Do Car, Truck, and Van Users Commute? 2015-2020

- 100% Car, Truck, or Van
- 88.8% Drove Alone
- 11.2% Carpooled
- 73.6% In 2-Person Carpool
- 26.4% In 3-or-more Person Carpool

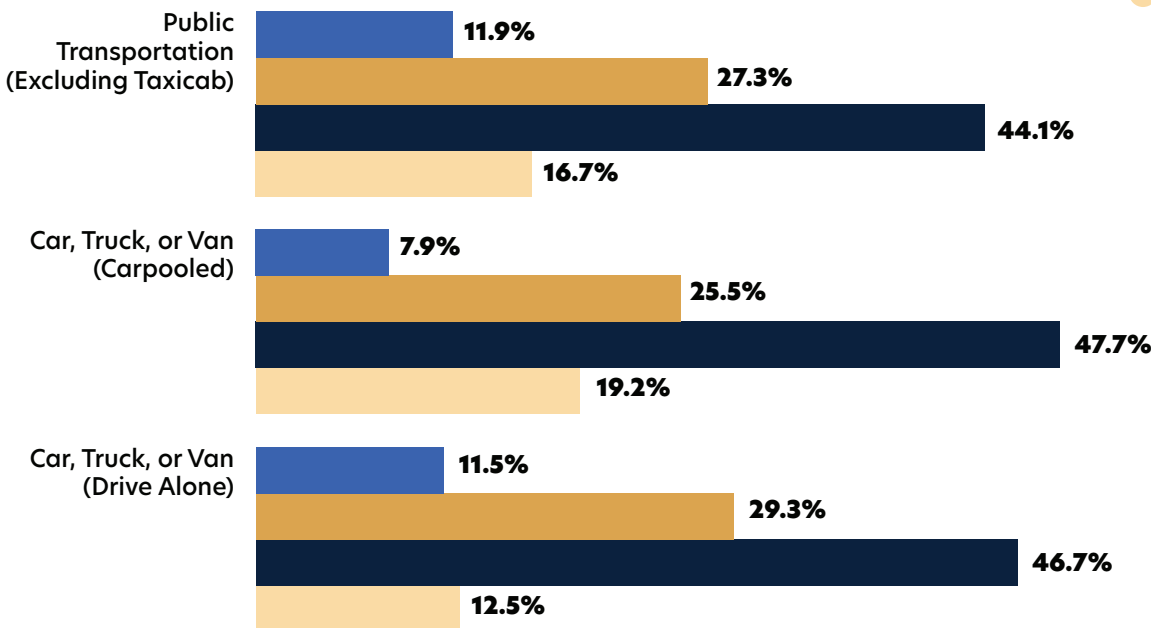


Most Frequently Used Public Transportation Modes 2015-2020

- 6.1% Long-distance Train, Commuter Rail, or Ferryboat

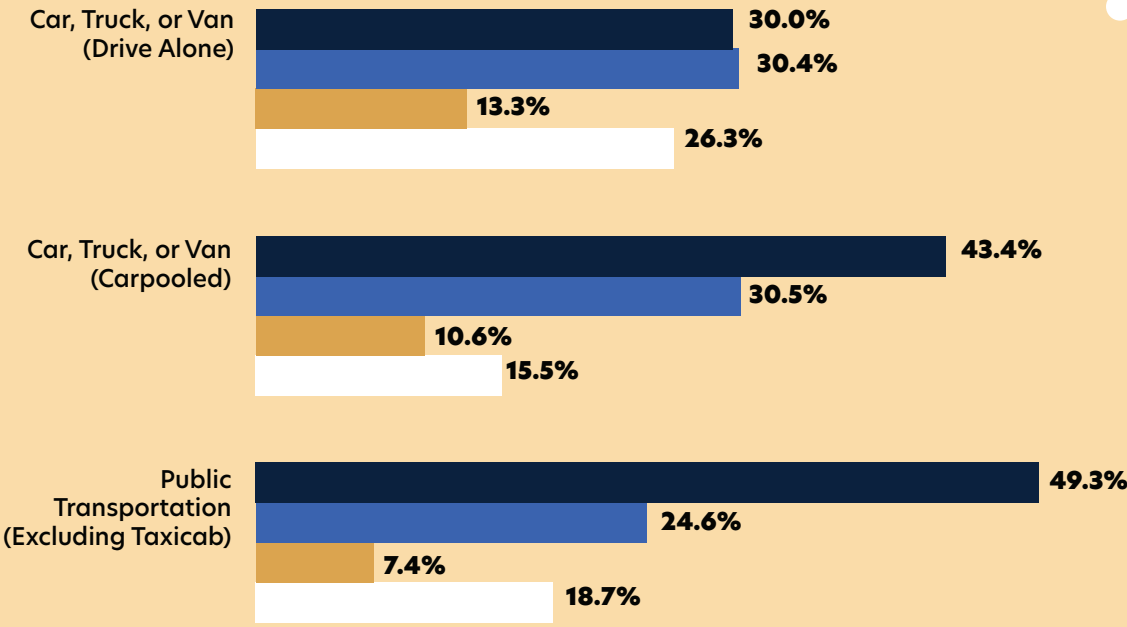
Commuters' Age Characteristics by Transportation Mode 2015-2020

- 16 to 24 Years



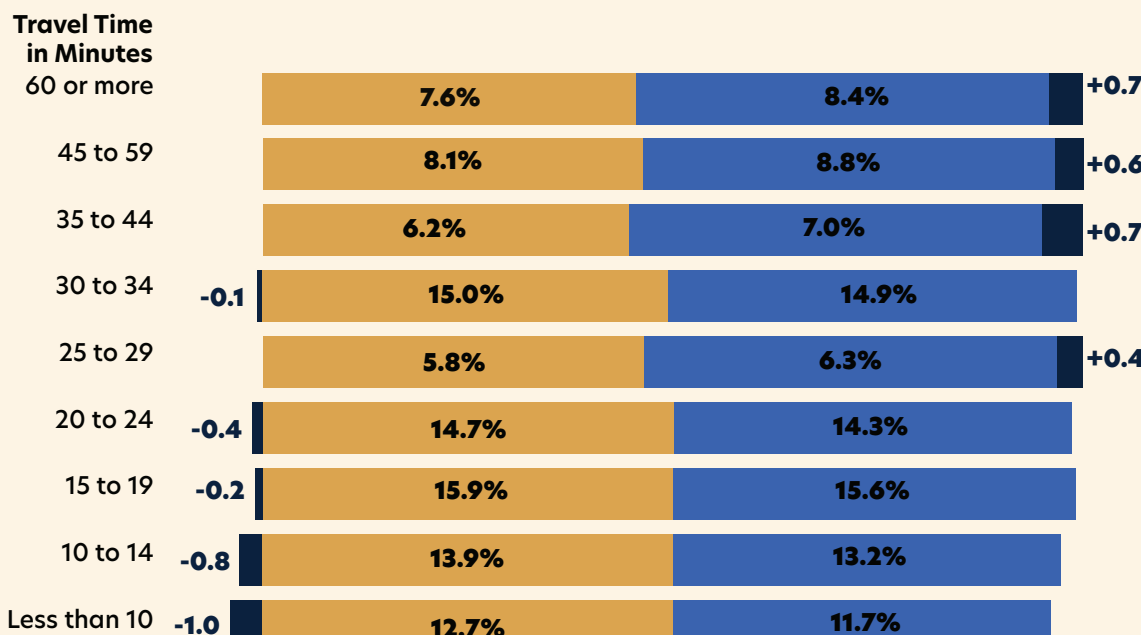
Commuters' Income Pattern by Transportation Mode 2015-2020

Mean Travel Time to Work in Texas Counties, 2016-2020

This map presents the mean travel time to work in Texas counties from 2016 through 2020. According to 2020: ACS 5yrs estimate, the mean travel time to work in Texas is 26.6 minutes, while the US average is 26.9 minutes. Newton County residents traveled for a longer time (mean travel time is 46.3 minutes) than the other counties in Texas. On average, Terrell county's residents passed the least time (mean travel time is 6.2 minutes) for traveling to work in Texas.
